

The object of this Regulation is to amend the *Anti-Discrimination Regulation 2004* to set out matters to be considered by the Anti-Discrimination Board and the Minister when recommending and making exemption orders under section 126 of the *Anti-Discrimination Act 1977*.

This Regulation is made under the *Anti-Discrimination Act 1977*, including section 127 (the general regulation-making power).

- (1) The Minister and the Board, when exercising a function under section 126 in relation to a proposed exemption under that section, are to consider the following matters:
 - (a) whether the proposed exemption is appropriate or reasonable,
 - (b) whether the proposed exemption is necessary,
 - (c) whether there are any non-discriminatory ways of achieving the objects or purposes for which the proposed exemption is sought,
 - (d) whether the proponent of the proposed exemption has taken reasonable steps, or is able to take any reasonable steps, to avoid or reduce the adverse effect of a particular act or action before seeking the exemption,
 - (e) the public, business, social or other community impact of the granting of the proposed exemption,
 - (f) any conditions or limitations to be contained in the proposed exemption.
- (2) In this clause, a reference to a *proposed exemption* includes a reference to a proposed renewal, variation or revocation of an exemption.
- (3) Nothing in this clause limits the power of the Minister or the Board to consider any other matters when exercising their functions under section 126 of the Act.

Explanatory note

The objects of this Regulation are as follows:

- (a) to make provision with respect to an election to become an elective participant for only part of the person's electricity load in the scheme relating to greenhouse benchmarks in Part 8A of the *Electricity Supply Act 1995* (*the Act*),
- (b) to provide for accreditation of persons as abatement certificate providers under that Part of the Act with respect to proposed, as well as existing, activities,
- (c) to enable an abatement certificate provider to create abatement certificates in respect of an activity that took place after the date on which an application for accreditation as an abatement certificate provider was lodged by the provider.

This Regulation is made under the *Electricity Supply Act 1995*, including sections 97BB (2) (a) and (b), 97DA (1)–(4), 97E (1) and 106 (the general regulation-making power).

Explanatory note

Under the *Superannuation Contributions Tax (Assessment and Collection) Act 1997* of the Commonwealth, superannuation contributions surcharge may be payable to the Commissioner of Taxation in respect of employer contributions paid to the Parliamentary Contributory Superannuation Fund on behalf of a member. Before a superannuation benefit is paid, the Trustees of the Fund are required to deduct from the benefit an amount to offset the surcharge that may be payable.

The maximum surcharge deduction amounts that may be determined by the Trustees as payable in relation to a period when the benefit payable to the member or former member accrued are prescribed by the *Parliamentary Contributory Superannuation Regulation 2003*.

The object of this Regulation is to amend the *Parliamentary Contributory Superannuation Regulation 2003* to decrease the maximum surcharge deduction amounts payable in relation to certain periods as a consequence of new maximum surcharge rates to be phased in by the Commonwealth.

This Regulation is made under the *Parliamentary Contributory Superannuation Act 1971*, including sections 26D and 33 (the general regulation-making power).

Explanatory note

Under the *Superannuation Contributions Tax (Assessment and Collection) Act 1997* of the Commonwealth, superannuation contributions surcharge may be payable to the Commissioner of Taxation in respect of employer contributions paid to the Police Superannuation Fund on behalf of a contributor. Before a superannuation benefit is paid, the SAS Trustee Corporation is required to deduct from the benefit an amount to offset the surcharge that may be payable.

On the commencement of proposed clause 22C of the *Police Superannuation Regulation 2000* on 1 October 2004, the maximum surcharge deduction amounts that may be determined by the SAS Trustee Corporation as payable in relation to a period when the benefit payable to the contributor or former contributor accrued will be prescribed by the *Police Superannuation Regulation 2000*.

The object of this Regulation is to amend the *Police Superannuation Regulation 2000* to decrease the maximum surcharge deduction amounts payable in relation to certain periods as a consequence of new maximum surcharge rates to be phased in by the Commonwealth.

Explanatory note

The *Roman Catholic Church Communities' Lands Act 1942* creates trustees of certain community land and constitutes those trustees as bodies corporate. Sections 20 and 21 of the Act (as inserted by the *Roman Catholic Church Communities' Lands Amendment Act 2001*) provide for a body corporate to be wound up voluntarily or by the Court. Section 22 deals with the procedure for winding up of bodies corporate by applying the text of Chapter 5 of the *Corporations Act 2001* of the Commonwealth (which deals with external administration, including winding up) to the winding up of a body corporate in New South Wales. The provisions of Chapter 5 apply as a State law with the modifications set out in section 22 and any further modifications prescribed by the regulations.

The object of this Regulation is to further modify the application of the provisions of Chapter 5 of the *Corporations Act 2001* of the Commonwealth in relation to the winding up of a body corporate under the *Roman Catholic Church Communities' Lands Act 1942*.

This Regulation is made under the *Roman Catholic Church Communities' Lands Act 1942* (as amended by the *Roman Catholic Church Communities' Lands Amendment Act 2001*), including sections 22 and 27.

This Regulation comprises or relates to matters of a machinery nature.

 - (iv) the distribution of surplus property after a body corporate is wound up is to be dealt with in accordance with section 23 of the 1942 Act despite anything to the contrary in the applied provisions, and
- (b) the modifications specified in section 16 of the *Corporations (Ancillary Provisions) Act 2001* (NSW), namely:
 - (i) a reference to ASIC is taken to be a reference to the Attorney General, and
 - (ii) a reference to the Gazette is a reference to the Government Gazette, and
 - (iii) a reference to the Minister is a reference to the Attorney General, and
 - (iv) a reference to this jurisdiction is a reference to New South Wales, and
- (c) the modifications prescribed by this Schedule.

PURSUANT to section 66(1) of the Casino Control Act 1992, the Casino Control Authority does, by this Order, approve the following amendments to the rules for the playing of the games of "Baccarat" and "Blackjack" in the casino operated by Star City Pty Limited under licence granted by the Casino Control Authority on 14 December 1994:

(1) Amendments to the rules for the playing of "Baccarat"

- (a) Baccarat index is repealed and in substitution therefor, the following new index is approved:

6. Minimum and Maximum Wagers
7. The Initial Deal
8. Dealing Methods
9. Dealing of Additional Cards

13. Shuffling Device Malfunction
14. General Provisions
15. Tournament Play

- (b) Within Baccarat sub-rule 1.1, the following new definition of "Perfect Pairs wager" is approved:
"Perfect Pairs wager" means an optional additional wager, which may be made by a player in accordance with rule 10;
- (c) Baccarat sub-rule 2.2 is repealed and in substitution therefor, the following new sub-rule 2.2 is approved:
2.2 The layout cloth covering the table shall display the name and/or logo of the casino, shall have areas designated for the placement of wagers by both seated and standing players and shall be marked in a manner substantially similar to that shown in diagram "A", "B", "C", "D", "E", "F" or "G" and having numbered spaces for between 7 and 14 seated players.
- (d) Baccarat sub-rule 3.1 is repealed and in substitution therefor, the following new sub-rule 3.1 is approved:
3.1 The game of Baccarat shall be played with either three decks or four decks or six decks or eight

decks of cards, each having 52 cards without jokers, with backs of the same colour and design and a cutting card, provided however that the Perfect Pairs option described in rule 10 shall be played with either six decks or eight decks of cards.

- (e) Baccarat sub-rule 5.5 is repealed and in substitution therefor, the following new sub-rule 5.5 is approved:
5.5 Where the layout in use is A, B, C, D, F or G, a casino supervisor may permit up to three players to wager on any one wagering area of the layout.
- (f) Baccarat rule 10 is repealed and in substitution therefor, the following new rule 10 is approved:
10 Even Money Baccarat and Perfect Pairs (optional)
- 10.1 Where the game in play is Even Money Baccarat the approved rules of Baccarat shall apply, except where the rules are inconsistent with the rules of Even Money Baccarat, in which case the rules of Even Money Baccarat shall prevail.
- 10.2 The casino operator may in its discretion offer players the opportunity to make Perfect Pairs wagers in accordance with this rule.
- 10.3 Where the Perfect Pairs wager is offered, and the game of Baccarat is played at a table with a layout cloth marked in a manner substantially similar to that shown in diagram "F" or "G", any player may elect to place a Perfect Pairs wager on the Banker's Hand and/or the Player's Hand before the coup commences. Perfect Pairs wagers shall be placed in the appropriate playing area of the layout.
- 10.4 The amount required to make a Perfect Pairs wager shall be shown on a sign at the table.
- 10.5 A Casino Duty Manager may limit the placement of Perfect Pairs wagers to those players who have also placed an initial Baccarat wager in accordance with rule 5, providing:
10.5.1 prior notification of the restriction is given to Surveillance and an Inspector; and
10.5.2 a sign advising players of the restriction is displayed at the table.
- 10.6 Where players are not required to have placed an initial wager in accordance with rule 5, there must be at least one initial wager placed on either the Banker's Hand, the Player's Hand or the Tie in accordance with rule 5 before a player(s) may make a Perfect Pairs wager and the cards are dealt for that coup.
- 10.7 Up to three Perfect Pairs wagers shall be allowed per playing area and a player may only place one Perfect Pairs wager

on the Banker's Hand and/or Player's Hand per coup. Subject to rule 10.5, preference of wagering will be given to those players who have also placed an initial Baccarat wager in accordance with rule 5, with any available positions going to other players in the order that wagers are placed.

10.8 For the purposes of playing "Perfect Pairs" a pair shall mean a hand that comprises the first two cards dealt to either the Banker's Hand or the Player's Hand that are:

10.8.1 of the same number, namely, Ace, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, 9 or 10; or

10.8.2 of the same picture type, namely jack, queen or king.

10.9 Where a Perfect Pairs wager is made on either the Banker's Hand or the Player's Hand and the initial two cards dealt to that particular hand in that coup are:

10.9.1 A "Mixed Pair" being a pair that comprises two cards of the same number or picture type but of different colours (i.e. one red card and one black card), the player shall win and be paid at the odds of five to one;

10.9.2 A "Coloured Pair" being a pair that comprises two cards of the same number or picture type and colour but of different suits (i.e. clubs and spades), the player shall win and be paid at the odds of ten to one;

10.9.3 A "Perfect Pair" being a pair that comprises of two cards of the same number or picture type and suit (i.e. two queens of spades or two 5 of clubs), the player shall win and be paid at the odds of thirty to one.

10.10 Losing Perfect Pairs wagers shall be collected and winning Perfect Pairs wagers paid by the dealer at settlement.


(g) Baccarat sub-rule 12.7 is repealed and in substitution therefor, the following new sub-rule 12.7 is approved:

12.7 If a card is found face upwards in the card shoe or shuffling device after the first card of a coup has been dealt, the card shall be played as if it were found face downwards, subject to rule 12.5.

12.7.1 Where a shuffling device is used and there is reason to suspect that further cards may be incorrectly faced in the shuffling device, a casino supervisor may, after the coup has been completed, direct that all remaining cards be removed from the shuffling device and checked.



14.4.1 prior notification of the restriction is given to Surveillance and an Inspector; and

14.4.2 a sign advising players of the restriction is displayed at the table.

14.5 Where players are not required to have placed an initial wager in accordance with rule 5, there must be at least one initial wager placed in the playing area in accordance with rule 5 before a player(s) may make a Super Sevens or Perfect Pairs wager and the cards are dealt to that hand.

14.6 Up to three Super Sevens or Perfect Pairs wagers shall be allowed per playing area. Preference of wagering will be given to those players who have also placed an initial wager in accordance with rule 5 and thereafter in the order that wagers are placed.

(d) Blackjack sub-rule 17.1 is repealed and in substitution therefor, the following new sub-rule 17.1 is approved:

17.1 A card found turned face upwards in the card shoe or shuffling device shall be burned by placing it in the discard rack and the round of play shall continue.

17.1.1 Where a shuffling device is used and there is reason to suspect that further cards may be incorrectly faced in the shuffling device, a casino supervisor may, after the round of play has been completed, direct that all remaining cards be removed from the shuffling device and checked.

REMUNERATION ACT 1975**Report and Determination Under Section 13 of the
Statutory and Other Offices Remuneration Act 1975

Judges, Magistrates and Related Group

Section 1: Background

1. Section 13 of the Statutory and Other Offices Remuneration Act 1975 (the Act), as amended, requires the Statutory and Other Offices Remuneration Tribunal (the Tribunal), each year, to make a determination of the remuneration to be paid to these office holders on and from 1 October in that year. "Remuneration" is defined as salary or allowances paid in money.
2. The Judges Magistrates and Related Group comprises such officers who are listed in the Schedules of the Act and, in addition are defined as judicial officers (within the meaning of the Judicial Officers Act 1986) or offices which the Government considers should belong to that Group or are directly involved with the judicial system. The offices have been grouped together by the Tribunal for remuneration purposes only.
3. A principal feature of remuneration for Judges has been the longstanding Agreement between Federal and State Governments on the relativities between the remuneration of State Supreme Court Judges and Federal Court Judges with the remuneration of a Justice of the High Court. This Agreement provides that the salary of a Judge of the Federal Court and a Judge of the State Supreme Court should not exceed 85 per cent of the salary of a Justice of the High Court of Australia. This relativity however, remains acceptable only if and whilst the remuneration of a Justice of the High Court of Australia remained at an appropriate level, and that the Remuneration Tribunals should have regard to the base salary plus non financial benefits (such as motor vehicles) when determining judicial remuneration.
4. Since that time, the New South Wales Tribunal has maintained the remuneration of a State Supreme Court Judge at approximately 85% of the remuneration of a Justice of the High Court.
5. A feature of this year's Determination is the inclusion of the third instalment of the two year 17 percent special increase provided by the Commonwealth Remuneration Tribunal to federal Judges and Magistrates. The Commonwealth Tribunal's determination, following a comprehensive review, was made in November 2002.

The results of that review were that federal judges were to receive increases totalling 17 per cent over the period 1 July 2002 to 30 June 2004, i.e., 24 months, as follows:

- 7% payable on 1 July 2002,
- 5% payable on 1 July 2003,
- 5% payable on 1 July 2004.

6. The CRT further determined that these increases were over and above any general economic adjustments that it determines as part of its normal annual reviews for the years 2003 and 2004. On 1 July 2003 this adjustment was a further 4.0 percent and on 1 July 2004 it is 3.9 percent.

Section 2: 2004 Review

7. The Government has submitted that the longstanding nexus between State and Federal judicial remuneration be maintained.
8. The Tribunal has received a number of submissions for the current review. All supported retention of the nexus with the federal judiciary and/or the retention of existing relativities. In addition the Tribunal received submissions on specific issues. These include:
- A submission from Deputy Presidents of the Workers Compensation Commission to review their remuneration. They contend that their remuneration should be equivalent to that of a District Court Judge. The President of the Commission also wrote to the Tribunal in support of the Deputy Presidents' submission.
 - A submission on behalf of the Supreme Court seeking an increase in the Conveyance Allowance of 7.9 percent to cover cost of living adjustments.
 - A submission from the Chief Judge of the District Court seeking an increase in the Conveyance Allowance to that applicable to Supreme Court Judges; an increase in the daily rate for acting judges so that they are not disadvantaged regarding their superannuation arrangements; a review of the current daily meal allowance rate for circuit judges and a review of the travel provision where a judge staying in non commercial accommodation is paid one third of full daily rate. He considers that the rate should be increased to 50 percent of daily rate.
 - A submission from the Chief Judge of the Land and Environment Court suggesting that the Conveyance Allowance for judges of inferior courts should be established on different principles to support the distinction in rates.
 - The Senior Commissioner Land and Environment Court has sought an increase in the relativity with a Judge of the Land and Environment Court because of additional leadership and management responsibilities arising from administrative changes introduced by the Chief Judge. The Chief Judge has written to the Tribunal supporting the application of the Senior Commissioner.
 - The new Solicitor for Public Prosecutions has written to the Tribunal advising that, unlike his predecessor, he will not be electing to receive remuneration packaging, pursuant to section 11A of the Act. As a result, the Solicitor for Public Prosecutions is seeking a determination for the salary of his office.

9. The Tribunal met with the President and Deputy Presidents of the Workers Compensation Commission to discuss the issues raised in their submissions.

Deputy Presidents, Workers Compensation Commission

10. The Tribunal undertook a review of the role and responsibilities of the Deputy Presidents as part of the 2003 annual review. On that occasion, the Tribunal concluded that the existing remuneration levels were adequate.
11. For the current review, the Deputy Presidents, to support their claim contend that the breadth of work they undertake is analogous to that carried out by the former Judges of the Compensation Court. They also contend that because they hear appeals, their work is at level equivalent to that of the Judges of the Court of Appeal. The Deputy Presidents base this latter contention on the fact that formerly, appeals from Judges of the Compensation Court were to the Court of Appeal. The also provided statistical information showing that they hear on average one appeal each per week.
12. The Tribunal has given careful consideration to the Deputy Presidents' submission but can find no reason to support either contention. As a result, the existing relativities will be maintained.

Acting Judges

13. For reasons outlined in the Tribunal's 2003 annual Report new rates for acting Judges took effect on and from 1 October 2003 for new acting judicial commissions. The Tribunal has been advised that, because the daily rates are lower than was previously the case this has resulted in lower superannuation payouts for these acting Judges. This does not apply to Acting Judges in receipt of a judicial pension.
14. The Tribunal notes the comments of the Acting Chief Judge of the District Court but considers that overall, the decision was fair and reasonable when all the circumstances of the decision are taken into consideration.

Conveyance Allowance

15. The Tribunal has received a number of submissions dealing with the Conveyance Allowance. These submissions have sought, *inter alia*, clarification of the purpose of the Allowance, an increase in the Allowance and its application.
16. The Tribunal introduced the Allowance in its Special Determination of 11 June 2003. It replaced the former "Additional Amount" provided to Supreme Court Judges to compensate for the non financial benefits received by their federal counterparts. The principal non financial benefit provided to Federal Court Judges is a motor vehicle.
17. The issues surrounding the Conveyance Allowance are quite complex and cannot be resolved within the time of the current annual review. The Tribunal therefore will make no adjustment to the Allowance at this time but will, immediately following the completion of the annual review, seek a special reference from the Premier to examine this matter fully. The Tribunal intends to seek the views of the Judiciary and the Attorney General's Department with a view to making a determination which, as far as is practicable, will resolve the issues surrounding the Allowance.

Travel Allowances

18. The Tribunal has noted the Chief Judge of the District Court's contention that the daily rate of meal allowance for Judges is not adequate. The Chief Judge also contends that when a Judge travels intrastate and stays at his/her own private accommodation (rather than in commercial accommodation) the rate of travel allowance should be increased from 33 percent of the full daily rate of travel allowance to 50 percent of the daily rate. The reason given is that the Judge's private accommodation still requires maintenance and upkeep for which the 33 percent rate is insufficient.
19. The Tribunal cannot support either contention. The daily rate of travel allowance for intrastate travel is more generous than available to other public sector employees including the Chief and Senior Executive Services. Similarly meal allowances provided to judges are, in general, more generous than those available to other public sector employees.
20. The Tribunal's inquiries for the current review suggest that no change in the travel entitlements is necessary. The conditions pertaining to the use of non commercial accommodation are considered to be fair and reasonable and will be retained.

Senior Commissioner Land and Environment Court

21. The Tribunal notes that the Senior Commissioner is now required to undertake additional responsibilities as a result of changes introduced by the Chief Judge of the Land and Environment Court.
22. The Tribunal considers that the changes have resulted in an increase in the responsibilities of the position and that an increase in remuneration for this office is warranted.

Solicitor for Public Prosecutions

23. The Tribunal was recently advised that a new appointment had been made to the office of Solicitor for Public Prosecutions (SPP). The former office holder had made an election, pursuant to section 11A of the Act to be provided with employment benefits. As a result of that election the remuneration of SPP was expressed as an SES style remuneration package (ie all employer on costs included within the package) and received increases identical with other 11A office holders as listed in the Tribunal's reports and Determinations on the Chief and Senior Executive Services.
24. The new SPP has written to the Tribunal and advised that he will not be making an election pursuant to section 11A and would prefer to receive a salary rather than a remuneration package.
25. As a result of this advice the office of Solicitor for Public Prosecutions has been removed from the list of Section 11A office holders in the Report and Determination for the Chief and Senior Executive Services. As with other senior positions in the Office of the Director of Public Prosecutions it has been included in the Judges Magistrates and Related Group.
26. The former remuneration package amount has been recalculated by removing the employer on costs contained within the package ie the Superannuation Guarantee Levy and annual leave loading.

27. The Tribunal is aware of the importance of this position to the functioning of the Office of the Director of Public Prosecutions. The Tribunal also notes that no review of the role and responsibilities of this office has been carried out for some time. The Tribunal will undertake a full review of the role and responsibilities of the SPP at the time of the next annual review.

Section 3 Conclusion

28. The Federal Tribunal has recently determined an increase of 3.9 percent in respect of Federal Judges. This represents the 2004 cost of living increase. As noted earlier the Tribunal has also passed on the last instalment of the 5 percent from its special review as foreshadowed in its Report of November 2002. The overall result of this special review has been increase of 27 percent for Federal and State Judges for the 2 years 1 July 2002 to 30 June 2004. By any standards, this level of increase in such a short period of time is well beyond community standards. This situation is exacerbated when one considers that this increase flows automatically into the pensions of retired judges.
29. The Tribunal has consistently matched the increases determined by the Commonwealth Tribunal. The NSW Government has recommended that this be repeated for the 2004 determination.
30. The Tribunal will again maintain the 85 percent nexus, however, this practise will come under close scrutiny if the Commonwealth Tribunal grants another special increase beyond prevailing community standards. This scrutiny will particularly apply if the Commonwealth Tribunal does not openly and genuinely consult with this Tribunal.
31. The Tribunal is required to have regard to decisions of the Commonwealth Tribunal but not to automatically adopt its determinations. This Tribunal will make its own independent annual assessment as required under the Act.
32. To maintain the 85 percent nexus the Tribunal will be determining an increase similar to the Federal Tribunal's determination for NSW Judges. With the exception of the Senior Commissioner, Land and Environment Court the existing internal relativities will be retained.
33. Separate determinations have been made for Acting Judges.
34. Pursuant to Section 13 of the Statutory and Other Offices Remuneration Act 1975, as amended, the Tribunal determines that the remuneration to be paid to the office holders in this Group on and from 1 October 2004 shall be as set out in Determinations Nos 1-6.
35. The Tribunal has also made a Report and determination on Travel Allowances for NSW Judges and Magistrates. The Report and Determination are attached at Determination No 7.

REPORT AND DETERMINATION

Travel Allowances for NSW Judges and Magistrates

Report**(a) Background:**

1. Remuneration" is defined in the Statutory and Other Offices Remuneration Act 1975, as salary and allowances payable to office holders. Judges and magistrates are holders of offices specified in Schedule 1 of the Act.
2. "Allowance" is defined as follows
"allowance does not include a travelling or subsistence allowance, but includes a travelling or subsistence allowance for travel within Australia by the holder of an office specified in Schedule 1 who is:
 - (a) a Judge or Acting Judge of a court, or
 - (b) any other judicial officer (within the meaning of the Judicial Officers Act 1986) nominated by the Minister by notice in writing to the Tribunal for the purposes of this definition.
3. The Tribunal in this determination will be setting rates for overnight stays in capital cities, for overnight stays in areas other than capital cities and meal rates for day or part of day absences from headquarters. The Tribunal has also determined the conditions upon which the rates are to be paid.

(b) Current Review:

5. For the current review the Tribunal has had regard to movements in the travel rates as published in the Australian Taxation Office's Ruling 2004/19 and the rates adopted for the NSW Public Sector generally. The Tribunal also undertook a survey of accommodation rates in regional New South Wales.

(c) Principles Adopted

6. In making its determinations on travel allowance rates the Tribunal has adopted a number of guiding principles as set out hereunder.

- a. Travelling allowances are intended to meet the costs necessarily incurred by Judges and Magistrates who are required to travel away from home/place of work on official business. Such costs cover accommodation, meals and incidental expenses.
 - b. Allowances are provided to ensure that an officer is not financially disadvantaged as a result of having to travel on official business.
 - c. Office holders are not expected to gain or lose financially as a result of travelling on official business.
 - d. Where an office holder is accommodated in private, non-commercial accommodation such as the home of a family member or friend, a rate of one third of the specified rate is payable, rounded upwards to the nearest dollar.
7. The rates for accommodation across NSW vary considerably from town to town. There will be some country towns where the country daily rate will be of financial advantage to the Judge and there will be some (a much lesser number) where the Judge or Magistrate could be financially disadvantaged. On balance, the Tribunal is persuaded that with the exception of Newcastle and Wollongong a common rate for Judges and a common rate for Magistrates should be applied for the remainder of NSW in the knowledge that across a year a Judge or Magistrate will most likely be neither financially advantaged or disadvantaged.

(d) Conclusions

8. In making its determination the Tribunal has had regard to the current travel allowance rates contained in Taxation Ruling 2004/19.
9. Non metropolitan accommodation rates and meal allowance rates have not changed from the Tribunal's previous determination.
10. After reviewing the survey of intra state accommodation and meal costs, the Tribunal makes the following determination effective on and from 1 October 2004.

Report and Determination Under Section 13 of the
Statutory and Other Offices Remuneration Act 1975

Public Office Holder Group

Section 1: Background

1. Section 13 of the Statutory and Other Offices Remuneration Act 1975, (the Act), requires the Statutory and Other Offices Remuneration Tribunal, to make a determination of the remuneration to be paid to office holders on and from 1 October in that year. "Remuneration" is defined in section 10A as salary or allowances paid in money.
2. The Public Office Holders Group comprises those public offices, listed in the Schedules of the Act (except for the Judges Magistrates and Related Group), which have been grouped together by the Tribunal for remuneration purposes. The remuneration for this Group is determined as a fixed salary amount. Employer on costs such as Superannuation Guarantee Levy are, unlike the Senior Executive Service, additional to the salary amount determined. It is the Government's view that there be no direct nexus with the remuneration of the Judges Magistrates and Related Group. The Tribunal has supported this position in past Determinations.
3. Since the last review, the Tribunal also made a separate determination for the Clerk of the Parliaments, who elected to forego his employer provided motor vehicle, by increasing his remuneration to an amount equivalent to the cost of a motor vehicle obtained under State contract. This was consistent with determinations made for other officers in this Group who made similar elections.

Section 2: Submissions Received

Government Submission

4. The Government has asked the Tribunal to consider various factors, including the economic outlook and has recommended a 3 percent increase for this Group.

Other Submissions Received.

For this review the Tribunal has received a submission from the Registrar Workers Compensation Commission.

Section 3: 2004 Tribunal Review

5. For the present review, the Tribunal has considered the Submission from the Registrar, Workers Compensation Commission and met with the office holder to explore further the issues raised in that submission.
6. The Workers Compensation Commission (WCC) was established as part of the Government's workers compensation reforms in 2001 to provide a fair and cost effective system for the resolution of disputes under the Workers Compensation legislation. The WCC is intended to provide a timely service to ensure workers' entitlements are paid promptly and that where necessary it provides an independent dispute resolution service that is effective in settling matters between the parties in accordance with the legislation.
7. For the reasons stated in the 2003 Report, the Tribunal first reviewed the role and responsibilities of the position as part of the 2003 annual review. At that time the Commission is has been operating for over 12 months. At that time the Tribunal noted that:
 - i. "...The position has two main roles. As the CEO of the Commission the Registrar is responsible for the management of the Commission's budget of \$30 million and 80 full time staff, 85 Arbitrators, 34 Mediators and 113 Approved Medical Specialists. In addition the Registrar is responsible for and overall managerial responsibility for Mediators and Approved Medical Specialists.
 - ii. In addition the Registrar has specific statutory functions under the Legislation. In the exercise of their functions, the Arbitrators are under the control and direction of the Registrar and are accountable to the Registrar. The Act also provides that the Registrar decides which Arbitrator is to constitute the Commission in any proceedings. The Registrar also has all the functions and duties of an Arbitrator.
 - iii. In the case of appeals against medical assessments, the Registrar decides how an appeal is to be heard and determining the Arbitrator and Approved Medical Specialists to constitute the Appeal.
 - iv. On the basis of the information before the Tribunal it is considered appropriate that the remuneration of the office be increased to the level shown in the determination."
8. On this occasion, the Registrar has pointed to increased workload, increased staffing and changes in reporting responsibilities. There was, however, no significant change in the role and responsibilities to warrant a further increase on this occasion.

President Guardianship Tribunal

9. The Tribunal has been advised that recruitment action will shortly commence to replace the President of the Guardianship Tribunal who will be retiring from the position.
10. The current office holder was provided with a vehicle as part of his employment arrangements. Since then the Government has introduced a policy that provides for motor vehicles to be available only through salary sacrifice arrangements. Premier's Department Circular 2002-43 dated 23 September 2002 articulates this policy and provides that:
- "...Ministers and Chief Executive Officers are to ensure that motor vehicles in future are only available to statutory office holders, including public office holders, through normal public sector salary sacrifice arrangements.
- Motor vehicles are not to be offered as part of an employment package under any special arrangement."
11. To ensure the new appointee is not disadvantaged by the new policy arrangements the Tribunal will make a determination increasing the remuneration for the new President, Guardianship Tribunal consistent with similar determination made for other office holders whose remuneration was increased as a result of their foregoing the employer provided and funded motor vehicle.

Section 4: Conclusion

12. The Tribunal has noted the Government recommendation that the increase be limited to 3 percent for this Group. The Tribunal has also had regard to the economic and budgetary outlook, key national economic indicators and increases flowing generally to public sector groups both federally and in New South Wales. On this basis the Tribunal considers that an increase of 4.0 percent would be appropriate and so determines.
13. Pursuant to Section 13 of the Statutory and Other Offices Remuneration Act 1975, as amended, the Tribunal determines that the remuneration to be paid to office holders on and from 1 October 2004 shall be as specified in Annexure A.

Chief Executive and Senior Executive Services¹

Section 1: Background

1. Section 24C of the Statutory and Other Offices Remuneration Act 1975 (the Act) provides for the Tribunal to determine annual remuneration packages for the SES to take effect on and from 1 October in that year.
2. The SES was introduced in the NSW public sector in 1989. The key features of the SES are:
 - classified into eight remuneration levels
 - minimum and maximum of each remuneration level determined by the Tribunal
 - remuneration packages expressed as total cost of employment
 - conditions of employment contained in the contract of employment
 - each officer is required to enter into an individual performance agreement with the Minister (in the case of the CEO) or the CEO (in the case of an SES officer)
 - provision for annual increase in remuneration based on performance assessment.
3. In addition to the SES some officers in the Public Office Holders Group elected, pursuant to section 11A of the Act to receive remuneration packages under similar arrangements applicable to the SES.
4. The Senior Officer (SO) classification was introduced in December 1996. The work value of SO Levels (1-3) mirrors that of SES Levels (1 – 3) with lower rates of remuneration for SOs intended to be a trade off for both tenured employment and superannuation payments to the SOs by the Government.

Section 2: 2004 Review

Government submission

5. The Government has provided a submission to the Tribunal. It states that a key challenge for the Government is to ensure that the Senior Executive Service continues to attract talented and skilled staff now and into the future.
6. It has provided details of key national economic indicators, details of salary movements across the NSW public Sector and public sector remuneration for SES and non SES across Australia.
7. The Government submission finds that:

“...The economic, salary and superannuation data outline a strong case for remuneration movements in the minimum and maximum of each SES level in NSW.

...General economic indicators and remuneration changes across Australia point to remuneration increases in the range of 3-3.9%. An environment of fiscal restraint would appear to support an increase of 3% to maintain a competitive Senior Executive Service in NSW. The figure of 3% lies between projected Sydney CPI and wage cost index figures provided by Treasury for 2004-5, being 2.5% and 2.75%, and is in line with the Government’s wages policy.”

8. In respect of the Recruitment and Retention Allowance, the Government has requested that the current rates be maintained. The Government supports the continuation of specifying separately these two allowances.

Treasury Forecasts

9. The Government has provided a detailed analysis from the NSW Treasury on the NSW budget strategy for the next 12 months. NSW Treasury anticipates that the Consumer Price Index (CPI) for Sydney in 2004/2005 will be 2.5 percent, a slight increase on the 2.25 percent estimate for 2003/2004. Wages growth as measured by the Wage Cost Index (WCI) is expected to be 3.75 percent in the next 12 months.
10. In respect of Wages Policy NSW Treasury has advised that the Government would be adopting a common approach in the new round of wage negotiations with public sector unions. More specifically:

“...The Government’s wages policy seeks to maintain the value of the real wage increases provided to public sector employees since 1996, which are in the range of 13-20%. This policy implies nominal wage rises of up to 3% a year.

Using the Wage Cost Index (from its start in September 1997 to March 2004), NSW public sector wages have increased by 1.5% per annum in real terms relative to a 0.7% increase for NSW private sector employees.

The Government will adopt the same policy for all new wage agreements in 2004-2005. Major awards due for renewal include nurses, police, general public service and health employees.

The wages policy implies nominal pay rises of about 3% per year through negotiated settlements. Recent increases granted by the NSW Industrial Relations Commission, however, have been well in excess of the Government’s policy.

Section 3: 2004 Tribunal Review

Wage and Salary movements

11. In 2003, the Tribunal determined, in addition to a general increase of 3 percent for the SES and additional 1.7 percent “catch-up”. This “catch-up” was to ensure that SES remuneration increases did not fall significantly behind Award based salary increases received by key public sector groups, particularly Senior Officers, earlier in 2003.
12. The Tribunal considers that by providing the additional 1.7 percent “catch-up” the SES has not been disadvantaged viz a viz the other public sector groups in terms of remuneration increases and forms an appropriate benchmark from which to commence the 2004 review.
13. The Tribunal has noted those matters set out in the submission concerning the 2004/2005 budget strategy as provided by the NSW Treasury.
14. The Tribunal has also noted the latest key national economic indicators. These show that the Wage Cost Index for the public sector in NSW was 4.8% for the year ended 30 June 2004, and 3.9% for the public sector across Australia. The CPI for the same period was 2.5% nationally and 2.3% for Sydney. As noted above Treasury expects the CPI and the WCI to remain steady over the next twelve months.

15. The Tribunal notes that Secretaries of Commonwealth Departments have received increases of 3.9 percent and that Australian Workplace Agreements have delivered adjusted increases totalling between 4.6 percent and 5.3 percent. Federal and NSW Members of Parliament have received increases of 3.9 percent. Federal Judges also received a 3.9 percent economic adjustment increase from 1 July 2004.
16. The Tribunal has examined the increases received by the main public sector groups in NSW since the Tribunal's last determination. The following public sector groups have received salary increases since October 2003.

Nurses	3.5% January 04	3.5%
Fire Brigade	4.0% January 04	4.0%
Police (Non Commissioned and Commissioned Officers)	4.0% January 04 + 5.0% July 04	9%

17. Public Servants (including Senior Officers) last award increase was in July 2003. The Government has advised that its offer of 3 percent was rejected by the Unions and, as a result, the matter is currently before the Industrial Relations Commission. The matter is scheduled to be heard in March 2005.
18. The Tribunal has considered carefully the recommendation of the Government that the increase should be limited to 3 percent. The Tribunal notes, however, that increases determined by the Industrial Relations Commission for Teachers and Nurses have been greater than 3 percent and that increases provided to Federal Members of Parliament and Federal Judges, which flow to NSW Members of Parliament and NSW Judges were closer to 4 percent than 3 percent. Key economic indicators also suggest that an increase greater than 3 percent is warranted on this occasion.
19. Having regard to the above and that this determination will apply until 1 October 2005, the Tribunal considers that a general increase of 4 percent is appropriate and so determines. This increase will be subject to a satisfactory performance assessment by each SES officer. Progression within the remuneration levels is subject to specific guidelines issued by the Director General of the Premier's Department.

Minimum remuneration levels

20. In 2002 the Tribunal reviewed the remuneration ranges and determined that the existing overlap within each level should be eliminated. This required an upward adjustment to the minimum rates for SES levels 2-7. As a result some officers required an increase greater than the Tribunal's determined general increase for 2002, to maintain the minimum remuneration for their level. To ensure that no affected SES officer received a windfall gain, the Tribunal required that any increase in

excess of general increase determined by the Tribunal be approved by the Director General of the Premier's Department. This requirement was maintained for the 2003 Determination.

21. The Government has advised that the situation has now been addressed with most agencies that had officers below the minimum having sought the Director-General, Premier's Departments approval to move them to the new minimum. The Director General's approval is to continue to be sought for any request to increase above the annual determination for any SES officers who continues to be remunerated below the minimum of their level.

Recruitment Allowance and Retention Allowance

22. The Recruitment Allowance assists in being able to attract and recruit to positions persons with special qualifications and experience for which the standard remuneration package may be not adequate. The Retention Allowance assists in retaining persons during their contract period who may otherwise be attracted to take a position either elsewhere in the public sector or outside the public sector.
23. In 2003 the Tribunal undertook a review of these rates and considered that they needed to be adjusted to maintain their continued relevance and effectiveness. The Tribunal provided such an adjustment to each of the rates.
24. For the 2004 determination the Tribunal retains the Recruitment and Retention Allowances at the current levels and under identical arrangements to those provided in previous determinations.

Section 11A Office Holders

25. Section 11A Office Holders are statutory appointees who exercise independent statutory functions and some of whom also have CEO type responsibilities. These office holders, pursuant to Section 11A of the Act, to have access to remuneration packaging identical to the SES. Unlike the SES however, their employment status is governed by legislation specific to each office holder and they are not subject to annual performance appraisal.

Solicitor for Public Prosecutions

26. The new Solicitor for Public Prosecutions has written to the Tribunal advising that, unlike his predecessor, he will not be electing to receive remuneration packaging pursuant to section 11A of the Act. As a result, the Solicitor for Public Prosecutions is removed from the list of those officers who have elected to be provided with employment benefits pursuant to section 11A of the Act. For remuneration purposes, the office will in future be listed with the Judges, Magistrates and Related Group.

Officers whose current remuneration package falls below the minimum for their SES Level will not be adjusted automatically to the new minimum rate. Where a CEO considers that such an SES officer's performance merits a higher increase than 4.0 percent, the approval of the Director General of the Premier's Department will need to be obtained.

Determination No. 2 – Recruitment Allowance

To the remuneration package amounts determined above there may be added a Recruitment Allowance up to the maximum for each level as set out hereunder, subject to the approval of the Director General of the Premier's Department. The Allowance will apply for new SES offices and contract renewals, where it has been certified that a specific skill is necessary for recruitment purposes and the performance of the duties of the position.

Officers in receipt of a Recruitment Allowance are not eligible for payment of a Retention Allowance.

Determination No 3 – Retention Allowance

SECTION 40 (2) of the Travel Agents Act 1986 requires the Commissioner for Fair Trading to publish in the Government Gazette from time to time a list of licence holders.

Section 40 (7) of the Act deems the supplier of travel services to an unlisted travel agent to have aided and abetted that person in carrying on business as a travel agent. Thus the supplier could be subject to the same penalty of 500 penalty units as the agent is trading without a licence.

Suppliers of travel services should not deal with an unlisted person or corporation unable to produce a travel agent's licence.
