FISHERIES MANAGEMENT ACT 1994
Section 8 Notification - Fishing Closure
Jervis Bay (including Currambene Creek)

I, Steve Dunn, prohibit the taking of fish by the methods of fishing specified in Column 1 of Schedules 1 and 2 of this notification, from waters shown opposite in Column 2 of those Schedules, respectively.

Fishing is further subject to the conditions as specified with respect to, any Schedule of this notification.

This prohibition is effective for a period of up to five years from the date of publication, unless sooner varied or revoked by notification of Director-General of NSW Fisheries.

Note: The word 'Regulation', where appearing in this notification, refers to the *Fisheries Management (General) Regulation 2002*.

Schedule 1

Jervis Bay - Scallops

<i>Column 1</i> Methods	<i>Column 2</i> Waters
The taking of Scallops by all methods.	The whole of the waters of Jervis Bay together with its creek tributaries and inlets, generally westerly from a line drawn between the eastern point of Point Perpendicular south-westerly the most northerly point of Bowen Island.
Conditions: This closure only applies to commercial fishers, however, exclude commercial fishers who hold a section 37 permit to take scallops in Jervis Bay.	

Schedule 2

Currambene Creek - Nets

<i>Column 1</i> Methods	<i>Column 2</i> Waters
By means of nets of every description, except the dip or scoop net and the landing net as prescribed by Regulation.	The whole of the waters of Currambene Creek upwards to its source from a line drawn from a post marked "FD" on the northern point of entrance to Currambene Creek bearing 134 degrees to the War Memorial on the southern shore at Huskisson.

Note: This closure applies to both commercial and recreational fishers. The purpose closure is to prohibit the taking of scallops by commercial fishers that do not hold an endorsement to prevent overfishing and to protect fish stocks.

I, Steve Dunn, prohibit the taking of fish by the methods of fishing specified in Column 1 of Schedules 1 to 4 of this notification, from waters shown opposite in Column 2, respectively, of those Schedules.

Fishing is further subject to the conditions as specified with respect to, any Schedule of this notification.

This prohibition is effective for a period of up to five years from the date of publication, unless sooner varied or revoked by notification of Director-General of NSW Fisheries.

Note: The word 'Regulation', where appearing in this notification, refers to the *Fisheries Management (General) Regulation 2002*.

Schedule 1**Myall River - Nets**

<i>Column 1</i> Methods	<i>Column 2</i> Waters
By means of nets of every description, other than the landing net , as prescribed by Regulation.	The whole of the waters of the Myall River together with its creeks and tributaries, upstream of the Pacific Highway Road Bridge, at the township of Bulahdelah.

Schedule 2**Boolambayte Creek - Nets**

<i>Column 1</i> Methods	<i>Column 2</i> Waters
By means of nets of every description, other than the landing net , as prescribed by Regulation.	The whole of the waters of Boolambayte Creek together with all its tributaries, upstream of its confluence with Boolambayte Lake.

Schedule 3

Myall Lakes - Nets

<i>Column 1</i> Methods	<i>Column 2</i> Waters
By means of nets of every description, when used for the taking of prawns only, except the dip or scoop net, hand hauled prawn net and push or scissors net and the landing net , as prescribed by Regulation.	The whole of the waters of Myall Lakes, including Boolambayte Lake and the Broadwater, their creeks and tributaries north of the confluence of the Myall River with the Bombah Broadwater.

Schedule 4

Set Mesh Nets - Myall River

<i>Column 1</i> Methods	<i>Column 2</i> Waters
By means of meshing nets , except when such nets are used by the method of ' splashing ', as prescribed by Regulation.	Myall River and tributaries upstream of the transmission power line crossing of the Myall River (approximately 4km downstream from the town of Bulahdelah) at portion 107, Parish of Bulahdelah.
Condition: This closure covers the area between the transmission power line approximately 4km from the township of Bulahdelah upstream to the Pacific Highway Road Bridge. Waters upstream of the road bridge are closed as outlined in schedule 1.	

Note: This closure applies to both recreational and commercial fishers. The purpose of the closure is to conserve and protect fish and prawn stocks.
