Explanatory note

The *Private Hospitals and Day Procedure Centres Act 1988* provides for the licensing and control of private hospitals and day procedure centres. Section 3 of the Act defines a *day procedure centre* as premises at which any patient is admitted and discharged on the same day for such medical, surgical or other treatment, and in such circumstances, as may be prescribed by the regulations. Section 13 of the Act provides that for the purposes of the Act there are to be those classes of day procedure centres as may be prescribed by the regulations.

The objects of this Regulation are:

- (a) to prescribe premises at which any patient is admitted and discharged on the same day for treatment that involves the multidisciplinary care and treatment of children who are less than 5 years of age for early childhood conditions relating to developmental, behavioural, feeding or sleeping disorders as day procedure centres within the meaning of the Act, and
- (b) to prescribe such day procedure centres as a class of day procedure centre.

Explanatory note

The object of this Regulation is:

- (a) to amend the *Public Health Regulation 1991* to increase the fee for applications to exhume remains and the fee for the approval of equipment for use in, or in connection with, a crematory, and
- (b) to amend the *Public Health (Microbial Control) Regulation 2000* to increase the application fee for approval to install certain hot-water and warm-water systems.
