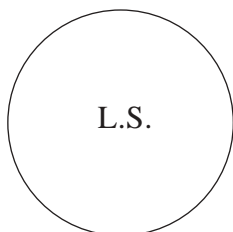

WHEREAS the Legislative Council and the Legislative Assembly now stand adjourned: NOW I, in pursuance of the power and authority vested in me by the Constitution Act 1902, do prorogue the said Legislative Council and the said Legislative Assembly on and from Wednesday 20 February 2002 until 2.15 o'clock in the afternoon of Tuesday 26 February 2002.

I further proclaim that the said Legislative Council and also the Legislative Assembly shall assemble for the despatch of business on Tuesday 26 February 2002, at 2.15 o'clock in the afternoon, in the premises known as Parliament House, Macquarie Street, Sydney: And the Members of the Legislative Council and the Legislative Assembly are hereby required to attend at that time and place.

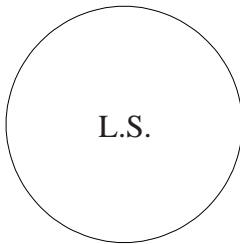
