INTERIM HERITAGE ORDER NO. 24

The Sheeks, 1931 Pittwater Road and 38 Alexandra Crescent, Bayview.

IN pursuance of Section 24 of the Heritage Act, 1977, I, the Minister Assisting the Minister for Infrastructure and Planning (Planning Administration), do, by this my order:

- (i) make an interim heritage order in respect of the item of the environmental heritage specified or described in Schedule 'A'; and
- (ii) declare that the interim heritage order shall apply to the curtilage or site of such item, being the land described in Schedule 'B'.

The property known as The Sheeks, situated at 1931 Pittwater Road and 38 Alexandra Crescent, Bayview, on the land described in Schedule 'B'.

SCHEDULE 'B'

All those pieces or parcels of land known as Lots A and D of DP 32808 in Parish of Narrabeen, County of Cumberland and shown edged heavy black on the plan catalogued HC 1929 in the office of the Heritage Council of New South Wales.

SCHEDULE "A"

The items known as the *Dunbar 1857 shipwreck site*; *Dunbar Anchor Memorial at The Gap, Watsons Bay*; *Dunbar Rock Inscription at Vaucluse*; and, *Dunbar Gillies Movable Artefact Collection*, situated on the land described in Schedule "B".

SCHEDULE "B"

All those items known as:

Dunbar shipwreck site comprising relics associated with the Ship in an area extending 100 metres seaward of the South Head Cliff face and 200 metres along the cliff face and centred on the wreck remains at Lat: 33° 51'.0083 S Long: 151° 17.1467 E WGS 84; the *Gillies Collection* comprising the Australian National Maritime Museum movable heritage collection, held at Wharf 7 Pyrmont; the *Dunbar Anchor Memorial at The Gap, Watsons Bay*, at Lat 33°deg 50.628'S, Long 151° 17.096'E WGS 84, comprising the memorial and its support structure (including sandstone cliff face), and extending three metres from its frontage; and, the *Dunbar Rock Inscription* situated on the rock cliff top opposite residence 248A Old South Head Road, centered at Lat 33° 50.892'S, Long 151° 17.209'E. WGS 84, Vaucluse - comprising the letters forming the inscription, the underlying sandstone rock platform, and extending 2 metres in radius from the centre of the cutting, or cliff edge, which ever is first.

SCHEDULE "A"

The items known as the *Former HMAS Parramatta Historic Shipwreck; Parramatta Stern Memorial, Queens Park Parramatta; and Parramatta Bow Memorial, Garden Island Naval Base*, situated on the land described in Schedule "B".

SCHEDULE "B"

All those items and land comprising:

The *Parramatta* Historic Shipwreck site centred on Lat: 33° 30.083 S Long: 151° 10.834 E WGS 84, comprising both the visible exposed structure and associated artefactual relics on site, together with the buried portions of same, and extending 5 metres around the remains (including land under the historic structure); the Parramatta Stern memorial located in Queens Park Reserve, Parramatta, comprising the metal stern section, rudder, support structure and extending three (3) metres around it; the Parramatta Bow Memorial located at the Garden Island Naval Base, comprising the metal remains of the bow section of the former naval vessel, brick support structure and extending 0.5 metres (0.5) metres around these combined elements.
