### Explanatory note

Section 160 of the *Workers Compensation Act 1987* provides that an employer is required to pay the *prescribed excess amount* to the insurer under a policy of insurance in respect of each weekly compensation claim that the insurer has paid under the policy.

The object of this Order is to amend the *Insurance Premiums Order 2012–2013* to update a reference to the manner in which the prescribed excess amount is to be calculated.

This Order applies in respect of policies of insurance that are to be or have been issued or renewed so as to take effect on or after 4 pm on 31 December 2012 and before 4 pm on 30 June 2013.

This Order is made under sections 160 and 168 of the *Workers Compensation Act 1987*.

This Notice may be cited as the 4.6 Metre High Vehicle Notice 2013.

**1.2 Commencement**

This Notice takes effect on 1 January 2013.

**1.3 Effect**

This Notice remains in force until 31 December 2017 unless it is amended or repealed earlier.

**1.4 Interpretation**

- (a) Unless stated otherwise, words and expressions used in this Notice have the same meaning as those set out in the Road Transport (General) Act 2005.
- (b) Unless stated otherwise, notes in this Notice do not form part of this Notice.

**PART 2 – VEHICLE CLASSES**

For the purposes of this Notice the following classes of vehicles are specified.

**2.1 Class 1 vehicles**

- (a) A special purpose vehicle that exceeds 4.3 metres, but does not exceed 4.6 metres, in height;
- (b) A vehicle or combination (including a low loader or load platform combination) that is specially designed for the carriage of a large indivisible item, or is carrying a large indivisible item, that together with any load, exceeds 4.3 metres but does not exceed 4.6 metres in height;

**2.2 Class 2 vehicles**

- (a) A combination carrying vehicles on more than one deck that together with any load, exceeds 4.3 metres but does not exceed 4.6 metres in height;
- (b) A single motor vehicle, or a combination, that exceeds 4.3 metres but does not exceed 4.6 metres in height and is built to carry cattle, sheep, pigs or horses.

**2.3 Class 3 vehicles**

- (a) A single motor vehicle, or a combination, that, together with its load exceeds 4.3 metres but does not exceed 4.6 metres in height and is carrying wool, hay bales or other primary produce;
- (b) A single motor vehicle carrying vehicles on more than one deck that, together with its load exceeds 4.3 metres but does not exceed 4.6 metres in height.
- (c) A single motor vehicle, or a combination, that is constructed to exceed 4.3 metres in height, but does not exceed 4.6 metres in height and is carrying freight, other than cattle, sheep, pigs, horses, wool, hay bales, or other primary produce.
- (d) A single motor vehicle, other than a double deck bus, or a combination, that together with any load exceeds 4.3 metres in height, but does not exceed 4.6 metres in height.
- (e) A double deck bus that exceeds 4.3 metres in height, but does not exceed 4.4 metres in height.
- (f) A single motor vehicle or combination carrying a freight container that together with its load exceeds 4.3 metres in height, but does not exceed 4.6 metres in height.

## PART 3 – VEHICLE ACCESS

**3.1 Approved 4.6m high routes and areas**

The vehicles described in Part 2 of this Notice may operate on the routes and in the areas specified in Appendix 1 if they comply with Part 4 and the relevant sections of Part 5 of this Notice.

Note: Approved 4.6 metre high vehicle areas and routes are assessed for their suitability, however over time routes may be obstructed by vegetation or temporary works. Responsibility for due care and diligence remains with the individual driver to avoid any such obstruction.

Note: For the 'Special Requirements' relating to construction, loading and equipment refer to Clause 5.1 (general freight); 5.2 (stock crates); 5.3 (car carriers); 5.4 (hay bales); 5.5 (wool bales); 5.6 (freight containers).

**3.2 B-doubles travelling on 4.6m high routes**

A B-double that exceeds 4.3 metres but does not exceed 4.6 metres in height may operate on routes and in the areas permitted in this Notice if:

- (a) it is also permitted to do so by the Class 2 B-Double Notice 2010 as amended from time to time; and
- (b) any relevant conditions set out in the Class 2 B-Double Notice 2010 as amended from time to time, are complied with.

Note: This means the road must be approved for both 4.6m high and B-double travel.

**3.3 Road Trains travelling on 4.6m high routes**

A road train that exceeds 4.3 metres but does not exceed 4.6 metres in height may operate on the routes and in those areas permitted in this Notice if:

- (a) it is also permitted to do so by the Class 2 Road Train Notice 2012 as amended from time to time; and
- (b) any relevant conditions set out in the Class 2 Road Train Notice 2012 as amended from time to time, are complied with.

Note: This means the road must be approved for both 4.6m high and road train travel.

**3.4 Modular B-triples travelling on 4.6m high routes**

A modular B-triple that exceeds 4.3 metres but does not exceed 4.6 metres in height may operate on the routes and in those areas permitted in this Notice if:

- (a) it is also permitted to do so by the Class 2 Modular B-triple Notice 2012 as amended from time to time, and
- (b) any relevant conditions set out in the Class 2 Modular B-triple Notice 2012 as amended from time to time, are complied with.

Note: This means the road must be approved for both 4.6m high and modular B-triple travel.

**3.5 Car Carriers travelling on 4.6m high routes**

A car carrier that exceeds 4.3 metres but does not exceed 4.6 metres in height may operate on the routes and in those areas permitted in this Notice if:

- (a) it also permitted to do so by the Class 2 Car Carrier Combination Notice 2011 as amended from time to time.
- (b) any relevant conditions set out in the Class 2 Car Carrier Combination Notice 2011 as amended from time to time, are complied with.

Note: This means the road must be approved for both 4.6m high and car carrier travel.

## PART 4 – GENERAL REQUIREMENTS

**4.1 Direction of travel**

Travel is permitted in both directions on all roads approved for travel under this Notice except where stated in Appendix 1, or where one way traffic only is permitted.

**4.2 Copy of Notice must be carried**

A copy of this Notice, excluding Appendix 1, must be carried in the driving compartment whenever the vehicle is operating under this Notice and must be produced when requested to do so by a police officer or an authorised officer.

**4.3 Load security**

The load must be secured in accordance with the requirements of the Road Transport (Mass, Loading and Access) Regulation 2005. Therefore a load restraint system must be used which is capable of withstanding the forces which result if the laden vehicle were subjected to each of the following separately:

- (a) 0.8g deceleration in a forward direction;
- (b) 0.5g deceleration in a reward direction;
- (c) 0.5g acceleration in either lateral direction; and
- (d) 0.2g acceleration in either from the load in a vertical direction:

where "g" (the acceleration due to gravity) is equal to 9.81 metres/second/ second (Refer Diagram 4.1).



## PART 5 – SPECIAL REQUIREMENTS

### 5.1 Vehicles constructed to 4.6m carrying general freight (i.e. freight other than vehicles, livestock, or primary produce)

- (a) A vehicle or vehicle combination that is constructed to exceed 4.3 metres in height, but does not exceed 4.6 metres in height and is carrying freight other than vehicles, cattle, sheep, pigs, wool, hay bales, or other primary produce, must:
- have a maximum deck height of 1.2 metres over at least 50% of its deck length; and
  - have air suspension on trailers; and
  - be operated at 10% less than the gross mass limit applicable to the vehicle or combination.

### 5.2 Multi-deck stock crates

Livestock must not be carried in an upper deck of a multi-deck stock crate unless any lower deck of the stock crate is fully laden.

### 5.3 Car carriers

Car carriers operating under this Notice must comply with the following requirements.

- Car carriers must not carry a load other than motor vehicles, trailers, and caravans.
- The overall height of the car carrier and its load does not exceed 4.6 metres.
- With the exception of cab/chassis, all vehicles carried as loading must be carried directly on decking fixed to the base vehicle structure and not carried on other vehicles being carried as loading by the base vehicle.
- No vehicle can be carried on an upper deck unless all decks below it, except the well deck, are fully occupied, except under the following circumstances:
  - Where the rear of the upper deck of the car carrier can be lowered, vehicles that cannot fit in the lower deck may be transported on the lowered section of the upper deck if the rest of the lower deck of the car carrier is full (refer Figure 5.1);



- a vehicle may be carried on the upper deck forward of the lowered upper deck if there is a vehicle in the space under it, or the vehicle is above the cabin of the car carrier (refer Figure 5.2). If the vehicle can fit into the lower deck, it must be carried on the lower deck.



- (e) Where a mix of vehicles is carried and there is a difference in the mass of individual vehicles the total mass of the vehicles on the upper deck shall not exceed the total mass of the vehicles on the lower deck.
- (f) For all vehicles, except cab/chassis:
  - (i) a secure and substantial part of the structure of each end of each vehicle carried must be lashed to the structure of the car carrier;
  - (ii) where wheel lashings are relied upon to meet this requirement at least one wheel on each side of each vehicle, must be secured to the car carrier.
- (g) For cab/chassis:
  - (i) at least one end of each vehicle's chassis frame must be lashed to the structure of the car carrier;
  - (ii) the other end may be secured to the chassis frame of another cab/chassis if both ends of the lower cab/chassis are lashed to the structure of the car carrier.
- (h) Except for cab/chassis as above, the securing of one vehicle to another vehicle being carried on the same carrier, is not permitted.

#### 5.4 Hay bales

A vehicle or vehicle combination that exceeds 4.3 metres in height but does not exceed 4.6 metres in height that is transporting hay bales must comply with the load restraint requirements listed in either section 5.4.1 or 5.4.2.

##### 5.4.1 Conventional Hay Bale Load Restraint

- (a) For hay bales 1.5 metres (or more) long, each group of bales laid transversely must be secured to the vehicle structure by webbing and webbing winches;
- (b) For hay bales less than 1.5 metres long laid transversely, at least every second group of bales and both end bale groups must be secured by webbing and webbing winches, and a cap tarpaulin must cover and secure the top of the entire load;
- (c) Gates must be provided at each end of the load and held upright by diagonal chains, or equivalent means, attached to the tie rails. (Ropes will not provide sufficient restraint for this purpose);
- (d) Angle or edge protectors must be placed between the webbing straps and the bales.

Note: For hay bales 1.5 metres (or more) long, the loading and unloading pattern and sequence described in Figure 5.3 should be followed to prevent accidents when loading and unloading the vehicle.



##### 5.4.2 Certified Load Restraint System

A certified load restraint system compliant with the performance standards outlined in Section F and certified in accordance with Section I of the NTC Load Restraint Guide, Second Edition 2004.

A copy of the certification, including all relevant reports and diagrams must be carried in the vehicle at all times when operated at a height exceeding 4.3 metres and must be presented to an authorised officer when requested.

#### 5.5 Wool bales

Wool bales carried under this Notice must comply with the following loading pattern.

##### (a) Loading Pattern

- (i) The first tier comprises two rows of bales placed on their flat with heads together and butts facing outwards. Bales shall be loaded so that no seam of any bale projects beyond the outermost limit of the tray of the vehicle (See Figure 5.4 Loading Pattern)



- (ii) The second tier is placed on top of the first tier in the same pattern.
  - (iii) The third tier comprises three rows of bales placed on their flat with their ends facing to the front and back of the vehicle.
  - (iv) The fourth tier comprises no more than two rows of binding bales placed on their flat, with at least one row facing to the front and back of the vehicle.
  - (v) If the fourth tier comprises only one row of bales, it should be placed along the centre of the vehicle, with the ends of all bales facing the same direction, either outwards or to the front and back of the vehicle.
- (b) Restraining the load laterally
- (i) The outward spread of the lower bales along the sides of the vehicle must be minimised by using separate lashings to restrain the centre of the lower two rows of bales (See Figure 5.5).



- (ii) Lashings (minimum standard 12 mm synthetic ropes) must be tied over the five centre bales.
- (iii) After the third row of bales is added, webbing lashings each of a minimum rated capacity of 2 tonnes must be applied at each bale along the length of the vehicle (See Figure 5.6). Ropes alone are not strong enough for this application. Two webbing lashings must be replaced by rope where there are no suitable winch positions, except for the end two lashings, provided that the two lashings are not side by side.



- (iv) Where a fourth row of two bales is added to the already restrained bottom three rows, it must be restrained by a suitable cap tarpaulin but still having ropes on the front and rear end bales (See Figure 5.7). If a cap tarpaulin is not utilised, ropes or webbing lashings should be applied at each bale along the length of the load.



- (c) Restraining the load forwards and rearwards
- (i) Forward and rearward movement of the load must be restrained by tie-down lashings, with additional restraint from strong head and tail gates.

- (ii) Diagonal chains of 2 tonnes minimum rated capacity must be attached to the top of these gates and onto the vehicle tie rail supports to provide additional restraint (See Figure 5.7).

### 5.6 Freight containers

- (a) Freight containers must not be carried under this Notice unless securely fastened to the carrying vehicle by twist locks.
- (b) Clause 5.6 (a) applies whether a container is laden or unladen, and whether certified for marine use or not.

### PART 6 – DEFINITIONS


**'cab/chassis'** means an incomplete motor lorry without a body or turntable;

**'lashing'** means a device such as chain, cable or webbing together with suitable fittings which is used to restrain a load;

**'primary produce'** means:

- (b) fruit, grain, flowers, vegetables, tobacco, or farm or agricultural produce;
- (c) dairy, poultry, other bird farming, pig farming, bee keeping, oyster or fish culture produce;
- (d) nursery produce;
- (e) sheep, cattle or horses;
- (f) eucalyptus or other oil produce from leaves for distillation.

**'well deck'** means a deck area which is below the level of the top of the road wheels of the carrying vehicle.


- (1) In the conditions annexed to the lease, the expression “the Minister” means the Minister administering the Western Lands Act 1901, and any power, authority, duty or function conferred or imposed upon the Minister by or under those conditions may be exercised or performed either by the Minister or by such officers of the Department of Primary Industries as the Minister may from time to time approve.
- (2) In these conditions and reservations the expression “the Commissioner” means the Commissioner charged with the administration of the Western Lands Act 1901 (“the Act”) in accordance with section 4(2) of the Act.
- (3) (a) For the purposes of this clause the term Lessor shall include Her Majesty the Queen Her Heirs and Successors the Minister and the agents servants employees and contractors of the Lessor Her Majesty Her Majesty’s Heirs and Successors and the Minister.  
 (b) The lessee covenants with the Lessor to indemnify and keep indemnified the Lessor from and against all claims for injury loss or damage suffered by any person or body using or being in or upon the

- Premises or any adjoining land or premises of the Lessor arising out of the Holder's use of the Premises and against all liabilities for costs charges and expenses incurred by the Lessor in respect of the claim of any such person or body except to the extent that any such claims and demands arise wholly from any negligence or wilful act or omission on the part of the Lessor.
- (c) The indemnity contained in this clause applies notwithstanding that this Lease authorised or required the lessee to undertake or perform the activity giving rise to any claim for injury loss or damage.
- (d) The lessee expressly agrees that the obligations of the Holder under this clause shall continue after the expiration or sooner determination of this Lease in respect of any act deed matter or thing occurring before such expiration or determination.
- (4) The rent of the lease shall be assessed in accordance with Part 6 of the Western Lands Act 1901.

- (ii) If the imposition of a GST or any subsequent change in the GST law is accompanied by or undertaken in connection with the abolition of or reduction in any existing taxes, duties or statutory charges (in this clause "taxes"), the consideration payable by the recipient of the supply made under this Agreement will be reduced by the actual costs of the party making the supply that are reduced directly or indirectly as a consequence of the abolition of or reduction in taxes.
- (7) The lessee must pay all rates and taxes assessed on or in respect of the land leased during the currency of the lease.
- (8) The lessee must hold and use the land leased bona fide for the lessee's own exclusive benefit and must not transfer, convey or assign the land or any portion thereof without having first obtained the written consent of the Minister.
- (9) The lessee must not enter into a sublease of the land leased unless the sublease specifies the purpose for which the land may be used under the sublease, and it is a purpose which is consistent with the purpose for which the land may be used under this lease.

- (14) The lessee must not erect or permit any person to erect any buildings or extend any existing buildings on the land leased except in accordance with plan and specifications approved by the Council of the local government area.
- (15) The lessee must ensure that the land leased is kept in a neat and tidy condition to the satisfaction of the Commissioner and not permit refuse to accumulate on the land.
- (16) Upon termination or forfeiture of the lease the Commissioner may direct that the former lessee remove any structure or material from the land at his own cost and without compensation. Where such a direction has been given the former lessee must leave the land in a clean and tidy condition free from rubbish and debris.

  - II Any change in the shareholding of the Lessee's company which alters its effective control of the lease from that previously known to the Commissioner shall be deemed an assignment by the Lessee.
  - III Where any notice or other communication is required to be served or given or which may be convenient to be served or given under or in connection with this lease it shall be sufficiently executed if it is signed by the company secretary.
  - IV A copy of the company's annual financial balance sheet or other financial statement which gives a true and fair view of the company's state of affairs as at the end of each financial year is to be submitted to the Commissioner upon request.
- (33) The lessee must ensure that cultivation and associated activities do not interfere with any road formation within the allowable area.
- (34) The lessee must ensure incised drainage lines, other than manmade structures which carry water after storms are left uncultivated in the channels and for a distance of at least 20 metres on either side of the banks of the channels, except when the Commissioner specifies otherwise.
- (35) The lessee must ensure that all access tracks to the area to be cultivated must be arranged in such a manner as to minimise the disturbance of any land surface or native vegetation and ensure direct access through the area.
- (36) The lessee must establish windbreaks at his/her own expense as may be ordered by Commissioner to provide adequate protection of the soil.
- (37) The lessee must undertake any appropriate measures, at his/her own expense, ordered by the Commissioner to rehabilitate any degraded cultivated areas.

- (38) The lessee must ensure stubble is retained on the soil surface and must not be burnt, except with the approval of the Commissioner or his delegate.
- (39) The lessee must ensure that sand hills and other soils with a surface texture of loamy sand or coarser are left uncultivated unless specifically approved by the commissioner.
- (40) The lessee must ensure that areas with a slope greater than 2% remain uncultivated until any soil conservation measures documented in a plan approved by the Commissioner have been implemented at the lessee's expense.
- (41) The lessee must ensure that land within 60 metres of any texture contrast or duplex soil area remains uncultivated except in accordance with a plan approved by the Commissioner. Texture contrast (or duplex) soils are soil types which have sandy to loamy topsoil abruptly overlying a clay subsoil and are prone to scalding (producing clay pans and hummocks).
- (42) The lessee must ensure that cultivation and cropping do not alter the natural flood regime or obstruct the reasonable passage of floodwaters. Crops are not to be protected by levees.
- (43) The lessee must ensure that no tail water or drainage water run-off will escape or discharge into or onto adjoining lands by any means including surface or subsurface drains or pipes.
- (44) The lessee must only conduct **Dryland Cultivation** of **310 hectares** (on Western Lands Lease 650) shown hatched on the diagram hereunder.

## Preamble

1. The Water Sharing Plan for the Murrumbidgee Regulated River Water Source 2003 (“the Plan”) was amended on 4 October 2012 to include the Lowbidgee area, and provisions relating to flood control and flood irrigation in relation to land within the Lowbidgee area.
2. Water that had historically been diverted (under a legislative power) for flood irrigation during periods of access to supplementary water in the Murrumbidgee Regulated River Water Source was converted to supplementary water (Lowbidgee) access licence.
3. Three supplementary water (Lowbidgee) access licences have been issued for three areas of the Lowbidgee (Nimmie-Caira, Redbank North, and Redbank South). Each licence is co-held.
4. Clause 51 of the Plan sets out the rules for extraction of water under supplementary water (Lowbidgee) access licences, including the triggers for permitting extraction. The taking of water under supplementary water access licences and supplementary water (Lowbidgee) access licences will be managed, as far as possible to evenly share access opportunities amongst all supplementary water access licences and supplementary water (Lowbidgee) access licences permitted to access the event in accordance with clause 51.

Note: Available water determinations, supplementary water announcements and net trade in water allocations will set the upper limit on the total volume of water diverted to each area of the Lowbidgee in a single water year

5. Pursuant to clause 51(8) of the Plan, water taken under supplementary water (Lowbidgee) access licences must be distributed in accordance with any distribution rules established by the Minister under clause 51A.
6. The Minister may establish rules under clause 51A of the Plan for the distribution of water taken under supplementary water (Lowbidgee) access licences in the Lowbidgee area. The Minister must consider the following matters when developing distribution rules:
  - a. providing rules for the orderly, efficient and equitable sharing of water,
  - b. historical rules for water distribution,
  - c. infrastructure capacity constraints,
  - d. the protection, restoration and rehabilitation of floodplains and their dependent ecosystems (including groundwater and wetlands), and
  - e. any other matters the Minister considers relevant.
7. This document establishes the rules for internal water distribution for water taken under the supplementary water (Lowbidgee) access licences (the “distribution rules”).

Note: This document was approved by the Minister on 13 December 2012.

8. Interpretation of this document will be in line with the following principles:
  - a. Words and expressions that are defined in the Acronyms and Key Terms on page 2 of this document have the meanings set out in that table;
  - b. Schedules to the distribution rules form part of the distribution rules;
  - c. Notes in the text of the distribution rules do not form part of the distribution rules; and
  - d. Words in the singular include the plural and words in the plural include the singular.
9. The distribution rules established in this document commence on 1 January 2013.

Note: Clause 51A (2) of the Plan provides that the Minister may amend, revoke or replace these distribution rules whenever the Minister considers it necessary to do so.

Water distribution rules for extractions under supplementary water (Lowbidgee) access licences from the Murrumbidgee Regulated River Water Source

## Part 1 - Introduction

10. For the purposes of these distribution rules, the following areas are established within the area marked as Lowbidgee on the Registered Map for the Plan, namely:

- a. Nimmie-Caira,
- b. Redbank North and
- c. Redbank South.

Note: The "Registered Map for the Plan" is the Plan Map referred to in clause 4 and Appendix 1 of the Plan.

11. The areas established under clause 10 are shown on the map in Schedule 1.

12. State Water Corporation (SWC) operates the water supply works that take and distribute water under supplementary water (Lowbidgee) access licences to the benefitted land within the Lowbidgee area ("the Lowbidgee water supply works").

Note: The Lowbidgee water supply works are identified in SWC's water supply work approval (40WA405734) as the Nimmie Creek Offtake Regulator, North Caira Bridge Regulator, South Caira Bridge Regulator, Waugorah Regulator, Yanga Regulator, Glen Dee Regulator and Juanbung Regulator.

13. Clause 51A of the Plan requires that when State Water Corporation operates its Lowbidgee water supply works to take and distribute water under supplementary water (Lowbidgee) access licences it does so in accordance with the distribution rules.

Note 1: This clause does not preclude Lowbidgee water supply works being used to deliver water for environmental purposes or under any other access licence subject to agreement by landholders and approval by SWC.

Note 2: If capacity sharing issues arise due to the use of Lowbidgee water supply works for purposes other than distribution of water under supplementary water (Lowbidgee) access licences, the Lowbidgee licences shall take precedence.

14. Sharing of Lowbidgee extractions between the areas established in clause 10 of this document will be in accordance with the SWC operating protocols developed to give effect to clause 51A of the Plan.

15. It is acknowledged that once water is taken by licence holders via the Lowbidgee water supply works, the distribution of water to the benefitted land is subject to operational constraints. A reference in these distribution rules to a requirement on SWC to release a particular volume from a work or to inundate a particular area is a requirement on SWC to use its best endeavours to release that volume or achieve that inundation.

16. A person who is being supplied with water taken by licence holders via the Lowbidgee water supply works must not apply water to their land or a nominated area of their land, unless instructed to do so by SWC.

Note 1: Clause 59(6A) of the Plan requires that supplementary water (Lowbidgee) access licences have a mandatory condition requiring that water can only be taken in accordance with the distribution rules established by the Minister.

Note 2: Clause 60(4) of the Plan requires a similar mandatory condition for water supply work approvals that take and distribute water under supplementary water (Lowbidgee) access licences. At the commencement of the distribution rules only the SWC Lowbidgee water supply works will have this condition.

Note 3: The distribution rules for all areas of the Lowbidgee distinguish between benefitted land and non-benefitted land that can be supplied as WSUA (see map in Schedule 1). In the Nimmie-Caira area rules for different Tiers also apply. SWC instructions on water taken under a licence will include details of lands which must be watered and which must be complied with.

Note 4: Water use approvals will need to be held by benefitted land holders and where required non-benefitted land holders who request WSUA. The water use approval will authorise the use of water that is distributed to land for flood irrigation purposes provided it is used in accordance with the distribution rules.

Note 5: Water supply works that distribute water to land subject to a water use approval are exempt from the requirement for a water supply work approval.

17. If a person does not comply with an instruction received from SWC referred to in clause 16, the supply of water to that person may be suspended until that person complies with that instruction to the satisfaction of SWC.

Water distribution rules for extractions under supplementary water (Lowbidgee) access licences from the Murrumbidgee Regulated River Water Source

Note 1: Any water that is taken under a supplementary water (Lowbidgee) access licence other than in accordance with the distribution rules will be a breach of the licence condition.

Note 2: It is an offence for a person to use water other than in accordance with a water use approval.

## Part 2 Rules for water distribution within the Nimmie-Caira area

### General watering priorities

18. For the purpose of efficient and equitable water distribution, the Nimmie-Caira area is divided into the following sections:

- a. Nimmie system; and
- b. Caira system

as shown in the map in Schedule 2.

19. The rules in this Part apply to water taken by licence holders via the nominated water supply works under supplementary water (Lowbidgee) access licence 40AL412442 ("the Nimmie-Caira licence").

Note: The nominated water supply works are Nimmie Creek Offtake Regulator, North Caira Bridge Regulator and South Caira Bridge Regulator.

20. Subject to clause 30, water taken by licence holders via the nominated water supply works under the Nimmie-Caira licence is to be made available equally between the Nimmie and Caira systems.

21. Each system is to be operated independently except where cross flows are required to comply with clause 30.

22. For the purposes of water distribution within the Nimmie-Caira area of the Lowbidgee, the following Tiers are established:

- a. T1A - water distribution for the supply of water for critical stock and domestic purposes on the land shown on the map in Schedule 2 via the replenishment of tanks and/or dams through defined channels including Nimmie creek up to Nap Nap regulator;

Note 1: Clause 24 provides that the distribution of water under T1A rules to properties outside the benefitted land in Nimmie-Caira shown on the map in Schedule 2 is permitted, if required, under these rules. Specifically, the licence holders may make T1A water available as Water Supply Under Agreement (WSUA) to the "Warwaegae" domestic and stock tank; "Rolands" stock tank; "Hells Gate" stock tank; and "Kia Ora" stock tank. Cost recovery arrangements for the supply and use of this water are the responsibility of the Nimmie-Caira licence holders and the landholders of the nominated properties.

Note 2: Up to approximately 10,000 ML/year of the total supplementary water (Lowbidgee) access licence entitlement issued to landholders in the Nimmie-Caira area reflects historic T1A requirements in line with the rules set out in this document.

- b. T1B - water distribution for the supply of water to the floodways as shown on the map in Schedule 2;

Note: Approximately 50,000 to 60,000 ML/year of the total supplementary water (Lowbidgee) access licence entitlement issued to landholders in the Nimmie-Caira area reflects historic T1B requirements in line with the rules set out in this document.

- c. T2 - water distribution for the supply of water to properties shown on the map in Schedule 2. Floodways, watered under Tier 1B rules are recognised as T2 once water has been fully distributed for T1B;

Note 1: Land within this tier represents the land initially developed for irrigation and is based on the 1983 flooded area used for rating since 1986 as shown on the map in Schedule 2.

Note 2: Clause 24 provides that the distribution of water under T2 rules to properties outside the benefitted land in Nimmie-Caira shown on the map in Schedule 2 is permitted if required under these rules. Specifically, the licence holders may make T2 water available as WSUA for use on approximately 500 hectares of land on the property known as "Warwaegae" to the west and southwest of the domestic and stock tanks. Cost recovery arrangements for the supply and use of this water are the responsibility of the Nimmie-Caira licence holders and the landholder of the nominated property.

Water distribution rules for extractions under supplementary water (Lowbidgee) access licences from the Murrumbidgee Regulated River Water Source

- d. T3 - water distribution for the supply of water to properties shown on the map in Schedule 2.

Note: Land in this tier was developed for irrigation after the T2 land and has historically been supplied only after T2 land. T3 land is defined as shown on the map in Schedule 2, based on SWC records of benefitted land as at 1 July 2012.

23. In any calendar year, water taken under the Nimmie-Caira licence must be distributed to the tiers in the following order of priority:

- a. T1A then
- b. T1B, then
- c. T2, then
- d. T3.

24. Notwithstanding the priorities established under clause 23, the distribution of water under T1A rules and T2 rules to land other than the benefitted land is permitted as specified below:

- a. T1A water may be made available as WSUA by the Nimmie-Caira licence holders to the "Warwaegae" domestic and stock tank; "Rolands" stock tank; "Hells Gate" stock tank; and "Kia Ora" stock tank; and
- b. T2 water may be made available as WSUA by the Nimmie-Caira licence holders for use on approximately 500 hectares of land on the property known as "Warwaegae" to the west and southwest of the domestic and stock tanks.

25. If, in the opinion of SWC, water has been fully distributed for T3 requirements, the Nimmie-Caira licence holders may either trade that water or make it available as WSUA in accordance with Part 5 of these rules.

Note 1: Rules for trade of entitlement or account water accruing to the supplementary water (Lowbidgee) access licences are set by clauses 53 to 58 of the Plan.

Note 2: Under the distribution rules, if SWC determines that there is no demand for water for T2 or T3 lands using the processes established in clause 28 of this document, water may be offered for trade or as WSUA once the water requirements of T1A and T1B lands have been satisfied.

26. Subject to clauses 27 to 30, water must, in the opinion of SWC, be fully distributed to each tier before distribution to the next tier can begin.

27. Factors to be considered by SWC in forming the opinion that water has been fully distributed to a tier, under clause 26, are set out:

- a. in clause 33 for T1A;
- b. clause 36 for T1B;
- c. clause 41 for T2; and
- d. clause 48 for T3.

28. SWC must seek expressions of interest from the Nimmie-Caira licence holders within each tier prior to the commencement of diversions under such licence to ascertain demand for water in each tier. The Nimmie-Caira licence holders must notify SWC immediately if their circumstances change after the commencement of diversions.

Note: Licence holders must notify SWC of a change in their circumstances that would impact on SWCs ability to release a particular volume from a work or to inundate a particular area. For example, if a bank or other work failed and a breakout occurred, SWC must be notified immediately upon the licence holder becoming aware of the failure so that SWC can respond and adapt to the changed circumstances.

29. When, in the opinion of SWC there is sufficient water available to satisfy multiple tiers, then tiers may be supplied simultaneously.

30. When, in the opinion of SWC, it is not possible to rectify uneven water distribution in the Nimmie and Caira systems, water may be made available to subsequent tiers in one system prior to water being fully distributed to the current tier being watered in the other system.

Water distribution rules for extractions under supplementary water (Lowbidgee) access licences from the Murrumbidgee Regulated River Water Source

Note: Uneven distribution of water of the Nimmie and Caira systems may arise from differing rates of demand or distributional efficiency of infrastructure.

### Tier 1A watering (T1A)

31. SWC must distribute water for T1A twice each calendar year subject to supplementary water availability and operational constraints. The timing of the distribution of water for T1A is to be determined by SWC.
32. When, in the opinion of SWC, water has not been fully distributed to T1A at the close of a period of supplementary water access, SWC will make water from subsequent supplementary events available at the point where the distribution of water previously ceased, subject to operational constraints.

Note: This rule applies across calendar years where necessary.

33. Before forming an opinion that water has been fully distributed to T1A, SWC must take into account the following factors:
  - a. the availability of water to the Lowbidgee from the supplementary event;
  - b. any interruptions to water supply for this Tier during previous supplementary events
  - c. demand for water when supplementary announcements for the Lowbidgee are made; and
  - d. the efficiency of water distribution.

### Tier 1B watering (T1B)

34. Unless SWC is of the opinion that water is not required for T1B, it must distribute water for T1B from the nominated water supply works to Lake Tala once in each calendar year.
35. When, in the opinion of SWC, water has not been fully distributed to T1B at the close of a period of supplementary water access, SWC will make water from subsequent supplementary events available at the point where the distribution of water previously ceased, subject to operational constraints.

Note: This rule applies across calendar years where necessary.

36. Before forming an opinion that water is required or has been fully distributed to T1B, SWC must take into account the following factors:
  - a. the pattern of previous watering across the Nimmie-Caira area;
  - b. any interruptions to water supply for this Tier during previous supplementary events;
  - c. the availability of water to the Lowbidgee from the supplementary event;
  - d. timing of water availability;
  - e. likely water availability of Lowbidgee extractions in the current calendar year;
  - f. requirements of water dependent ecosystems in the floodways; and
  - g. the efficiency of water distribution.
37. Where directed by SWC, Nimmie-Caira licence holders must ensure that all floodway obstructions are open and capable of passing normal weir diversions until SWC has notified licence holders that it is of the opinion that water has been fully distributed to T1B.

### Tier 2 watering (T2)

38. Supply of water for T2 land will be distributed to Nimmie-Caira licence holders who expressed interest to SWC in receiving water on their benefitted land, beginning with benefitted land that is closest to the nominated water supply works, and then distributed sequentially down each of the Nimmie and Caira systems.
39. When, in the opinion of SWC, water has not been fully distributed to T2 at the close of a period of supplementary water access, SWC will make water from subsequent

Water distribution rules for extractions under supplementary water (Lowbidgee) access licences from the Murrumbidgee Regulated River Water Source

supplementary events available at the point where the distribution of water previously ceased, subject to operational constraints.

Note: This rule applies across calendar years where necessary.

40. T2 benefitted land must not be watered more than once in a calendar year unless SWC is of the opinion that water has been fully distributed to all tiers.

41. Before forming an opinion that water has been fully distributed to T2, SWC must take into account the following factors:

- a. The demand for water for T2 land when supplementary announcements for the Lowbidgee are made;

Note: Demand will be assessed via an expression of interest process set out in clause 28 of this document.

The ability of T2 Nimmie-Caira licence holders to extract available water; and

- b. The availability of water from the supplementary event to meet T2 requirements.

Note: Total extraction to the Nimmie-Caira in a given year will be subject to the licensed volume, available water determinations and net effect of any dealings.

42. If Nimmie-Caira licence holders do not request water under T2 when made available by SWC, the benefitted land will be treated as T3 benefitted land for that calendar year.

Note: The effect of this clause is that T2 benefitted lands which were not included in the T2 watering, may still participate in the SWC expression of interest process for T3 water for that and other Lowbidgee supplementary events for that calendar year. From 1 January the following year, the benefitted land would once again be considered by SWC in making water available for T2 water.

43. If by 15 September in any year, SWC has finished taking water through the nominated water supply works, and, in the opinion of SWC, no further take of water is likely in the foreseeable future, the following "dry year" rules apply:

- a. water made available for T2 benefitted lands may be held for a maximum of 5 days after the irrigation bay to which the water was applied is full,
- b. releases made under this clause must commence with the first landholding to receive water under the supplementary event and then be distributed sequentially down the system until all demand is met or water no longer drains from the T2 lands.

Note: The intent of the dry year rules is to maximise the benefit of limited water by limiting the period of time that each property holds water before releasing it to the next property in this tier.

44. Once triggered, dry year rules remain in place until, in SWC's opinion, water availability has or is likely to improve sufficiently to satisfy water requirements of T1A, T1B and T2.

45. The distribution of water to T2 land described in clauses 38 to 44 may be varied at any time by agreement with all affected Nimmie-Caira licence holders.

Note: The number of affected licence holders referred to in clause 45 will be determined by the nature of the proposed variation to the distribution rules.

### Tier 3 (T3)

46. Supply of water for T3 land will be distributed to Nimmie-Caira licence holders who expressed interest to SWC in receiving water on their benefitted land, beginning with benefitted land that is closest to the nominated water supply works, and then distributed sequentially down each of the Nimmie and Caira systems.

47. When, in the opinion of SWC, water has not been fully distributed to T3 at the close of a period of supplementary water access, SWC will make water from subsequent supplementary events within each calendar year available at the point where the distribution of water previously ceased, subject to operational constraints.

Note: The effect of clause 47 is that Tier 3 watering resets to the distribution pattern set out in clause 46 at the start of every calendar year.

Water distribution rules for extractions under supplementary water (Lowbidgee) access licences from the Murrumbidgee Regulated River Water Source

48. Before forming an opinion that water has been fully distributed to T3, SWC must take into account the following factors:

- a. the availability of water to the Lowbidgee from the supplementary event;
- b. any interruptions to water supply for this Tier during previous supplementary events;
- c. demand for water by licence holders with T3 benefitted land when supplementary announcements for the Lowbidgee are made; and

Note: Demand will be assessed via an expression of interest process set out in clause 28 of this document.

- d. the efficiency of water distribution.

49. The distribution of water to T3 land described in clauses 46 to 48 may be varied at any time by agreement with all affected Nimmie-Caira licence holders.

Note: The number of affected licence holders referred to in clause 49 will be determined by the nature of the proposed variation to the distribution rules.

### Part 3 Rules for water distribution within Redbank North area

50. The rules in this Part apply to water taken by licence holders via the nominated water supply works under supplementary water (Lowbidgee) access licence 40AL412444 ("the Redbank North licence").

Note: The nominated water supply works are the Glen Dee Regulator and Juanbung Regulator.

51. The distribution of water within the Redbank North area will be determined by SWC prior to licence holders taking water for the first time each calendar year. In making its determination under this clause, SWC will be guided by the following general principles:

- a. Subject to sub clause c water will be distributed sequentially from the top to the bottom of the Redbank North area;
- b. When SWC is of the opinion that there is sufficient water available, water may be distributed at multiple points within the Redbank North area to ensure water delivery efficiency and availability to Redbank North licence holders is maximised;
- c. When, in the opinion of SWC, water was not fully distributed the previous calendar year, SWC will distribute water from the point where the distribution of water previously ceased, subject to operational constraints,

and will consider the following factors:

- d. likely volume of water available to the Redbank North licence holder(s)
- e. timing of water availability;
- f. likely water availability of Lowbidgee extractions in the current water year;
- g. recent inundation history, including the pattern of previous watering across the Redbank North area;
- h. demand for water by Redbank North licence holders with benefitted land when supplementary announcements for the Lowbidgee are made;

Note: Demand will be assessed via an expression of interest process set out in clause 53 of this document.

- i. efficiency of water delivery; and
- j. requirements of water dependent ecosystems in Redbank North area.

52. Before forming an opinion that water has been fully distributed to Redbank North, SWC must take into account the following factors:

- a. the availability of water to the Lowbidgee from the supplementary event;
- b. any interruptions to water supply for this area during previous supplementary events;

Water distribution rules for extractions under supplementary water (Lowbidgee) access licences from the Murrumbidgee Regulated River Water Source

- c. demand for water by Redbank North licence holders with benefitted land when supplementary announcements for the Lowbidgee are made; and
- d. the efficiency of water distribution.

53. SWC must seek expressions of interest from the Redbank North licence holders prior to the commencement of diversions under such licence to ascertain demand for water referred to in clauses 51h and 52(c) above. The Redbank North licence holders must notify SWC immediately if their circumstances change after the commencement of diversions.

Note: Licence holders must notify SWC of a change in their circumstances that would impact on SWCs ability to release a particular volume from a work or to inundate a particular area. For example, if a bank or other work failed and a breakout occurred, SWC must be notified immediately upon the licence holder becoming aware of the failure so that SWC can respond and adapt to the changed circumstances.

54. SWC must release water from regulators back into the Murrumbidgee Regulated River, located at the downstream end of the Redbank North area when, in SWC's opinion, floodwaters are threatening bank stability.

55. If in the opinion of SWC water has been fully distributed, Redbank North licence holders may either trade that water or make it available under WSUA in accordance with Part 5 of these rules.

Note: Rules for trade of entitlement or account water accruing to the supplementary water (Lowbidgee) access licences are set out in clauses 53 to 58 of the Plan.

56. The distribution of water between properties described in clauses 50 to 55 may be varied at any time by agreement with all affected Redbank North licence holders

Note: The number of affected licence holders referred to in clause 56 will be determined by the nature of the proposed variation to the distribution rules.

#### **Part 4 Rules for water distribution within Redbank South area**

57. The rules in this Part apply to water taken by licence holders from the nominated water supply works under supplementary water (Lowbidgee) access licence 40AL412443 ("the Redbank South licence").

Note: The nominated water supply works are Waugorah Regulator and Yanga Regulator.

58. Water is to be distributed by SWC to the Redbank South area by:

- a. overland flow sequentially from the top to the bottom of the Redbank South area for each event; or
- b. via the Nimmie-Caira infrastructure.

Note 1: Current infrastructure for Redbank South means that the bulk of the diversions to this area of the Lowbidgee will be made from the Redbank weir pool via the Yanga (1AS) regulator or under high flow conditions, the Waugorah (1ES) regulator. Use of this infrastructure prevents interrupted watering events from commencing at the point at which they left off.

Note 2: Distribution of water under the supplementary water (Lowbidgee) access licence to Redbank South via Nimmie-Caira infrastructure would require prior agreement with licence holders with land benefitted by the SWC Lowbidgee works within the Nimmie-Caira area, arrangements for costs associated with the use of this infrastructure and a dealing under s.71W of the Water Management Act 2000.

59. The delivery mechanism used for watering within Redbank South area will be determined by SWC prior to each supplementary event which is announced for supplementary water (Lowbidgee) access licences. In making its determination under this clause, SWC will consider:

- a. likely volume of water available to the licence holder(s);
- b. timing of water availability;
- c. likely water availability of Lowbidgee extractions in the current water year;

Water distribution rules for extractions under supplementary water (Lowbidgee) access licences from the Murrumbidgee Regulated River Water Source

- d. recent inundation history, including the pattern of previous watering across the Redbank South area;
- e. demand for water by Redbank South licence holders with benefitted land when supplementary announcements for the Lowbidgee are made;

Note: Demand will be assessed via an expression of interest process set out in clause 62 of this document.

- f. efficiency of water delivery; and
- g. requirements of water dependent ecosystems in Redbank South area.

60. If in the opinion of SWC water has been fully distributed, Redbank South licence holders may either trade that water or make it available under WSUA in accordance with Part 5 of these rules.

Note: Rules for trade of entitlement or account water accruing to the supplementary water (Lowbidgee) access licences are set out in clauses 53 to 58 of the Plan.

61. Before forming an opinion that water has been fully distributed to Redbank South, SWC must take into account the following factors:

- a. the availability of water to the Lowbidgee from the supplementary event;
- b. demand for water by Redbank South licence holders with benefitted land when supplementary announcements for the Lowbidgee are made; and
- c. the efficiency of water distribution.

62. SWC will seek expressions of interest from Redbank South licence holders prior to taking and distributing water to ascertain demand for water referred to in clauses above and 61(b) above. The Redbank South licence holders must notify SWC immediately if their circumstances change after the commencement of diversions.

Note: Licence holders must notify SWC of a change in their circumstances that would impact on SWC's ability to release a particular volume from a work or to inundate a particular area. For example, if a bank or other work failed and a breakout occurred, SWC must be notified immediately upon the licence holder becoming aware of the failure so that SWC can respond and adapt to the changed circumstances.

## Part 5 Water supply under agreement (WSUA)

63. Water may be supplied by the licence holders to land other than the benefitted land as WSUA, if SWC is of the opinion that supply is physically possible and:

- a. water requirements of licence holder(s) in an area of the Lowbidgee, established in clause 10, have been met, or
- b. all affected licence holders agree to any proposed WSUA, or
- c. flows are greater than the requirements of licence holders with benefitted land of that area of the Lowbidgee.

Note 1: Water provided under these arrangements will be accounted for as water ordered by the licence holders and will be debited from their water account.

Note 2: In the Nimmie-Caira area, satisfaction of the requirements in clause 63 relates to all tiers T1A, T1B, T2 and T3.

Note 3: Charges for water provided under these arrangements are a commercial arrangement between the WSUA landholders and the licence holders.

64. Clause 63 does not apply to the distribution of water under clause 24.

65. When, in the opinion of SWC there is sufficient water available to satisfy all benefitted land within an area of the Lowbidgee shown in the map in Schedule 1 and land other than the benefitted land, then water may be supplied to all areas simultaneously. Provided:

- a. the supply of water to land other than the benefitted land under WSUA does not significantly alter the timing of water supplied to benefitted land; and
- b. the requirements of clauses 66 and 67 are met.

Water distribution rules for extractions under supplementary water (Lowbidgee) access licences from the Murrumbidgee Regulated River Water Source

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66. The licence holders must obtain the written approval of SWC for any proposed WSUA before any water is supplied under that agreement.

67. Any water supplied by licence holders under a WSUA must be in accordance with any requirements of SWC as to how that physical transfer of water is to be effected.

### Part 6 Advice from licence holders

68. SWC must consider advice from licence holders in the relevant area of the Lowbidgee in relation to forming its opinion under the following clauses:

#### In the Nimmie-Caira area:

- a. Clauses 25, 26, 27, 28, 29 and 30 relating to satisfaction of water requirements of each Tier;
- b. Clause 31, relating to timing of T1A;
- c. Clause 32 and 33 in relation to the distribution of water for T1A;
- d. Clause 34, 35, 36 and 37, relating to the need for the distribution of water under T1B;
- e. Clause 38 and 41, relating to the distribution of water for T2;
- f. Clause 43 and 44, relating to declaration of 'dry year';
- g. Clause 46, 47 and 48 relating to the distribution of water for T3;
- h. Clause 45 and 49, relating to variation to the rules.

#### In the Redbank North area:


- i. Clauses 51, 52 and 53, relating to the distribution of water within the Redbank North area;


Water distribution rules for extractions under supplementary water (Lowbidgee) access licences from the Murrumbidgee Regulated River Water Source

THE Henry Salkauskas Art (Purchase) Award (Trust) ('the Trust') is an inter-vivos trust established to maintain a fund to facilitate the purchase, by the Trustees of the Art Gallery of New South Wales (AGNSW) of an Australian contemporary art work for addition to the permanent exhibited collection of the AGNSW, for the purpose of honouring the memory of the late Henry Salkauskas. A sum of \$30,000 was transferred by the grantor, Ona-Ana Salkauskas, to the Trustees of the AGNSW to be held on trust.

The Trustees claim that there are now insufficient funds to generate sufficient income to fund the purchase of suitable art works. The AGNSW seeks to have the Trust wound up and the funds transferred to the Art Gallery New South Wales Trust ('Art Gallery Trust') to be contributed to a fund within the Art Gallery Trust to purchase or contribute to the purchase of an Australian contemporary artwork. As at 27 October 2011, the Trust had the sum of \$34,692.47 in capital and the sum of \$3,389.41 described by the AGNSW as 'expendable', presumably income.

Section 12 of the Charitable Trusts Act 1993 allows the Attorney General to, by order, establish a scheme for the administration of any charitable trust. Section 12 (1) (b) provides that the Attorney General may 'establish a scheme to extend or vary the powers of the trustees of a charitable trust or prescribe or vary the manner or mode of administration of a charitable trust, either generally or in a particular case, if it appears to the Attorney General that it is expedient to do so in the interests of the administration of the charitable trust ...'.

The Solicitor General, as delegate of the Attorney General in Charitable Trusts Act 1993 matters, has determined that the Henry Salkauskas Art (Purchase) Award (Trust) is a trust for a valid charitable purpose, being a gift either for the 'advancement of education' or 'other purposes beneficial to the community'. The Solicitor General has approved of a scheme which will vary the manner or mode of administration of the Trust by permitting the use of the capital and income to purchase from time to time until the fund is dissipated an Australian contemporary art work for the AGNSW's permanent collection.

Accordingly, the Solicitor General, has approved of the establishment of an administrative scheme pursuant to section 12 (1) (b) of the Charitable Trusts Act 1993 to allow for the use of the capital and income of the Henry Salkauskas Art (Purchase) Award (Trust) to purchase, from time to time until the funds are dissipated, for the AGNSW's permanent collection, an Australian contemporary art work. The purchase to be clearly named and labelled "Henry Salkauskas Art (Purchase) Award (year acquired)."

BY deed dated 4 May 1954, executed by the “founders”, Geoffrey Le Gay Brereton, Beryl Armstrong and John Le Gay Brereton and the Trustees of the Art Gallery of New South Wales (AGNSW), the Trustees of the AGNSW were named the Trustees of the Robert Le Gay Brereton Memorial Prize Fund. The Trust was established to promote the study of the art of draughtsmanship and to fund a prize in memory of Robert Le Gay Brereton, a serviceman killed during war service in World War II.

As at 30 September 2011 the Trust was comprised of \$6,372.22 in capital and \$5,457.41 described as expendable (presumably income). Since 2002 the value of the prize has been \$800, reduced from \$1200 in 1988. The trust only permits the income and not capital to be used for the prize.

The AGNSW seeks to have the funds applied cy-pres because it believes that the objects of the trust have failed. The prize was first awarded in 1955 and, according to the AGNSW, the prize has received a low level of interest for most of its existence. The number of entrants has remained below 10 since 2003, with some years the number being 5 or less. The prize was last awarded in 2010. In 2011 there was only one entrant who did not meet the required standard, so no award was made. The prize was not awarded for the same reasons in 1976, 1986 and 2007.

The AGNSW has tried a number of things to increase the level of interest in the prize and now wants the Trust wound up and the funds transferred to a specific fund within the AGNSW Trust to be administered by the AGNSW’s Public Program Department.

Section 12 of the Charitable Trusts Act 1993 allows the Attorney General to, by order, establish a scheme for the administration of any charitable trust, such as the Le Gay Brereton Trust. Section 12 (1) (b) provides that the Attorney General may ‘establish a scheme to extend or vary the powers of the trustees of a charitable trust or prescribe or vary the manner or mode of administration of a charitable trust, either generally or in a particular case, if it appears to the Attorney General that it is expedient to do so in the interests of the administration of the charitable trust ...’.

The Solicitor General, as delegate of the Attorney General in such matters, has determined that the Robert Le Gay Brereton Memorial Prize is a trust for a valid charitable purpose. The Solicitor General has approved of a scheme which will vary the manner or mode of administration of the Trust by permitting the use of the capital and income of the trust to award the prize until the fund is dissipated

Accordingly, the Solicitor General, has approved of the establishment of an administrative scheme pursuant to section 12 (1) (b) of the Charitable Trusts Act 1993 to allow for the use of the capital and income to continue funding the Robert Le Gay Brereton Memorial Prize until the fund is dissipated.

I am satisfied that each electricity load to which this Order applies is used in connection with an industry or activity that is both emissions intensive and trade exposed and that the exemption is generally consistent with the objects of Part 9 of the Act.

  - o ADR means alternative dispute resolution (including mediation under Part 4 of the CPA and arbitration under Part 5 of the CPA)
  - o LCR means the Local Court Rules 2009
  - o UCPR means the Uniform Civil Procedure Rules 2005
- 3.3 This practice note describes the practice of the Local Court in managing civil proceedings so as to achieve the just, quick and cheap resolution of the real issues in the proceedings: section 56 (1) CPA.
- 3.4 The court's time standards aim to finalise 90% of civil proceedings within 6 months of commencement and 100% within 12 months. Parties must plan to meet these time standards.
- 3.5 The court by this practice note seeks to give effect to the overriding purpose of the CPA and to the finalisation of all civil proceedings within the court's time standards.
- 3.6 A party to civil proceedings is under a duty to assist the court to further the overriding purpose and, to that effect, to participate in the processes of the court and to comply with the directions of the court: section 56 (3) CPA.
- 3.7 This practice note is structured as follows:
- o Part A – General provisions
  - o Part B – General Division case management
  - o Part C – Small Claims Division case management
  - o Part D – Subpoenas and applications for disclosure of documents
  - o Part E – Expert evidence
  - o Part F – Costs
  - o Part G – Maximum costs orders in the General Division
  - o Part H – Pre-judgment interest

**PART A – GENERAL PROVISIONS****4 Directions**

- 4.1 The Court may give such directions as it thinks fit for the speedy determination of the real issues between the parties to the proceedings.

**5 General adjournments**

- 5.1 No proceedings are ever stood over generally: see section 66 (1) CPA.

**6 Representation**

- 6.1 Subject to paragraph 6.2, where a party is legally represented, the legal representative (or their agent) must appear on all occasions.
- 6.2 A party or their legal representative may mention the proceedings on behalf of the legal representative for another party except at:
- o The first call-over in the General Division
  - o When proceedings are listed for hearing
  - o The pre-trial review in the Small Claims Division
  - o Any listing for the return of subpoena.
- 6.2 The legal representative must have sufficient instructions to make and consider offers of settlement and to enable the Court to make all appropriate orders and directions.
- 6.3 If proceedings are adjourned due to a legal representative being insufficiently instructed a costs order may be made against the party.

**7 Dismissal**

- 7.1 If within 9 months after a statement of claim has been filed:
- (a) A defence or cross claim is not filed, or
  - (b) A default judgment is not entered, or
  - (c) The proceedings are not otherwise disposed of,
- the proceedings are on the Court's own motion and order dismissed: UCPR 12.9 (2).
- 7.2 The court will not dismiss proceedings under UCPR 12.9 if there are any notices of motion or other applications in the proceedings that have yet to be determined: UCPR 12.9 (4).

**8 Alternative Dispute Resolution**

- 8.1 The court may at any stage refer proceedings to ADR including on the first date the proceedings are listed before the court.
- 8.3 The court may refer proceedings to mediation with or without the consent of the parties.
- 8.4 The court will only refer proceedings to arbitration where there are no complex issues of fact or law and the hearing is estimated to take 3 hours or less.
- 8.5 The court will not refer proceedings in the Small Claims Division or proceedings involving allegations of fraud to arbitration unless special circumstances exist or the parties consent: UCPR 20.8.

**9 Transfer between Small Claims Division and General Division**

- 9.1 The court may transfer proceedings from the Small Claims Division to the General Division where it considers that the proceedings should be consolidated with other proceedings already commenced in the General Division.

**10 Change of Venue**

- 10.1 An application to change the venue under UCPR Part 8 must be made when the defence is filed, or at such other time as the court allows.
- 10.2 The court will not change the venue to another venue that is less than 100 kilometres from the originating venue unless satisfied that there are exceptional circumstances.
- 10.3 The notice of motion must specify the venue to which the applicant seeks the proceedings to be changed. It must be supported by an affidavit that:
- o Addresses the matters contained in UCPR r 8.2
  - o Sets out the reasons why the party is seeking to change the venue
  - o If relevant, includes material in support of any assertion of exceptional circumstances.
- 10.4 The registrar will list the proceedings for either a call-over or a pre-trial review within six weeks and will send a copy of the defence, the notice of motion and the affidavit to all other active parties.
- 10.5 If another party objects to the change of venue then the party may, within 14 days of receiving the notice of listing, file and serve an affidavit outlining the reasons why the party says the venue should not be changed.
- 10.6 Unless the court otherwise orders, a notice of motion for change of venue will be determined:
- o After 14 days from the date that the notice of listing was sent
  - o In the absence of the parties.
- 10.7 Where the court decides to change the venue, the registrar at the originating venue will:
- o Vacate any listings at the originating venue
  - o Re-list the proceedings at the new venue
  - o Advise the parties of the new listing arrangements.
- 10.8 Where the court decides that the venue not be changed the registrar will:
- o Advise the parties
  - o Confirm the listing at the originating venue.
- 10.9 Unless the court otherwise orders, the maximum costs order that the court will allow on the notice of motion is \$150 in relation to proceedings in the Small Claims Division and \$300 in relation to proceedings in the General Division.

**PART B – GENERAL DIVISION CASE MANAGEMENT****11 General principle**

- 11.1 The court will case manage the proceedings having regard to the objects specified in section 57 (1) CPA.

**12 Standard directions**

- 12.1 The proceedings will be listed for a first call-over within six weeks of the date on which the first defence is filed.

- 12.2 The court will advise the parties of the date of the first call-over and send them a copy of the standard directions (see Annexure A of the practice note).
- 12.3 Unless the court otherwise orders, the parties must comply with the standard directions.

### **13 First call-over**

- 13.1 The court will give directions designed to assist in the speedy determination of the real issues between the parties to the proceedings. These may include:
- o Making orders under CPA Part 6
  - o Allocating a date for return of subpoenas
  - o Referring the proceedings to mediation or arbitration
  - o Directing the parties to complete a civil listing advice (see Annexure B of the practice note) that must be filed in court on the next listing date.
- 13.2 The court may set a trial date and a review date.
- 13.3 If the court does not set a trial date and a review date then it will list the proceedings for a second call-over.

### **14 Second call-over/Directions hearing**

- 14.1 The second call-over will be held within 28 days of the first call-over.
- 14.2 At the second call-over, the court will:
- o Fix a trial date and a review date
  - o Give such directions as are necessary to assist in the speedy determination of the real issues between the parties to the proceedings
- 14.3 If the parties are not ready to take a trial date then the proceedings will be set down for a directions hearing before a magistrate.
- 14.4 Unless the court orders otherwise, the directions hearing will be take place within 14 days of the second call-over.

### **15 Review**

- 15.1 Unless the court otherwise orders, the review will be listed approximately four weeks before the trial date.
- 15.2 Where the parties are legally represented, the legal representative for each party must file in court and serve a completed and signed civil listing advice (Annexure B)
- 15.3 The court will:
- o Inquire whether the court's directions have been complied with
  - o Inquire whether the proceedings are ready for trial
  - o Satisfy itself as to the accuracy/appropriateness of the time estimates given in the civil listing advice.
- 15.3 If the court's earlier directions have not been complied with then the court may make such orders as it considers appropriate including:
- o Dismissing the proceedings or a cross claim
  - o Striking out a defence
  - o Making a costs order.
- 15.4 If a party has not served evidence in accordance with the standard directions or other order of the court, then the court may allow further time to serve the evidence on condition that if the evidence is not served within that further time, the party will not be able to rely on the evidence in chief at the hearing without leave of the court.
- 15.5 The court may impose limits on the time to be taken at the trial for:
- o Opening addresses
  - o Presentation of a party's case including cross-examination
  - o Closing addresses.
- 15.6 A party may not exceed these time limits unless special circumstances exist and the court gives leave to do so.

### **16 Notices of motion**

- 16.1 Parties must file any notices of motion as soon as practicable.
- 16.2 A notice of motion will be listed in the general motions list on the first available date and the parties must be ready to deal with the notice of motion on that date.
- 16.3 Parties will not be permitted to cross-examine witnesses at an interlocutory hearing unless they can demonstrate that there are cogent and compelling reasons for doing so having regard to the principles set out in CPA Part 6, Division 1.

**17 Vacating a trial date**

- 17.1 A party who wishes to vacate a trial date must file a notice of motion not less than 21 days prior to the trial date.
- 17.2 A party may apply to vacate a trial date within 21 days of the trial date if unforeseen circumstances arise (e.g. a witness becomes ill). The notice of motion:
- o Must be filed as soon as practicable and not later than the next working day after the party becomes aware of the unforeseen circumstances
  - o May be filed without waiting to obtain the consent of the other party.

**18 Appearances by telephone or audio-visual link (AVL) at the trial**

- 18.1 Any application for a party or a witness to be given leave to appear by telephone or AVL at the trial must be made at the time the proceedings are listed for hearing.
- 18.2 If leave is granted for a party or a witness to appear by telephone or AVL then the party who sought leave is responsible for:
- o If relevant, booking the remote AVL facility, paying any costs associated with the use of the AVL and arranging for the attendance of the party or the witness at that facility
  - o If relevant, arranging for the party or the witness to telephone the court at the relevant time during the trial
  - o Providing the party or the witness with a copy of any affidavits or documents to which the party or the witness may be referred while giving his or her evidence.

**PART C – SMALL CLAIMS DIVISION CASE MANAGEMENT****19 General principles**

- 19.1 The court will case manage the proceedings having regard to the objects specified in section 57 (1) CPA.
- 19.2 The court will conduct proceedings in the Small Claims Division with as little formality and technicality as the proper consideration of the proceedings permit.

**20 Pre-trial Review**

- 20.1 The proceedings will be listed for pre-trial review within six weeks of the date on which the first defence is filed.
- 20.2 The court will advise the parties of the date of the pre-trial review.
- 20.3 The objective of the pre-trial review is to provide an opportunity for the court to assist the parties to settle their dispute.
- 20.4 Parties must attend in person or, if legally represented, the legal representative must attend and have authority to settle the dispute.
- 20.5 The court may refer the parties to mediation.
- 20.6 If the proceedings do not settle at the pre-trial review then the parties must:
- o Identify the issues in dispute and disclose, as far as is known, the witness statements and documents upon which they propose to rely at the hearing
  - o Complete the pre-trial review sheet (Annexure C of the Practice Note) and file it in court at pre-trial review.
- 20.7 Any interlocutory applications (including to issue a subpoena) and any application to orally examine a witness at the trial must be made at the pre-trial review.
- 20.8 When deciding whether to order a witness to attend the trial to be orally examined, the court will consider:
- o The particular circumstances of the case, including the amount involved
  - o Whether there is a real issue as to credibility
  - o Whether there is a significant conflict in the evidence.
- 20.9 The court will generally make the case management order contained in Annexure D of the Practice Note.
- 20.10 If a party does not file and serve documents or witness statements in accordance with the case management order, the party will not be able to rely on those documents or witness statements at the hearing without leave of the court.

**21 Notices of motion**

- 21.1 Unless the rules otherwise provide, or leave is granted by the court, interlocutory applications in Small Claims proceedings are to be made orally at the pre-trial review: LCR r 2.10.

**22 Vacating a trial date**

- 22.1 A party who wishes to vacate a trial date must file a notice of motion not less than 21 days prior to the trial date.

- 22.2 A party may apply to vacate a trial date within 21 days of the trial date if unforeseen circumstances arise (e.g. a witness becomes ill). A notice of motion:
- o Must be filed as soon as practicable and not later than the next working day after the party becomes aware of the unforeseen circumstances
  - o May be filed without waiting to obtain the consent of the other party.

### **23 Trial**

- 23.1 A 'formal trial', that is, the normal adversarial trial where oral evidence is taken on oath, and witnesses are cross-examined is not available in the Small Claims Division.
- 23.2 Subject to any direction of the court, parties do not have the right to call a witness to give evidence, to cross-examine a witness or to give oral evidence at the hearing.
- 23.3 Proceedings will be heard and determined in open court on the basis of the documentary evidence that has been served and filed in accordance with the case management order. If evidence is not served and filed within the time directed then the party will not be able to rely on the evidence without leave of the court.
- 23.4 Where a direction has been made that a witness is to attend for cross-examination, the party relying on the statement of the witness as evidence in chief is responsible for securing the attendance of the witness for cross-examination. The proceedings will be heard and determined on the oral evidence together with the documentary evidence that has been filed and served in accordance with paragraph 23.2.
- 23.5 Parties may attend, make comments, present arguments and make final submissions on the evidence.
- 23.6 The procedure at the trial of the proceedings will be determined by the magistrate or assessor as he or she thinks fit.

### **24 Appearances by telephone or audio-visual link (AVL) at the trial**

- 24.1 Any application for a party or a witness to be given leave to appear by telephone or AVL at the trial must be made at the time the proceedings are listed for hearing.
- 24.2 If leave is granted for a party or a witness to appear by telephone or AVL then the party who sought leave is responsible for:
- o If relevant, booking the remote AVL facility, paying any costs associated with the use of the AVL and arranging for the attendance of the party or the witness at that facility
  - o If relevant, arranging for the party or the witness to telephone the court at the relevant time during the trial
  - o Providing the party or the witness with a copy of any affidavits or documents to which the party or the witness may be referred while giving his or her evidence.

## **PART D – SUBPOENAS AND APPLICATIONS FOR DISCLOSURE OF DOCUMENTS**

### **25 Issuing subpoenas**

- 25.1 Parties must issue subpoenas as early as possible so that documents can be produced and inspected, and be available for the proper preparation of the case, including engaging any expert witnesses.

### **26 Seeking leave to issue a subpoena**

- 26.1 Litigants in person and parties in Small Claims Division proceedings need the leave of the court to issue a subpoena (UCPR 7.3).
- 26.2 An application for leave to issue a subpoena in the Small Claims Division must be made at the pre-trial review.
- 26.3 A litigant in person may seek leave to issue a subpoena either orally before the court or by lodging the following documents with the registry:
- o A copy of the subpoena
  - o A letter setting out the reasons why leave is sought to issue the subpoena.
- 26.4 If a person is seeking leave to issue a subpoena to give evidence, the letter must explain why the subpoenaed person's evidence would be relevant. If a person is seeking leave to issue a subpoena to produce, the letter must explain why the documents would be relevant.
- 26.5 The registrar will consider the application in the absence of the public (usually within 24 hours of it being lodged) and advise the applicant of his/her decision.

### **27 Access to Subpoenaed Documents**

- 27.1 The court will make an order about who may access documents that are produced on subpoena.
- 27.2 The issuing party may propose an access order by completing the "Proposed access order" section of the Subpoena to produce with subpoena notice and declaration (form 26A) or the Subpoena to give evidence and produce with subpoena notice and declaration (form 27A).
- 27.3 If the issuing party does not propose an access order then the following default access order will apply:  
General access to all parties including photocopy access

- 27.4 Wherever possible, a subpoena to produce should seek the production of copies rather than original documents.
- 27.5 The producing party must return a copy of the subpoena with the documents or things that are produced to the court under the subpoena.
- 27.6 Where a large volume of material is produced to the court and inspection cannot conveniently be carried out in the registry, the court may order the parties to:
- o Arrange a location where the documents can be securely stored and inspected
  - o Organise and pay for the secure transportation of the documents to and from that location
  - o Inspect the documents at that location.
- 27.7 The subpoena can be stood over to another return date if:
- o Some or all of the documents or things have not been produced by the return date
  - o The producing party and the parties to the proceedings cannot agree as to the terms of an access order
  - o There is a pending application in relation to the subpoena.
- 27.8 The registrar will set a new return date if:
- o The issuing party and producing party cannot agree on the date.
  - o Neither the issuing party nor the producing party appears on the return date, the subpoena has not been complied with or fully complied with and the issuing party applies for a new date in writing within 7 days of the return date.
- The issuing party must notify all other active parties of the new return date.
- 27.9 When the court no longer requires the subpoenaed material, it will:
- o Return original material or material that is a mix of original and copied material to the producing party
  - o Securely destroy any copied material.
- 27.10 A party cannot access produced documents until the court has made an order allowing the party to access the documents.
- 27.11 The court will make access orders each day in relation to:
- o Documents and items that have been produced to the registry before the close of the business day before the return date
  - o Documents and items that are produced in court on the return date where the producing party has no objection to the proposed access order and no other party appears to object to the proposed access order.
- 27.12 Unless the court otherwise orders, an access order will be made in accordance with:
- o The proposed access order
  - o The default access order if there is no proposed access order.
- 27.13 The access order includes permission to photocopy the documents.
- 27.14 Contested subpoena applications will be listed before the registrar.

## **28 Applications for disclosure of documents**

- 28.1 The Court will not make an order for disclosure of documents (disclosure) [e.g. discovery or where there is an assertion that there has been inadequate compliance with a subpoena or a notice to produce] until the parties have served their evidence, unless there are exceptional circumstances necessitating disclosure.
- 28.2 No order for disclosure will be made unless it is necessary for the resolution of the real issues in dispute in the proceedings.
- 28.3 Unless the court otherwise orders, a notice of motion seeking an order for disclosure must be filed and served no later than 14 days after the evidence has been served.
- 28.4 Any application for an order for disclosure, consensual or otherwise, must be supported by an affidavit setting out:
- o The reason why disclosure is necessary for the resolution of the real issues in dispute in the proceedings
  - o The classes of documents in respect of which disclosure is sought
  - o The likely cost of such disclosure.
- 28.5 The court may impose a limit on the amount of recoverable costs in respect of disclosure.

## **PART E – EXPERT EVIDENCE**

### **29 Leave to adduce expert evidence**

- 29.1 No expert evidence can be adduced without leave of the court.

- 29.2 Before the parties seek leave to adduce expert evidence, they must discuss:
- o The areas in which expert evidence is required
  - o Whether they can agree on a single expert in relation to each area of expertise or they wish to retain their own expert.
- 29.3 Parties must advise the court of the result of their discussions when they seek leave to adduce expert evidence.

### **30 General Division – Single expert**

- 30.1 A single expert should be used wherever possible.
- 30.2 If the parties agree on a single expert and the court gives leave to appoint the expert then the parties must promptly engage and brief the single expert.
- 30.3 The single expert must send a copy of his or her report to each party, through their legal representatives.
- 30.4 The parties may ask the single expert to provide a supplementary report taking into account any new or omitted factual material.
- 30.5 Unless the court otherwise orders, a party may put a maximum of 10 written questions to the single expert for the purpose of clarifying matters in the report. The expert must answer the questions within 14 days.
- 30.6 Unless the parties agree or the court otherwise orders, the single expert's fees are to be paid equally by all of the parties

### **31 General Division – Joint experts' report**

- 31.1 Where parties cannot agree on a single expert, the court may give leave for each party to call their own expert witness.
- 31.2 The experts are to prepare a joint report outlining the issues in dispute and not in dispute.
- 31.3 Where a joint report is prepared then the parties should expect that the experts will give their evidence concurrently at the hearing unless the court otherwise orders.
- 31.4 Parties must serve experts' reports in accordance with UCPR 31.28.

### **32 Small Claims Division – Single expert**

- 32.1 If the court gives leave to adduce expert evidence, then the following directions are taken to have been made unless the court otherwise orders:
- o Within 14 days of leave being given to adduce expert evidence, the parties must agree on the single expert witness to be retained and obtain that expert's concurrence
  - o If the parties cannot agree on a single expert witness and obtain that expert's concurrence within 14 days, then the parties must immediately notify the court, which will then appoint a single expert.
  - o Within 14 days after the single expert witness has been selected or appointed, the parties must:
  - o Agree on how the expert is to be briefed, ensuring that the expert will be briefed with sufficient material to enable him or her to prepare a report.
  - o Brief the expert in the agreed manner.
  - o If the parties cannot agree on how the single expert witness is to be briefed, they must immediately notify the court, which will then give directions about how the single expert is to be briefed.
  - o The single expert witness must provide his or her report to the parties within 21 days on which the single expert witness was briefed.
  - o The single expert witness may be requested to provide a supplementary report that takes into account any new or omitted factual material.
  - o Any party may, subject to all just exceptions and section 177 of the Evidence Act 1995:
  - o Tender the single expert witness report/s
  - o Cross-examine the single expert witness.
  - o A single expert witness's fee for preparation of the report and any supplementary report and for attending court (if required to do so) is to be paid by the parties equally, subject to other agreement or direction and subject to any later order concerning the costs of the proceedings
  - o A single expert witness may apply to the court for directions.

### **33 Tendering expert reports at the hearing**

- 33.1 Subject to section 177 of the Evidence Act 1995, any party may:
- o Tender an single expert's report, a copy of any questions put to the single expert and the single expert's answers
  - o Cross-examine the single expert on the report.
- 33.2 A party who serves an expert's report does not have to tender it at the hearing.

- 33.3 If a party who is served with an expert's report wishes to preserve the option of tendering the expert's report in their case, the party should consider:
- o "Back serving" the report on the party who commissioned the report
  - o Whether it is necessary to take steps to have that expert witness available for cross-examination at the hearing.

## **PART F – COSTS**

### **34 Costs at the end of a trial**

- 34.1 The legal representatives must be prepared to deal with a costs argument at the end of a trial including any application for an award of costs on an indemnity basis.
- 34.2 The court may fix the amount of costs or order that the quantum of costs be as agreed or assessed.
- 34.3 To assist the court to fix the costs, the legal representatives should have available:
- o A summary of the fair and reasonable costs that will be sought if their client is successful
  - o Evidence of time spent (e.g. copies of time ledger print outs, file notes and memoranda).
- 34.4 The court will not engage in a taxing exercise (i.e. allowing or disallowing individual items on a bill of costs) when fixing an amount of costs. Instead, it will consider whether the time spent on the case was reasonable in all the circumstances.
- 34.5 If parties agree on the quantum of costs after the hearing, they can file consent orders without the need for a further attendance at court.
- 34.6 LCR Part 2 limits the costs that can be awarded at the end of a trial in the Small Claims Division.

### **35 Guideline Amounts**

- 35.1 Schedule 1 of the Legal Profession Regulation 2004 sets the costs that can be awarded for the recovery of certain debts and the enforcement of certain judgments.
- 35.2 The Local Court and the Law Society of NSW have previously developed guidelines for calculating the amount of costs that can be awarded in relatively short and straightforward matters.
- 35.3 The amount of costs that will be awarded in relatively short and straightforward matters will be calculated as follows:
- o Preparation of documents where Schedule 1 of the Legal Profession Regulation 2005 does not apply (e.g. defences, subpoenas) – drawing, typing checking, filing and service – \$29.00 (per 6 minutes)
  - o Perusals, letters, telephone calls etc – \$29.00 (per 6 minutes)
  - o Conferences (client and witnesses) – \$29.00 (per 6 minutes)
  - o Attending interlocutory hearings, preparation for trial (including preparing affidavits), attending court (including traveling and waiting time) – \$70.00 (per ¼ hour or part thereof)
  - o Disbursements – as reasonably incurred
  - o Counsel's fees – as reasonably incurred
- 35.4 Where a clerk or paralegal carries out the attendances, costs for that person should be allowed at 40% of the amount for a legal practitioner.
- 35.5 Costs will be increased to reflect future increases in the Consumer Price Index.
- 35.6 This practice note does not affect the court's power award costs on a different basis from the guideline amounts or to make orders for costs on the indemnity basis in appropriate cases.

## **PART G – MAXIMUM COSTS ORDERS IN THE GENERAL DIVISION**

- 36.1 This section applies to all proceedings (regardless of when the proceedings commenced) where the amount of the claim is \$20,000 or less and includes proceedings that are transferred from the Small Claims Division to the General Division.
- 36.2 Unless the court otherwise orders, the following orders are taken to have been made when the defence is filed in the proceedings:
- o If the plaintiff is successful and the claim is for an amount between \$10,000 and \$20,000, then the maximum costs that can be awarded to the plaintiff is 25% of the amount awarded by the court plus any amount that might be allowed in relation to costs incurred up to the filing of the first defence in the proceedings.
  - o If the defendant is successful and the claim is for an amount between \$10,000 and \$20,000, then the maximum costs that can be awarded to the defendant is 25% of the amount claimed by the plaintiff
  - o Where the proceedings were transferred from the Small Claims Division to the General Division, then the maximum costs that can be awarded to the successful party is \$2,500.
- 36.3 A party may file and serve a notice of motion and supporting affidavit seeking to vary the maximum costs order at any time up until two weeks prior to the first review date.

- 36.4 The notice of motion must specify the amount sought as an alternative maximum costs order.
- 36.5 The supporting affidavit must:
- o Explain why it is appropriate to vary the maximum costs order in light of the importance of the subject matter of the proceedings and the complexity of the proceedings
  - o Include an estimate of the costs of the party on an ordinary basis as at the date of the application
  - o Include an estimate of the costs on an ordinary basis that will be incurred between the date of the application and the completion of the trial.
  - o Not annex any bills of costs.
- 36.6 Any other party may file and serve an affidavit in response to the notice of motion. That affidavit may specify an alternative maximum costs order.
- 36.7 If any other party files and serves an affidavit then the notice of motion will be listed before the court.
- 36.8 The court may confirm or vary the amount of the maximum costs order or make such other order as is appropriate.
- 36.9 If a cross-claim has been made in the proceedings then the successful party will be entitled to a costs order as if the cross-claim had been commenced in separate proceedings.
- 36.10 The maximum costs order referred to in paragraph 35.2 does not include the costs of any notice of motion, which will be separately determined by the court at the time of the hearing of the notice of motion.

#### **PART H – PRE-JUDGMENT INTEREST**

- 37.1 Practitioners and litigants should expect that where, pursuant to section 100 (1) and (2) of the CPA, interest in respect of a pre-judgment period is to be included in a judgment, the court will have regard to the following rates, being rates agreed upon by the Discount and Interest Rate Harmonisation Committee established following a referral by the Council of Chief Justices:
- (a) In respect of the period from 1 January to 30 June in any year – the rate that is 4% above the cash rate last published by the Reserve Bank of Australia before that period commenced, and
  - (b) In respect of the period from 1 July to 31 December in any year – the rate that is 4% above the cash rate last published by the Reserve Bank of Australia before that period commenced.

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## Preliminary

### 1 Background – IPART Act

- (a) Section 11 of the *Independent Pricing and Regulatory Tribunal Act 1992* (**IPART Act**) provides IPART with a standing reference to conduct investigations and make reports to the Minister on the determination of the pricing for a government monopoly service supplied by a government agency specified in Schedule 1 of the IPART Act.
- (b) Rail Corporation New South Wales (**RailCorp**) is listed as a government agency for the purposes of Schedule 1 of the IPART Act. The services of RailCorp declared as government monopoly services under the *Independent Pricing and Regulatory Tribunal (Passenger Transport Services) Order 1998* (**Order**) are the railway passenger services supplied under the name of “CityRail” by RailCorp excluding the services supplied in accordance with the ticket known as the “SydneyPass” (**Monopoly Train Services**). Accordingly, IPART may determine the maximum prices for the Monopoly Train Services.

[**Note:** The Order applies to RailCorp by operation of clause 122, Schedule 7 of the *Transport Administration Act 1988*.]

- (c) State Transit Authority (**STA**) (but excluding any bus services provided by STA under a service contract to which section 28J of the *Passenger Transport Act 1990* (**Passenger Transport Act**) applies) is listed as a government agency for the purposes of Schedule 1 of the IPART Act. The services of STA declared as government monopoly services under the Order are the regular passenger services (within the meaning of the Passenger Transport Act) supplied by the STA but excluding the following:
- (1) services supplied in accordance with the ticket known as the “SydneyPass”;
  - (2) the bus service known as the “Airport Express”; and
  - (3) the bus service known as the “Sydney Explorer”, the bus service known as the “Bondi and Bay Explorer” and any other similar bus services operating in any other areas,  
(**STA Monopoly Services**).
- (d) The STA Monopoly Services include the ferry services in Newcastle which are provided by the Newcastle Buses and Ferries division of STA (**Stockton Ferry Services**). Accordingly, IPART may determine the maximum prices for the Stockton Ferry Services.
- (e) In making this determination, IPART has had regard to a broad range of matters, including the matters set out in section 15(1) of the IPART Act.

| Preliminary

- (f) In accordance with section 13A of the IPART Act, IPART has fixed a maximum price for the Monopoly Train Services (including those Monopoly Train Services and Stockton Ferry Services provided under Multi Modal Tickets), by fixing the maximum weighted average percentage increase across Fares.
- (g) On 6 April 2010, the Minister made the *Independent Pricing and Regulatory Tribunal (Passenger Transport Services) Amendment Order 2010 (Amendment Order)*, which excluded certain services from the scope of the Order for the term of the Amendment Order (**Excluded Services**). The Excluded Services are the transport passenger services supplied in accordance with:
  - (1) MyTrain 28-day RailPass (including concession);
  - (2) MyTrain 365-day RailPass (including concession);
  - (3) MyTrain Child Off-peak Return; and
  - (4) MyMulti Day Pass.
- (h) The clause of the Amendment Order which sets out the Excluded Services ceases to have effect:
  - (1) 12 months after the commencement of the clause; and
  - (2) on the date on which Schedule 1 of Determination No. 4, 2008 is replaced by a determination of IPART made under Part 3 of the IPART Act,whichever is later.

[Note: in accordance with clause 4 of the Preliminary section of this determination, this determination replaces Determination no.4, 2008 from the 2013 Commencement Date.]

## 2 Background – Passenger Transport Act

- (a) Under section 16AE(2) of the Passenger Transport Act, IPART is to conduct investigations and make reports to the Minister on the determination of maximum fares for Regular Ferry Services supplied under a Ferry Service Contract (**Regulated Ferry Services**).
- (b) In making this determination, IPART has had regard to a broad range of matters, including the matters set out in section 16AE(5) of the Passenger Transport Act.
- (c) Under section 28J(2) of the Passenger Transport Act, IPART is to conduct investigations and make reports to the Minister on the determination of maximum fares for Regular Bus Services supplied under a Bus Service Contract (**Regulated Bus Services**).
- (d) In making this determination, IPART has had regard to a broad range of matters, including the matters set out in section 28J(5) of the Passenger Transport Act.

### 3 Application of this determination

- (a) This determination sets out the formulae to be applied to determine maximum prices that:
  - (1) RailCorp may charge for services supplied under Monopoly Train Service Tickets; and
  - (2) RailCorp, STA and each Contract Holder may charge for services supplied under Multi Modal Tickets.
- (b) This determination commences on the later of:
  - (1) 6 January 2013; and
  - (2) the date that it is published in the NSW Government Gazette, **(2013 Commencement Date)**.
- (c) This determination applies from the 2013 Commencement Date until this determination is replaced (**Determination Period**).

### 4 Replacement of Determination No. 4, 2008

This determination replaces Determination No. 4, 2008 from the 2013 Commencement Date. The replacement does not affect anything done or omitted to be done, or rights or obligations accrued, under Determination No. 4, 2008 prior to its replacement.

### 5 Replacement of Determination No. 5, 2008

This determination replaces Determination No. 5, 2008 from the 2013 Commencement Date. The replacement does not affect anything done or omitted to be done, or rights or obligations accrued, under Determination No. 5, 2008 prior to its replacement.

### 6 Compliance with this determination

Under section 18(2) of the IPART Act:

- (a) RailCorp may not fix its Fares at a level below the maximum level permitted under clause 3 of schedule 1 of this determination; and
- (b) STA may not fix its Fares for the STA Monopoly Services provided under Multi Modal Tickets at a level below the maximum price fixed in accordance with clause 3 of schedule 1 of this determination, without the approval of the Treasurer.

## 7 Monitoring

IPART may monitor the performance of RailCorp and STA for the purposes of:

- (a) establishing, and reporting annually on, the level of compliance by RailCorp and STA with this determination; and
- (b) preparing an annual review of pricing policies in respect of the government monopoly services the subject of this determination.

## 8 Schedules

- (a) Schedule 1 and the Table in that schedule set out the formulae to be applied to determine maximum prices that:
  - (1) RailCorp may charge for services supplied under Monopoly Train Service Tickets; and
  - (2) RailCorp, STA and each Contract Holder may charge for services supplied under Multi Modal Tickets,  
by fixing the maximum weighted average percentage increase across Fares.
- (b) Schedule 2 sets out definitions and interpretation provisions used in this determination.

## Schedule 1 Maximum prices

### 1 Application

- (a) This schedule 1 sets out the formulae to be applied to determine the maximum prices that:
- (1) RailCorp may charge for services supplied under Monopoly Train Service Tickets; and
  - (2) RailCorp, STA and each Contract Holder may charge for services supplied under Multi Modal Tickets,
- by fixing the maximum weighted average percentage increase in Fares.
- (b) If:
- (1) RailCorp introduces any new Ticket Types; or
  - (2) STA or a Contract Holder introduces any new Multi Modal Tickets,
- during the Determination Period, this determination will apply to the applicable Fares in accordance with this schedule 1.
- (c) If:
- (1) RailCorp discontinues any Ticket Type; or
  - (2) STA or a Contract Holder discontinues any Multi Modal Ticket,
- during the Determination Period, this determination will apply to remaining Fares in accordance with this schedule 1.

### 2 Ticket Types

- (a) Table 1 of this schedule 1 lists the Ticket Types made available for sale as at the date of this determination.
- (b) RailCorp also offers tickets comprising of travel partly by means of the Monopoly Train Services and partly by other means of transport that are not Monopoly Train Services (including by bus or by ferry) (**Link or Intermodal Destination Tickets**), that include but are not limited to:
- (1) Blue Mountains ExplorerLink Tickets;
  - (2) Moore Park Tickets;
  - (3) Bondi Beach Tickets;
  - (4) Tramlink – Zone 1 Tickets; and
  - (5) Tramlink – Zone 2 Tickets.

Schedule 1 Maximum prices

- (c) RailCorp must ensure that the price for the Monopoly Train Service component of Link or Intermodal Destination Tickets does not exceed the maximum price for the equivalent Full Fare for a Single Ticket or Full Fare for a Return Ticket (as the case may be) fixed in accordance with this determination.

### 3 Maximum prices for Monopoly Train Service Tickets and Multi Modal Tickets

RailCorp must ensure that its Fares comply with the formulae set out below.

STA and each Contract Holder must ensure that its Fares for Multi Modal Tickets are equal to the maximum price fixed by RailCorp for the relevant Fare in accordance with this determination.

- (a) **For the 2013 Period:**

$$(1 + 3.6\%) \times \left( \sum_{i=1}^n P_{i2012} \times Q_{i2012} \right) \geq \left( \sum_{i=1}^n P_{i2013} \times Q_{i2012} \right)$$

Where:

**n** is the number of Ticket Types.

**P<sub>i2012</sub>** is the Full Fare specified in Table 1 for Ticket Type i.

**P<sub>i2013</sub>** is the Full Fare RailCorp charges for Ticket Type i during the 2013 Period.

**Q<sub>i2012</sub>** is:

- (1) subject to paragraph (2) below:
  - (A) where Ticket Type i is a Monopoly Train Service Ticket, the total number of Ticket Sales for that Ticket Type i during the most recent 12 month period (or for such other period as approved by IPART); and
  - (B) where Ticket Type i is a Multi Modal Ticket, 50% of the total number of Ticket Sales for that Ticket Type i during the most recent 12 month period (or for such other period as approved by IPART); or

- (2) if, during the 2013 Period, any of the following events occur:
- (A) a new Ticket Type is introduced;
  - (B) an existing Ticket Type is discontinued;
  - (C) there is a Fare increase or Fare decrease of a Substitutable Ticket;
  - (D) there is a change in conditions of travel for an existing Ticket Type; or
  - (E) there is not yet 12 months of data on Ticket Sales available for a Ticket Type,

a value approved by IPART for each Ticket Type.

**[Note:** For the purposes of calculating Q under subparagraph (1) above, Ticket Sales of Link or Intermodal Destination Tickets are to be treated as set out in IPART's compliance spreadsheet (as published on its website and updated from time to time).]

(b) **For the 2014 Period:**

**n** is the number of Ticket Types.

**P<sub>i2013</sub>** is the Full Fare charged for Ticket Type i during the 2013 Period.

**P<sub>i2014</sub>** is the Full Fare RailCorp charges for Ticket Type i during the 2014 Period.

**Q<sub>i2013</sub>** is:

- (1) subject to paragraph (2) below:
  - (A) where Ticket Type i is a Monopoly Train Service Ticket, the total number of Ticket Sales for that Ticket Type i during the most recent 12 month period (or for such other period as approved by IPART); and
  - (B) where Ticket Type i is a Multi Modal Ticket, 50% of the total number of Ticket Sales for that Ticket Type i during the most recent 12 month period (or for such other period as approved by IPART); or

- (2) if, during the 2014 Period, any of the following events occur:
- (A) a new Ticket Type is introduced;
  - (B) an existing Ticket Type is discontinued;
  - (C) there is a Fare increase or Fare decrease of a Substitutable Ticket;
  - (D) there is a change in conditions of travel for an existing Ticket Type; or
  - (E) there is not yet 12 months of data on Ticket Sales available for a Ticket Type,

a value approved by IPART for each Ticket Type.

**[Note:** For the purposes of calculating Q under subparagraph (1) above, Ticket Sales of Link or Intermodal Destination Tickets are to be treated as set out in IPART's compliance spreadsheet (as published on its website and updated from time to time).]

$\Delta CPI_1$  has the meaning given to that term in clause 1.2 of schedule 2 of this determination.

$CF_{2013}$  is the 2013 Catch-up Factor which:

- (1) is calculated as the Allowed Fare Revenue minus the Proposed Fare Revenue, where:

**Allowed Fare Revenue** is  $(1 + 3.6\%) \times (\sum_{i=1}^n P_{i2012} \times Q_{i2012})$

**Proposed Fare Revenue** is  $(\sum_{i=1}^n P_{i2013} \times Q_{i2012})$

**n**, **P<sub>i2012</sub>**, and **Q<sub>i2012</sub>** have the meaning given to those terms in paragraph (a) above; and

- (2) must be equal to or greater than 0.

- (c) **For the 2015 Period:**

$$(1 + 1.3\%) \times (1 + \Delta CPI_2) \times \left( \left( \sum_{i=1}^n P_{i2014} \times Q_{i2014} \right) + CF_{2014} \right) \geq \left( \sum_{i=1}^n P_{i2015} \times Q_{i2014} \right)$$

Where:

**n** is the number of Ticket Types.

**P<sub>i2014</sub>** is the Full Fare charged for Ticket Type i during the 2014 Period.

**P<sub>i2015</sub>** is the Full Fare RailCorp charges for Ticket Type i during the 2015 Period.

$Q_{i2014}$  is:

- (1) subject to paragraph (2) below:
  - (A) where Ticket Type  $i$  is a Monopoly Train Service Ticket, the total number of Ticket Sales for that Ticket Type  $i$  during the most recent 12 month period (or for such other period as approved by IPART); and
  - (B) where Ticket Type  $i$  is a Multi Modal Ticket, 50% of the total number of Ticket Sales for that Ticket Type  $i$  during the most recent 12 month period (or for such other period as approved by IPART); or
- (2) if, during the 2015 Period, any of the following events occur:
  - (A) a new Ticket Type is introduced;
  - (B) an existing Ticket Type is discontinued;
  - (C) there is a Fare increase or Fare decrease of a Substitutable Ticket;
  - (D) there is a change in conditions of travel for an existing Ticket Type; or
  - (E) there is not yet 12 months of data on Ticket Sales available for a Ticket Type,

a value approved by IPART for each Ticket Type.

[**Note:** For the purposes of calculating  $Q$  under subparagraph (1) above, Ticket Sales of Link or Intermodal Destination Tickets are to be treated as set out in IPART's compliance spreadsheet (as published on its website and updated from time to time).]

$\Delta CPI_2$  has the meaning given to that term in clause 1.2 of schedule 2 of this determination.

$CF_{2014}$  is the 2014 Catch-up Factor, which:

- (1) is calculated as the Allowed Fare Revenue minus the Proposed Fare Revenue, where:

**Allowed Fare Revenue** is  $(1 + 1.3\%) \times (1 + \Delta CPI_1) \times ((\sum_{i=1}^n P_{i2013} \times Q_{i2013}) + CF_{2013})$

**Proposed Fare Revenue** is  $(\sum_{i=1}^n P_{i2014} \times Q_{i2013})$

$\Delta CPI_1$ ,  $n$ ,  $P_{i2013}$ ,  $Q_{i2013}$ , and  $CF_{2013}$  have the meaning given to those terms in paragraph (b) above; and

- (2) must be equal to or greater than 0.

#### 4 RailCorp required to submit pricing proposal

- (a) If RailCorp proposes to, or Transport for NSW requires RailCorp to:
- (1) increase an existing Fare;
  - (2) change the conditions of travel for an existing Ticket Type;
  - (3) introduce one or more new Ticket Types; or
  - (4) discontinue one or more existing Ticket Types,
- (each a **Proposed Fare Change Event**), RailCorp (or Transport for NSW on behalf of RailCorp) must submit to IPART, in accordance with this clause 4, a pricing proposal at least 20 Business Days before the Proposed Fare Change Event takes place (or by such later date as agreed by IPART).
- (b) RailCorp (or Transport for NSW on behalf of RailCorp) is not required to submit a pricing proposal if RailCorp is proposing only to reduce an existing Fare.
- (c) Each pricing proposal submitted by RailCorp (or by Transport for NSW on behalf of RailCorp) must contain the following information:
- (1) all proposed Fares and Ticket Types;
  - (2) details of the Ticket Sales for the most recent 12 month period (or such other period approved by IPART) for each Ticket Type;
  - (3) the information required in IPART's compliance spreadsheet (as published on its website and updated from time to time);
  - (4) if a new Ticket Type is to be introduced:
    - (A) details of that proposed new Ticket Type and Fare, including:
      - (i) if the Fare is distance-based, zone-based, or time-based;
      - (ii) the number of journeys included (or, if a time-based Fare, the estimated average number of journeys likely to be taken by passengers on that Fare, and the period for which it is valid); and
      - (iii) any other conditions of travel;
    - (B) how the change is expected to impact sales of other Ticket Types; and
    - (C) the expected revenue impact of the change;
  - (5) if a Ticket Type is to be discontinued:
    - (A) details of the Ticket Type to be discontinued;
    - (B) how the change is expected to impact sales of other Ticket Types; and
    - (C) the expected revenue impact of the change; and
  - (6) any other information IPART requires to satisfy itself that RailCorp's proposed fares comply with this determination.

- (d) IPART may publish a pricing proposal submitted under this clause 4 on its website.

## 5 IPART assessment of pricing proposal

- (a) IPART will notify RailCorp and Transport for NSW if it forms the view that the pricing proposal submitted by RailCorp under clause 4 would, if implemented, result in RailCorp charging passengers Fares that exceed the maximum prices that may be charged under this determination.
- (b) IPART may publish this notice on its website.

## Schedule 2 Definitions and interpretation

### 1 Definitions

#### 1.1 General definitions

**2013 Commencement Date** means the 2013 Commencement Date as defined in clause 3(b) of the Preliminary section of this determination.

**2014 Commencement Date** means 5 January 2014 or such other date as specified by IPART.

**2015 Commencement Date** means 4 January 2015 or such other date as specified by IPART.

**2013 Period** means the period commencing on the 2013 Commencement Date and ending on the date immediately before the 2014 Commencement Date.

**2014 Period** means the period commencing on the 2014 Commencement Date and ending on the date immediately before the 2015 Commencement Date.

**2015 Period** means the period commencing on the 2015 Commencement Date and ending on the date immediately before the date that this determination is replaced.

**Adult** means a person who is aged 16 years or over, and is not entitled to a concession fare.

**Bus Service Contract** means a contract:

- (a) between a Contract Holder and Transport for NSW under Division 3 of Part 3 of the Passenger Transport Act for the provision of a Regular Bus Service; and
- (b) which authorises or otherwise permits the Contract Holder to charge passengers of the Regular Bus Service a fare for the use of the Regular Bus Service.

**Business Day** means a day other than a Saturday, a Sunday or a public holiday or bank holiday in all of New South Wales.

**Contract Holder** means:

- (a) a party to a Ferry Service Contract under which that party provides Regulated Ferry Services; or
- (b) a party to a Bus Service Contract under which that party provides Regulated Bus Services.

**Determination No. 4, 2008** means IPART's Determination No. 4, 2008 entitled 'CityRail'.

**Determination No. 5, 2008** means IPART's Determination No. 5, 2008 entitled 'TravelPass and DayTripper'.

**Determination Period** means the Determination Period defined in clause 3(c) of the Preliminary section of this determination.

**Fare** means a fare payable by any passenger (Adult or concession) for services supplied under a Monopoly Train Service Ticket or a Multi Modal Ticket, but does not include the fares payable for:

- (a) Trial Fares;
- (b) the tickets known as "Pensioner Excursion Ticket" and "Family Funday Sunday"; and
- (c) Link or Intermodal Destination Tickets.

**Ferry Service Contract** means a contract:

- (a) between a Contract Holder and Transport for NSW under Division 1A of Part 3 of the Passenger Transport Act for the provision of a Regular Ferry Service; and
- (b) which authorises or otherwise provides for the fares charged by the Contract Holder to be determined in accordance with section 16AE of the Passenger Transport Act.

**Fortnightly** means a ticket that permits unlimited journeys between the stations indicated on the ticket for a period of 14 days (or 15 days if the ticket is purchased after 3pm).

**Full Fare** means a fare payable by an Adult for services supplied under a Monopoly Train Service Ticket or a Multi Modal Ticket, but does not include the fares payable for:

- (a) Trial Fares;
- (b) the tickets known as "Pensioner Excursion Ticket" and "Family Funday Sunday"; and
- (c) Link or Intermodal Destination Tickets.

**GST** has the meaning given to that term in *A New Tax System (Goods and Services Tax) Act 1999* (Cth).

**IPART** means the Independent Pricing and Regulatory Tribunal of New South Wales established under the IPART Act.

**IPART Act** means the *Independent Pricing and Regulatory Tribunal Act 1992*.

**Link or Intermodal Destination Tickets** means the Link or Intermodal Destination Tickets as defined in clause 2(b) of schedule 1 of this determination.

**Monopoly Train Services** means the Monopoly Train Services as defined in clause 1(b) of the Preliminary section of this determination.

**Monopoly Train Service Ticket** means a ticket made available for sale, which entitles a customer to travel on a particular Monopoly Train Service.

**Monthly** means a ticket that permits unlimited journeys between the stations indicated on the ticket for a period of 28 days.

**Multi Modal Tickets** means:

- (a) MyMulti Tickets;
- (b) Newcastle Green TravelPass Tickets; and
- (c) any new ticket which:
  - (1) is introduced during the Determination Period; and
  - (2) entitles a customer to travel partly by means of the Monopoly Trains Services and partly by means of transport that are not Monopoly Train Services (including by bus or ferry); and
  - (3) is determined by IPART to be a Multi Modal Ticket,

but does not include Link or Intermodal Destination Tickets.

**MyMulti Ticket** means any of the following tickets:

- (a) a My Multi Day Pass;
- (b) a MyMulti1 Weekly;
- (c) a MyMulti2 Weekly;
- (d) a MyMulti3 Weekly;
- (e) a MyMulti1 Monthly;
- (f) a MyMulti2 Monthly;
- (g) a MyMulti3 Monthly;
- (h) a MyMulti1 Quarterly;

## Schedule 2 Definitions and interpretation

- (i) a MyMulti2 Quarterly;
- (j) a MyMulti3 Quarterly;
- (k) a MyMulti1 Yearly;
- (l) a MyMulti2 Yearly; and
- (m) a MyMulti3 Yearly,

each as described the *CityRail Passenger Fares and Coaching Rates Handbook* (as updated from time to time) available on RailCorp's website at [www.cityrail.nsw.gov.au](http://www.cityrail.nsw.gov.au).

**MyTrain1** is a distance band of up to 10 kilometres.

**MyTrain2** is a distance band of 10 kilometres to up to 20 kilometres.

**MyTrain3** is a distance band of 20 kilometres to up to 35 kilometres.

**MyTrain4** is a distance band of 35 kilometres to 65 kilometres.

**MyTrain5** is a distance band of greater than 65 kilometres.

**Newcastle Green TravelPass** means a ticket permitting unlimited travel for the period specified on the ticket on:

- (a) Monopoly Train Services within the area bounded by CityRail's Telarah, Newcastle, Toronto and Awaba stations;
- (b) STA's bus services (other than sporting bus services) within the Newcastle Suburban Area; and
- (c) the Stockton Ferry Services.

**Newcastle Suburban Area** means the area bounded by CityRail's Newcastle, Gosford, Dungog, Muswellbrook, Karuah stations and the road coach route between Fassifern and Toronto.

**Off Peak Return** means a Return Ticket where the first journey must be commenced after 9am Monday to Friday or at any time on weekends and public holidays.

**Passenger Transport Act** means the *Passenger Transport Act 1990*.

**Quarterly** means a ticket that permits unlimited journeys between the stations indicated on the ticket for a period of 90 days.

**RailCorp** means the Rail Corporation New South Wales defined in clause 1(b) of the Preliminary section of this determination, constituted under the *Transport Administration Act 1988*.

**Regular Bus Service** has the meaning given to that term in the Passenger Transport Act.

**Regular Ferry Service** has the meaning given to that term in the Passenger Transport Act.

**Regulated Bus Services** means the Regulated Bus Services defined in clause 2(c) of the Preliminary section of this determination.

**Regulated Ferry Services** means the Regulated Ferry Services defined in clause 2(a) of the Preliminary section of this determination.

**Return or Return Ticket** means a ticket permitting one journey from one CityRail station of origin to a CityRail destination station, and one journey returning to the CityRail station of origin. Both journeys must be completed on the day that the ticket is purchased or up to 4.00am on the following day.

**Single or Single Ticket** means a ticket that permits one journey from one CityRail station to another CityRail station. The journey must be completed on the day that the ticket is purchased or up to 4.00am on the following day.

**STA** means the State Transit Authority defined in clause 1(c) of the Preliminary section of this determination, constituted under the *Transport Administration Act 1988*.

**STA Monopoly Services** means the STA Monopoly Services defined in clause 1(c) of the Preliminary section of this determination.

**Stockton Ferry Services** means the Stockton Ferry Services defined in clause 1(d) of the Preliminary section of this determination.

**Substitutable Ticket** means:

- (a) a ticket for a Monopoly Train Service for which there is an alternative ticket for that same service; or
- (b) a Multi Modal Ticket for which there is an alternative ticket for the same services covered by that ticket.

**Ticket Type** means a ticket for a Monopoly Train Service or a Multi Modal Ticket (including a ticket using smart card or magnetic strip technology) made available for sale to Adult and concession passengers. For the avoidance of doubt, a Monopoly Train Service Ticket or a Multi Modal Ticket that is made available to both Adult and concession passengers will be taken to be one Ticket Type.

**Ticket Sale** means:

- (a) in the case of a paper ticket, the sale of a Monopoly Train Service Ticket or a Multi Modal Ticket through any vendor; and
- (b) in the case of an e-ticket, the use of an e-ticket for a Fare.

**Transport for NSW** means Transport for NSW as constituted under the *Transport Administration Act 1988*.

**Trial Fare** means a Fare:

- (a) that is forecast by Transport for NSW or RailCorp to contribute less than:
  - (1) 0.1% of Ticket Sales by CityRail (**Ticket Sale Threshold**); and
  - (2) 0.1% of fare revenue (**Revenue Threshold**) for RailCorp's CityRail operations,over any calendar month, and
- (b) for which there is an existing Fare for the same services covered by the Trial Fare.

A Fare will cease to be a Trial Fare if:

- (a) in any calendar month:
  - (1) the Ticket Sales for that Fare exceed the Ticket Sale Threshold; or
  - (2) the fare revenue attributable to that Fare exceeds the Revenue Threshold; or
- (b) the Fare is offered for a period of more than 12 months.

**Weekly** means a ticket that permits unlimited journeys between the stations indicated on the ticket for a period of 7 days (or 8 days if the ticket is purchased after 3pm).

**Yearly** means a ticket that permits unlimited journeys between the stations indicated on the ticket for a period of 365 days

## 1.2 Consumer Price Index

- (a) CPI means the consumer price index All Groups index number for Sydney as published by the Australian Bureau of Statistics, or if the Australian Bureau of Statistics does not or ceases to publish the index, then CPI will mean an index determined by IPART.
- (b)  $\Delta\text{CPI}_1$  and  $\Delta\text{CPI}_2$  are calculated as follows:

$$\Delta\text{CPI}_1 = \left( \frac{\text{CPI}_{\text{Sept 2013}}}{\text{CPI}_{\text{Sept 2012}}} \right) - 1$$

$$\Delta\text{CPI}_2 = \left( \frac{\text{CPI}_{\text{Sept 2014}}}{\text{CPI}_{\text{Sept 2013}}} \right) - 1$$

where the subtext (for example  $\text{Sept}_{2013}$ ) refers to the CPI for the quarter and year indicated (in the example, the September quarter for 2013).

- (b) a reference to a schedule, annexure, clause or table is a reference to a schedule, annexure, clause or table to this determination unless otherwise indicated;
- (c) words importing the singular include the plural and vice versa;
- (d) a reference to a law or statute includes regulations, rules, codes and other instruments under it and consolidations, amendments, re-enactments or replacements of them;
- (e) where a word is defined, other grammatical forms of that word have a corresponding meaning;
- (f) a reference to a day is to a calendar day;
- (g) a reference to a person includes a reference to the person's executors, administrators, successors, substitutes (including, but not limited to, persons taking by novation), replacements and assigns;
- (h) a reference to an officer includes a reference to the officer which replaces it or which substantially succeeds to its powers or functions;
- (i) a reference to a body, whether statutory or not:
  - (1) which ceases to exist; or
  - (2) whose powers or functions are transferred to another body,

is a reference to the body which replaces it or which substantially succeeds to its powers or functions.

Determination No. 7, 2012

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## Preliminary

### 1 Background

- (a) Section 28J(2) of the *Passenger Transport Act 1990* (the **Passenger Transport Act**) permits IPART to conduct investigations and make reports to the Minister on the determination of appropriate maximum fares for Regular Bus Services supplied under a Bus Service Contract.
- (b) Rural and regional bus services are Regular Bus Services which are supplied:
  - (1) under a Bus Service Contract; and
  - (2) in a Rural and Regional Contract Region, (**Rural and Regional Bus Services**).
- (c) In investigating and reporting on the maximum fares for Rural and Regional Bus Services, IPART has had regard to a broad range of matters, including the matters set out in section 28J(5) of the Passenger Transport Act.

### 2 Application of this determination

This determination:

- (a) sets the maximum fares for Rural and Regional Bus Services for the 2013 Period;
- (b) sets the formulae to be applied to determine the maximum fares for Rural and Regional Bus Services for:
  - (1) the 2014 Period;
  - (2) the 2015 Period;
  - (3) the 2016 Period; and
  - (4) the 2017 Period;
- (c) commences on the later of:
  - (1) 1 January 2013; and
  - (2) the date that it is published in the NSW Government Gazette (**2013 Commencement Date**); and
- (d) applies from the 2013 Commencement Date to the date on which this determination is replaced (**Determination Period**).

### **3 Replacement of Determination No. 3 of 2011**

This determination replaces Determination No. 3 of 2011 from the 2013 Commencement Date. The replacement does not affect anything done or omitted to be done, or rights or obligations accrued, under Determination No. 3 of 2011.

### **4 Compliance**

- (a) By section 28J(6) of the Passenger Transport Act, a Bus Service Contract is taken to include a term to the effect that a passenger must not be charged a fare exceeding the relevant maximum fare determined under section 28J of the Passenger Transport Act.
- (b) Section 28J(7) of the Passenger Transport Act provides that any contravention of the term implied by section 28J(6) in a Bus Service Contract may be remedied at law or in equity as though the term were an essential term to which the parties had by contract agreed.

### **5 Schedules**

- (a) Schedule 1 sets out:
  - (1) the maximum fares for Rural and Regional Bus Services for the 2013 Period (as specified in Table 1); and
  - (2) the formulae to be applied to determine the maximum fares for Rural and Regional Bus Services for each of the following Periods:

    - (C) the 2016 Period; and
    - (D) the 2017 Period.
- (b) Schedule 2 sets out the rounding rule.
- (c) Schedule 3 sets out the definitions and interpretation provisions.

## Schedule 1 Maximum fares for Rural and Regional Bus Services

### 1 Application

This schedule sets:

- (a) the maximum fares for Rural and Regional Bus Services for the 2013 Period; and
- (b) the formulae to be applied to determine the maximum fares for Rural and Regional Bus Services for each of the following Periods:
  - (1) the 2014 Period;
  - (2) the 2015 Period;
  - (3) the 2016 Period; and
  - (4) the 2017 Period.

### 2 Maximum fares for Rural and Regional Bus Services for the 2013 Period

The maximum fares that may be charged by Bus Operators for Rural and Regional Bus Services for the 2013 Period are set out in Table 1 in the column headed "Rounded fare".

### 3 Maximum fares for Rural and Regional Bus Services for each Period from the 2014 Period to the 2017 Period

- (a) A Bus Operator must ensure that its fares do not exceed the maximum fares determined in accordance with the formula set out in paragraph (b) below and the rule set out in paragraph (c) below for each of the following Periods:
  - (1) the 2014 Period;
  - (2) the 2015 Period;
  - (3) the 2016 Period; and
  - (4) the 2017 Period.
- (b)  $M_{s,t} = (1 + \Delta BICI_t + S_t) \times M_{s,t-1}$

Where:

$M_{s,t}$  is the maximum unrounded master fare for each Period  $t$  and each section  $s$ .

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$M_{s,t-1}$  is the maximum unrounded master fare for each Period  $t-1$  and each section  $s$ .

$s$  is each of the 220 sections specified in Table 1 of this Schedule.

$t$  is each Period of the Determination Period (from the 2014 Period to the 2017 Period).

$t-1$  is the Period immediately preceding Period  $t$ .

$\Delta BICI_t$  is the change in the Bus Industry Cost Index (BICI) for each Period  $t$  calculated in accordance with clause 4 below.

$SG_t$  is the superannuation guarantee adjustment for each Period  $t$ , which is:

- (1) for the 2014 Period, 0;
- (2) for the 2015 Period, 0.10;
- (3) for the 2016 Period, 0.10; and
- (4) for the 2017 Period, 0.19.

[Note: The formula used to calculate these amounts is set out in further detail in the Final Report accompanying this determination.]

- (c) The maximum unrounded fare for each Period  $t$  and each section  $s$  ( $M_{s,t}$ ) must be rounded in accordance with the Rounding Rule set out in Schedule 2.

#### 4 Change in the Bus Industry Cost Index (BICI)

The change in the BICI for Period  $t$  ( $\Delta BICI_t$ ) is calculated in accordance with the following formula:

$$\frac{(\sum_{j=1}^6 w_{j,t} \times I_{j,t})}{1.003} - 1$$

Where:

$t$  is each Period of the Determination Period (from the 2014 Period to the 2017 Period).

$j$  is each of the BICI Cost Items identified in the table in clause 5 below.

$w_{j,t}$  is the weight for each BICI Cost item  $j$  for each Period  $t$  calculated in accordance with clause 6 below.

$I_{j,t}$  is each inflator (specified in clause 5 below or, if the relevant data is not available, an inflator as determined by IPART) for each BICI Cost Item  $j$  for each Period  $t$ .

- (h) a reference to an officer includes a reference to the officer who replaces him or her, or who substantially succeeds to his or her powers or functions; and
- (i) a reference to a body, whether statutory or not:
  - (1) which ceases to exist; or
  - (2) whose powers or functions are transferred to another body, is a reference to the body which replaces it or which substantially succeeds to its powers or functions.

- (a) Explanatory notes, simplified outlines and worked examples do not form part of this determination, but in the case of uncertainty may be relied on for interpretation purposes.
- (b) IPART may publish a clarification notice in the NSW Government Gazette to correct any manifest error in or to clarify any part of this determination. Such a clarification notice is taken to form part of this determination.



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**Explanatory Note**

Treatment by a Chiropractor is one of the categories of medical and related treatment covered under the Workers Compensation Act 1987. This Order sets the maximum fees for which an employer is liable under the Act for treatment by a Chiropractor of an injured worker's work related injury.

Schedule A to this Order provides for maximum fees for Chiropractors generally. Schedule B to this Order provides higher maximum fee levels for WorkCover approved Chiropractors. WorkCover approved Chiropractors have participated in training courses approved or run by WorkCover.

This Order makes provision for Chiropractic Management Plans and the approval by workers compensation insurers of certain Chiropractic services. This Order makes provision for Chiropractic Management Plans and the approval by workers compensation insurers of certain Chiropractic services. Injured workers are not liable for the cost of any medical or related treatment. Employers are liable for the cost of treatment. Employers are only liable to pay the amounts for Chiropractic services set out in this order.

**Workers Compensation (Chiropractic Fees) Order 2013****1. Name of Order**

This Order is the Workers Compensation (Chiropractic Fees) Order 2013.

**2. Commencement**

This Order commences on 1 January 2013.

**3. Definitions**

In this Order:

**Case Conference** means a face-to-face meeting or teleconference with any or all of the following parties: nominated treating doctor, workplace rehabilitation provider, employer, insurer, injured worker to discuss a worker's return to work plan and/or strategies to improve a worker's capacity for work. File notes of case conferences are to be documented in the Chiropractor's records indicating discussion and outcomes. This information may be required for invoicing purposes. Discussions between treating doctors and practitioners relating to treatment are considered a normal interaction between referring doctor and practitioner and are not to be charged as a case conference item.

**Chiropractor** means a Chiropractor registered under the Health Practitioner Regulation National Law (NSW) No. 86a.

**Chiropractic Management Plan** means a document used by the Chiropractor to indicate treatment timeframes and anticipated outcomes for an injured worker to the relevant workers compensation insurer.

A Chiropractic Management Plan provides the mechanism to request approval from the relevant workers compensation insurer for treatment beyond:

- (a) the initial eight (8) consultations (when an injured worker has not attended for any previous treatment of a physical nature for this injury) or
- (b) the initial consultation/treatment (when an injured worker has attended for previous treatment of a physical nature for this injury).

A Chiropractic Management Plan can request approval for up to an additional eight (8) chiropractic consultations unless otherwise approved by the insurer.

**Chiropractic services** refer to all treatment services provided by a Chiropractor and listed in Schedules A and B.

**Complex treatment** means treatment related to complex pathology and clinical presentation including, but not limited to, extensive burns, complicated hand injuries involving multiple joints and tissues and some complex neurological conditions, spinal cord injuries, head injuries and major trauma. Provision of complex treatment requires pre-approval from the insurer. It is expected that only a small number of claimants will require treatment falling within this category.

**Group/class intervention** occurs where a Chiropractor delivers a common service to more than one person at the same time. Examples are exercise and education groups. Maximum class size is six (6) participants. A Chiropractic Management Plan is required for each worker participant.

**GST** has the same meaning as in the New Tax System (Goods and Services Tax) Act 1999 (Cth).

**Home visit** applies in cases where, due to the effects of the injuries sustained, the worker is unable to travel. The home visit must be the best and most cost-effective option allowing the Chiropractor to travel to the worker's home to deliver treatment. Provision of home treatment requires pre-approval from the insurer.

**Initial consultation and treatment** means the first session provided by the Chiropractor in respect of an injury which includes:

- history taking,
- physical assessment,
- diagnostic formulation,
- goal setting and planning treatment,
- treatment/service,
- clinical recording,
- communication with referrer, and
- preparation of a Chiropractic Management Plan when indicated.

**Normal practice** means premises in or from which a Chiropractor regularly operates a chiropractic practice and treats patients. It also includes facilities where service may be delivered on a regular or contract basis.

**Report Writing** occurs when a Chiropractor is requested by the insurer to compile a written report other than the Chiropractic Management Plan, providing details of the worker's treatment, progress and work capacity. The insurer must provide pre-approval for such a service. Payment will not be made in advance of receipt of the report.

**Standard consultation and treatment** means treatment sessions provided subsequent to the Initial consultation and includes:

- re-assessment,
- treatment/service,
- clinical recording, and
- preparation of a Chiropractic Management Plan.

**The Act** means the Workers Compensation Act 1987.

**Travel** occurs when the most appropriate clinical management of the patient requires the Chiropractor to travel away from their normal practice. Travel costs do not apply where the Chiropractor provides contracted service to facilities such as a private hospital, hydrotherapy pool, workplace or gymnasium. Where multiple patients are being treated in the same visit, it is expected that the travel charge will be divided accordingly. The insurer must provide pre-approval for such a service.

**Two distinct areas** means where two separate compensable injuries or conditions are assessed and treated and where treatment applied to one condition does not affect the symptoms of the other injury e.g. neck condition plus post fracture wrist. It does not include a condition with referred symptoms to another area.

**WorkCover** means the WorkCover Authority of New South Wales.

**WorkCover approved Chiropractor** means a Chiropractor who has, either before or after the commencement of this Order, by a date notified by WorkCover, been approved by WorkCover to provide Chiropractic services and, at the time of providing the service, has a current, active WorkCover approval number

**Work Related Activity assessment, consultation and treatment** means a one hour session provided on a one to one basis for Work Related Activity delivered to a patient that is new to the practice and includes:

- review of the previous treatment,
- assessment of current condition including functional status,
- goal setting,
- treatment/work related activity planning,
- clinical recording,
- communication with key parties, and
- preparation of a management plan when indicated.

#### 4. Application of Order

This Order applies to treatment provided on or after 1 January 2013 whether it relates to an injury received before, on or after that date.

#### 5. Maximum fees for chiropractic treatment generally

- (1) The maximum fee amount for which an employer is liable under the Act for treatment of an injured worker by a Chiropractor, being treatment of a type specified in Column 1 of Schedule A to this Order, is the corresponding amount specified in Column 2 of that Schedule.
- (2) If it is reasonably necessary for a Chiropractor to provide treatment of a type specified in any of items CHX005, CHX006, CHX071, CHX072 or CHX073 in Schedule A at the worker's home, the maximum fee amount for which an employer would otherwise be liable under the Act for that type of treatment is increased by an amount calculated at the rate per kilometre (for the number of kilometres of travel reasonably involved) specified for item CHX009 in Column 2 of Schedule A.
- (3) This clause does not apply to treatment by a WorkCover approved Chiropractor.

**6. Higher maximum fees for treatment by WorkCover approved Chiropractors**

- (1) The maximum fee amount for which an employer is liable under the Act for treatment of an injured worker by a Chiropractor, who is a WorkCover approved Chiropractor, being treatment of a type specified in Column 1 of Schedule B to this Order, is the corresponding amount specified in Column 2 of that Schedule.
- (2) If it is reasonably necessary for a Chiropractor to provide treatment of a type specified in any of items CHA005, CHA006, CHA071, CHA072 or CHA073 in Schedule B at the worker's home, the maximum fee amount for which an employer would otherwise be liable under the Act for that type of treatment is increased by an amount calculated at the rate per kilometre (for the number of kilometres of travel reasonably involved) specified for item CHA009 in Column 2 of Schedule B.

**7. Goods and Services Tax**

- (1) Chiropractic treatment services provided by a Chiropractor directly to a worker are GST free.
- (2) Case conference, report writing and travel services provided by a Chiropractor are subject to GST.

Employers are liable for the cost of treatment. Employers are only liable to pay the amounts for Counselling services set out in this order.

**Workers Compensation (Counselling Fees) Order 2013****1. Name of Order**

This order is the Workers Compensation (Counselling Fees) Order 2013.

**2. Commencement**

This Order commences on 1 January 2013.

**3. Definitions**

In this Order:

**Case Conference** means a face-to-face meeting or teleconference with any or all of the following parties – nominated treating doctor, workplace rehabilitation provider, employer, insurer, injured worker – to discuss a worker's return to work plan and/or strategies to improve a worker's capacity for work. File notes of case conferences are to be documented in the Counsellor's records indicating discussion and outcomes. This information may be required for invoicing purposes. Discussions between treating doctors and practitioners relating to treatment are considered a normal interaction between referring doctor and practitioner and are not to be charged as a case conference item.

**Counselling services** refer to all counselling services delivered by a WorkCover approved Counsellor and each service is to be billed according to Schedule A.

**Counsellor** means a WorkCover approved Counsellor.

**Group intervention** occurs where a Counsellor delivers a common service to more than one person at the same time, for example; Group Therapy. Maximum class size is six (6) participants. A Psychology/Counselling Management Plan is required for each worker.

**GST** has the same meaning as in the New Tax System (Goods and Services Tax) Act 1999 (Cth).

**Initial consultation** means the first session provided by the WorkCover approved Counsellor in respect of an injury and may include:

- history taking
- assessment
- goal setting and treatment planning
- treatment
- clinical recording
- communication with referrer and insurer.

The service is one to one for the entire session.

**Psychology/Counselling Management Plan** means the document used by the Counsellor to indicate treatment timeframe and anticipated outcomes for an injured worker to the relevant workers compensation insurer. A Psychology/Counselling Management Plan provides the mechanism to request approval from the relevant workers compensation insurer for up to six (6) consultations after the first six sessions have been provided.

**Report writing** occurs when a Counsellor is requested by the insurer to compile a written report, other than the management plan, providing details of the worker's treatment, progress and work capacity. The insurer must provide pre-approval for such a service. Payment will not be made in advance of receipt of the report.

**Standard consultation** means a session provided subsequent to the Initial consultation by the WorkCover approved Counsellor in respect of an injured worker and may include:

- reassessment

- treatment
- clinical recording and preparation of a management plan (if required).

The service is one to one for the entire session.

**The Act** means the Workers Compensation Act 1987.

**Travel** occurs when the most appropriate management of the injured worker requires the Counsellor to travel away from their normal practice. Travel costs do not apply where the Counsellor provides contracted service to facilities such as a private hospital or workplace. The insurer must provide pre-approval for such a service.

**WorkCover** means the WorkCover Authority of New South Wales.

**WorkCover approved Counsellor** means a counsellor who has, either before or after the commencement of this Order, by a date notified by WorkCover, been approved by WorkCover to provide counselling services and, at the time of providing the service, has a current, active WorkCover approval number.

#### 4. Application of Order

This Order applies to treatment provided on or after 1 January 2013, whether it relates to an injury received before, on or after that date.

#### 5. Maximum fees for Counselling services

- (1) The maximum fee amount for which an employer is liable under the Act for treatment of an injured worker by a Counsellor, being treatment of a type specified in Column 1 of Schedule A to this Order, is the corresponding amount specified in Column 2 of that Schedule.
- (2) If it is reasonably necessary for a Counsellor to provide treatment of a type specified in any of items COU002, COU003 or COU005 in Schedule A at a place other than the usual practice, the maximum fee amount for which an employer would otherwise be liable under the Act for that type of treatment is increased by an amount calculated at the rate per kilometer (for the number of kilometers of travel reasonably involved) specified for item COU006 in Column 2 of Schedule A.

Counselling services provided by a Counsellor are subject to GST.

Employers are only liable to pay the amounts for Exercise Physiology services set out in this order.

**Workers Compensation (Exercise Physiology Fees) Order 2013****1. Name of Order**

This order is the Workers Compensation (Exercise Physiology Fees) Order 2013.

**2. Commencement**

This Order commences on 1 January 2013.

**3. Definitions**

In this Order:

**Case Conference** means a face-to-face meeting or teleconference with any or all of the following parties – nominated treating doctor, workplace rehabilitation provider, employer, insurer, injured worker – to discuss a worker's return to work plan and/or strategies to improve a worker's capacity for work. File notes of case conferences are to be documented in the exercise physiologist's records indicating discussion and outcomes. This information may be required for invoicing purposes. Discussions between treating doctors and practitioners relating to treatment are considered a normal interaction between referring doctor and practitioner and are not to be charged as a case conference item.

**Exercise physiologist** means a WorkCover approved Exercise Physiologist.

**Exercise Physiology Management Plan** means the document used by the Exercise Physiologist to indicate treatment timeframe and anticipated outcomes for an injured worker to the relevant workers compensation insurer. An Exercise Physiology Management Plan provides the mechanism to request approval from the relevant workers compensation insurer for up to eight (8) consultations. If treatment is ongoing a further Exercise Physiology Management Plan must be submitted and approved before treatment can be delivered and in each such case approval can only be given for up to eight (8) consultations.

**Exercise Physiology services** refers to all services delivered by a WorkCover approved Exercise Physiologist and each service is to be billed according to Schedules A and B. Exercise Physiology services are limited to clinical exercise prescription, instruction and supervision, health education and exercise-based lifestyle and behaviour modification services.

**Group/class intervention** occurs where an Exercise Physiologist delivers the same service that is, the same exercise and instruction, to more than one person at the same time. Maximum class size is six (6) participants. An Exercise Physiology Management Plan is required for each worker.

**GST** has the same meaning as in the New Tax System (Goods and Services Tax) Act 1999 (Cth).

**Initial consultation and treatment** means the first session provided by the Exercise Physiologist in respect of an injury which is of one hour duration, provided on a one to one basis for the entire consultation and includes:

- history taking
- physical assessment
- goal setting and planning treatment
- treatment/service
- clinical recording
- communication with referrer
- preparation of a management plan when indicated.

**Normal practice** means premises in or from which an Exercise Physiologist regularly operates an exercise physiology practice and treats patients. It also includes facilities where service may be delivered on a regular or contract basis such as a hydrotherapy pool, gymnasium, private hospital or workplace.

**Reduced supervision treatment** occurs where an Exercise Physiologist delivers a service, which may or may not be the exact same exercise and instruction, to more than one person at the same time. Maximum number of persons per session is three (3), with the exercise physiologist-to-patient ratio being one-to-one for at least 30% of the session time.

**Report writing** occurs when an Exercise Physiologist is requested by the insurer to compile a written report, other than the Exercise Physiology management plan, providing details of the worker's treatment, progress and work capacity. The insurer must provide pre-approval for such a service. Payment will not be made in advance of receipt of the report.

**Standard consultation and treatment** means one-to-one treatment sessions for one hour provided subsequent to the Initial consultation and includes:

- re-assessment,
- treatment,
- recording of notes and
- preparation of a Exercise Physiology Management Plan when indicated.

**The Act** means the Workers Compensation Act 1987.

**Travel** occurs when the most appropriate management of the patient requires the Exercise Physiologist to travel away from their normal practice. Travel costs do not apply where the Exercise physiologist provides contracted service to facilities such as a private hospital, hydrotherapy pool, workplace or gymnasium. Where multiple patients are being treated in the same visit, it is expected that the travel charge will be divided accordingly. The insurer must provide pre-approval for such a service.

**WorkCover** means the WorkCover Authority of New South Wales.

**WorkCover approved Exercise Physiologist** means an Exercise Physiologist who has, either before or after the commencement of this Order, by a date notified by WorkCover, been approved by WorkCover to provide Exercise Physiology services and, at the time of providing the service, has a current, active WorkCover approval number.

#### 4. Application of Order

This Order applies to treatment provided on or after 1 January 2013, whether it relates to an injury received before, on or after that date.

#### 5. Maximum fees for exercise physiology treatment

- (1) The maximum fee amount for which an employer is liable under the Act for treatment of an injured worker by a Exercise Physiologist, being treatment of a type specified in Column 1 of Schedule A to this Order, is the corresponding amount specified in Column 2 of that Schedule.
- (2) If it is reasonably necessary for a Exercise physiologist to provide treatment of a type specified in any of items EPA001 to EPA004 in Schedule A at a place other than the usual practice, the maximum fee amount for which an employer would otherwise be liable under the Act for that type of treatment is increased by an amount calculated at the rate per kilometre (for the number of kilometres of travel reasonably involved) specified for item EPA008 in Column 2 of Schedule A.

**Workplace Injury Management and Workers Compensation (Independent Consultants) Fees Order 2013**

**1. Name of Order**

This Order is the Workplace Injury Management and Workers Compensation (Independent Consultants) Fees Order 2013.

**2. Commencement**

This Order commences on 1 January 2013.

**3. Definitions**

In this Order:

*GST* means the goods and services tax payable under the GST Law.

*GST Law* has the same meaning as in the A New Tax System (Goods and Services Tax) Act 1999 (Cth).

*Independent Consultant* means an allied health practitioner approved by WorkCover for the purposes of providing independent consultations.

*Independent Consultation* means a review of the treatment provided by an allied health practitioner in consultation with the treating allied health practitioner for the purposes of determining whether treatment is reasonably necessary and may include review of relevant documentation, discussion with the allied health practitioner, interview and examination of the injured worker and provision of a report.

*The Act* means the Workplace Injury Management and Workers Compensation Act 1998.

*WorkCover* means the WorkCover Authority of New South Wales.

**4. Application of Order**

This order only applies to Independent physiotherapy, psychology, counselling, chiropractic and osteopathy Consultants services provided on or after 1 January 2013, whether it relates to an injury received before, on or after that date.

**5. Fees for Independent Consultants**

(a) This clause applies to maximum fees, which may be charged and recovered by Independent Consultants.

(b) For the purposes of section 339 of the Act, the maximum fee for provision of services in respect of the provision of any report for use in connection with a claim for compensation or an appearance as a witness in proceedings before the Workers Compensation Commission or a court in connection with a claim for compensation is as set out in Schedule 1.

**6. Goods and Services Tax**

**Explanatory Note**

Treatment by a registered osteopath is one of the categories of medical and related treatment covered under the Workers Compensation Act 1987. This Order sets the maximum fees for which an employer is liable under the Act for treatment by an Osteopath of an injured worker's work related injury.

Schedule A to this Order provides for maximum fees for osteopaths generally. Schedule B to this Order provides higher maximum fee levels for WorkCover approved Osteopaths. WorkCover approved Osteopaths have participated in training courses approved or run by WorkCover.

This Order makes provision for Osteopathy Management Plans and the approval by workers compensation insurers of certain Osteopathy services. Injured workers are not liable for the cost of any medical or related treatment. Employers are liable for the cost of treatment. Employers are only liable to pay the amounts for Osteopathy services set out in this order.

**Workers Compensation (Osteopathy Fees) Order 2013****1. Name of Order**

This Order is the Workers Compensation (Osteopathy Fees) Order 2013.

**2. Commencement**

This Order commences on 1 January 2013.

**3. Definitions**

In this Order:

**Case Conference** means a face-to-face meeting or teleconference with any or all of the following parties -nominated treating doctor, workplace rehabilitation provider, employer, insurer, injured worker – to discuss a worker's return to work plan and/or strategies to improve a worker's capacity for work. File notes of case conferences are to be documented in the Osteopath's records indicating discussion and outcomes. This information may be required for invoicing purposes. Discussions between treating doctors and practitioners relating to treatment are considered a normal interaction between referring doctor and practitioner and are not to be charged as a case conference item.

**Complex treatment** means treatment related to complex pathology and clinical presentation including, but not limited to, extensive burns, complicated hand injuries involving multiple joints and tissues and some complex neurological conditions, spinal cord injuries, head injuries and major trauma. Provision of complex treatment requires pre-approval from the insurer. It is expected that only a small number of claimants will require treatment falling within this category.

**Group/class intervention** occurs where an Osteopath delivers a common service to more than one person at the same time. Examples are exercise and education groups. Maximum class size is six (6) participants. An Osteopathy Management Plan is required for each worker participant.

**GST** has the same meaning as in the New Tax System (Goods and Services Tax) Act 1999 (Cth).

**Home visit** applies in cases where, due to the effects of the injuries sustained, the worker is unable to travel. The home visit must be the best and most cost-effective option allowing the Osteopath to travel to the worker's home to deliver treatment. Provision of home treatment requires pre-approval from the insurer.

**Initial consultation and treatment** means the first session provided by the Osteopath in respect of an injury which includes:

- history taking,
- physical assessment,
- diagnostic formulation,
- goal setting and planning treatment,
- treatment/service,
- clinical recording,
- communication with referrer, and
- preparation of a management plan when indicated.

**Normal practice** means premises in or from which an Osteopath regularly operates an Osteopathy practice and treats patients. It also includes facilities where service may be delivered on a regular or contract basis such as a gymnasium, private hospital or workplace.

**Osteopath** means an osteopath registered under the Health Practitioner Regulation National Law (NSW) No. 86a.

**Osteopathy Management Plan** means the document used by the Osteopath to indicate treatment timeframe and anticipated outcomes for an injured worker to the relevant workers compensation insurer. An osteopathy management plan provides the mechanism to request approval from the relevant workers compensation insurer for treatment beyond:

- (a) the initial eight (8) consultations (when an injured worker has not attended for any previous treatment of a physical nature for this injury) or
- (b) the initial consultation/treatment (when an injured worker has attended for previous treatment of a physical nature for this injury).

An Osteopathy Management Plan can request approval for up to an additional eight (8) osteopathy consultations unless otherwise approved by the insurer.

**Osteopathy** refers to all treatment services provided by an Osteopath and listed in Schedules A and B.

**Report Writing** occurs when an Osteopath is requested by the insurer to compile a written report, other than the Osteopathy Management Plan, providing details of the worker's treatment, progress and work capacity. The insurer must provide pre-approval for such a service. Payment will not be made in advance of receipt of the report.

**Standard consultation and treatment** means treatment sessions provided subsequent to the Initial consultation and includes:

- re-assessment,
- intervention/treatment,
- clinical recording, and
- preparation of a Osteopathy Management Plan when indicated.

**The Act** means the Workers Compensation Act 1987.

**Travel** occurs when the most appropriate clinical management of the patient requires the osteopath to travel away from their normal practice. Travel costs do not apply where the osteopath provides contracted service to facilities such as a private hospital, workplace or gymnasium. Where multiple patients are being treated in the same visit, it is expected that the travel charge will be divided accordingly. The insurer must provide pre-approval for such a service.

**Two distinct areas** means where two (2) separate compensable injuries or conditions are assessed and treated and where treatment applied to one condition does not affect the symptoms of the other injury e.g. neck condition plus post fracture wrist. It does not include a condition with referred symptoms to another area.

**WorkCover** means the WorkCover Authority of New South Wales.

**WorkCover approved osteopath** means an Osteopath who has, either before or after the commencement of this Order, by a date notified by WorkCover, been approved by WorkCover to provide Osteopathy services and, at the time of the service, has a current, active WorkCover approval number

**Work Related Activity** assessment, consultation and treatment means a one hour session provided on a one to one basis for work related activity delivered to a patient that is new to the practice and includes:

- review of the previous treatment,
- assessment of current condition including functional status,
- goal setting,
- treatment and work related activity planning
- clinical recording,
- communication with key parties, and
- preparation of a management plan when indicated.

#### 4. Application of Order

This Order applies to treatment provided on or after 1 January 2013 whether it relates to an injury received before, on or after that date.

#### 5. Maximum fees for Osteopathy treatment generally

- (1) The maximum fee amount for which an employer is liable under the Act for treatment of an injured worker by an Osteopath, being treatment of a type specified in Column 1 of Schedule A to this Order, is the corresponding amount specified in Column 2 of that Schedule.
- (2) If it is reasonably necessary for an Osteopath to provide treatment of a type specified in any of items OSX007 to OSX011 in Schedule A at the worker's home, the maximum fee amount for which an employer would otherwise be liable under the Act for that type of treatment is increased by an amount calculated at the rate per kilometre (for the number of kilometres of travel reasonably involved) specified for item OSX014 in Column 2 of Schedule A.
- (3) This clause does not apply to treatment by a WorkCover approved Osteopath.

**6. Higher maximum fees for WorkCover approved Osteopaths**

- (1) The maximum fee amount for which an employer is liable under the Act for treatment of an injured worker by a osteopath, who is a WorkCover approved Osteopath, being treatment of a type specified in Column 1 of Schedule B to this Order, is the corresponding amount specified in Column 2 of that Schedule.
- (2) If it is reasonably necessary for a Osteopath to provide treatment of a type specified in any of items OSA007 to OSA011 in Schedule B at the worker's home, the maximum fee amount for which an employer would otherwise be liable under the Act for that type of treatment is increased by an amount calculated at the rate per kilometre (for the number of kilometres of travel reasonably involved) specified for item OSA014 in Column 2 of Schedule B.

**7. Goods and Services Tax**

- (1) Osteopathy services provided by a registered osteopath directly to the injured worker are GST free.
- (2) Case conference, report writing and travel services provided by an osteopath in relation to their treatment of a worker are subject to GST.

The home visit must be the best and most cost-effective option allowing the physiotherapist to travel to the worker's home to deliver treatment. Provision of home treatment requires pre-approval from the insurer.

**Initial consultation and treatment** means the first session provided by the physiotherapist in respect of an injury which includes:

- history taking,
- physical assessment,
- diagnostic formulation,
- goal setting and planning treatment,
- treatment/service,
- clinical recording,
- communication with referrer, and
- preparation of a management plan when indicated.

**Normal practice** means premises in or from which a physiotherapist regularly operates a physiotherapy practice and treats patients. It also includes facilities where service may be delivered on a regular or contract basis such as a hydrotherapy pool, gymnasium, private hospital or workplace.

**Physiotherapist** means a physiotherapist registered under the Health Practitioner Regulation National Law (NSW) No. 86a.

**Physiotherapy management plan** means the document used by the physiotherapist to indicate treatment timeframe and anticipated outcomes for an injured worker to the relevant workers compensation insurer. A Physiotherapy Management Plan provides the mechanism to request approval from the relevant workers compensation insurer for treatment beyond:

- (a) the initial eight (8) consultations (when an injured worker has not attended for any previous treatment of a physical nature for this injury) or
- (b) the initial consultation/treatment (when an injured worker has attended for previous treatment of a physical nature for this injury).

It does not include a condition with referred symptoms to another area.

**WorkCover** means the WorkCover Authority of New South Wales.

**WorkCover approved Physiotherapist** means a physiotherapist who has, either before or after the commencement of this Order, by a date notified by WorkCover, been approved by WorkCover to provide physiotherapy services and, at the time of providing the service, has a current, active WorkCover approval number.

**Work related activity assessment, consultation and treatment** means a one hour session provided on a one to one basis for a work related activity delivered to a patient that is new to the practice and includes:

- review of the previous treatment,
- assessment of current condition including functional status,
- goal setting,
- treatment planning/work related activity planning,
- clinical recording,
- communication with key parties, and
- preparation of a management plan when indicated.

#### 4. Application of Order

This Order applies to treatment provided on or after 1 January 2013 whether it relates to an injury received before, on or after that date.

#### 5. Maximum fees for physiotherapy treatment generally

This Order makes provision for Psychology/Counselling Management Plans and the approval by workers compensation insurers of certain Psychology services. No fees are payable for psychology treatment provided by a person who is not a WorkCover approved Psychologist.

Injured workers are not liable for the cost of any medical or related treatment. Employers are liable for the cost of treatment. Employers are only liable to pay the amounts for Psychology services set out in this order.

**Workers Compensation (Psychology Fees) Order 2013**

**1. Name of Order**

This order is the Workers Compensation (Psychology Fees) Order 2013.

**2. Commencement**

This Order commences on 1 January 2013.

**3. Definitions**

In this Order:

**Case Conference** means a face-to-face meeting or teleconference with any or all of the following parties – nominated treating doctor, workplace rehabilitation provider, employer, insurer, injured worker – to discuss a worker's return to work plan and/or strategies to improve a worker's ability to return to work. File notes of case conferences are to be documented in the Psychologists' records indicating discussion and outcomes. This information may be required for invoicing purposes. Discussions between treating doctors and practitioners relating to treatment are considered a normal interaction between referring doctor and practitioner and are not to be charged as a case conference item.

**Group intervention** occurs where a Psychologist delivers a common service to more than one person at the same time, for example; Group Therapy. Maximum class size is six (6) participants. A Psychology/Counselling Management Plan is required for each worker.

**GST** has the same meaning as in the New Tax System (Goods and Services Tax) Act 1999 (Cth).

**Initial consultation** means the first session provided by the WorkCover approved Psychologist in respect of an injury and may include:

- history taking
- assessment
- goal setting and treatment planning
- treatment
- clinical recording
- communication with referrer and insurer.

The service is one to one for the entire session.

**Psychologist** means a WorkCover approved Psychologist.

**Psychology/Counselling Management Plan** means the document used by the Psychologist to indicate treatment timeframe and anticipated outcomes for an injured worker to the relevant workers compensation insurer. A Psychology/Counselling Management Plan provides the mechanism to request approval from the relevant workers compensation insurer for up to six (6) consultations after the first six (6) sessions have been provided.

**Psychology** refers to all treatment services delivered by a WorkCover approved Psychologist and each service is to be billed according to Schedule A.

**Report writing** occurs when a Psychologist is requested by the insurer to compile a written report, other than the Management Plan, providing details of the worker's treatment, progress and work capacity. The insurer must provide pre-approval for such a service. Payment will not be made in advance of receipt of the report.

**Standard consultation** means a session provided subsequent to the Initial consultation by the WorkCover approved Psychologist in respect of an injured worker and may include:

- reassessment
- treatment
- clinical recording and preparation of a management plan (if required)

The service is one to one for the entire session.

**The Act** means the Workers Compensation Act 1987.

**Travel** occurs when the most appropriate management of the injured worker requires the Psychologist to travel away from their normal practice. Travel costs do not apply where the Psychologist provides contracted service to facilities such as a private hospital or workplace. The insurer must provide pre-approval for such a service.

**WorkCover** means the WorkCover Authority of New South Wales.

**WorkCover approved Psychologist** means a Psychologist who has, either before or after the commencement of this Order, by a date notified by WorkCover, been approved by WorkCover to provide Psychology services and, at the time the service is provided, has a current, active WorkCover approval number.

#### 4. Application of Order

This Order applies to treatment provided on or after 1 January 2013, whether it relates to an injury received before, on or after that date.

#### 5. Maximum fees for Psychology treatment

- (1) The maximum fee amount for which an employer is liable under the Act for treatment of an injured worker by a Psychologist, being treatment of a type specified in Column 1 of Schedule A to this Order, is the corresponding amount specified in Column 2 of that Schedule.
- (2) If it is reasonably necessary for a Psychologist to provide treatment of a type specified in any of items PSY001, PSY002 or PSY004 in Schedule A at a place other than the usual practice, the maximum fee amount for which an employer would otherwise be liable under the Act for that type of treatment is increased by an amount calculated at the rate per kilometre (for the number of kilometres of travel reasonably involved) specified for item PSY005 in Column 2 of Schedule A.

#### 6. Goods and Services Tax

- (1) Psychology treatment services provided by a Psychologist directly to the injured worker are GST free.
- (2) Case conference, report writing and travel services provided by a Psychologist in relation to treatment of an injured worker are subject to GST.

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**Explanatory Note**

Treatment by a “masseur” is one of the categories of medical and related treatment covered under the Workers Compensation Act 1987. For the purposes of this Order, the term masseur is interchangeable with Remedial Massage Therapist. This Order sets the maximum fees for which an employer is liable under the Act for reasonably necessary treatment by a WorkCover approved Remedial Massage Therapist of an injured worker’s work related injury.

This Order makes provision for Remedial Massage Therapy Management Plans and the approval by workers compensation insurers of certain remedial massage therapy services. Injured workers are not liable for the cost of any medical or related treatment. Employers are liable for the cost of treatment. Employers are only liable to pay the amounts for Remedial Massage Therapy services set out in this order.

**Workers Compensation (Remedial Massage Therapy Services Fees) Order 2013**

**1. Name of Order**

This Order is the Workers Compensation (Remedial Massage Therapy Services Fees) Order 2013.

**2. Commencement**

This Order commences on 1 January 2013.

**3. Definitions**

In this order:

*GST* has the same meaning as in the New Tax System (Goods and Services Tax) Act 1999 (Cth).

*Remedial Massage Therapist* means a WorkCover approved remedial massage therapist.

*Remedial Massage Therapy Management Plan* means the document used by the Remedial Massage Therapist to indicate treatment timeframe and anticipated outcomes for an injured worker to the relevant workers compensation insurer. A Remedial Massage Therapy Management Plan provides the mechanism to request approval from the relevant workers compensation insurer for treatment beyond:

- (a) the initial five (5) consultations (when an injured worker has not attended for any previous treatment of a physical nature for this injury) or
- (b) the initial consultation/treatment (when an injured worker has attended for previous treatment of a physical nature for this injury).

*A Remedial Massage Therapy Management Plan* can request approval for up to an additional five (5) consultations unless otherwise approved by the insurer.

*Remedial Massage Therapy services* refers to treatment services provided by a WorkCover approved remedial massage therapist and is limited to soft tissue massage targeting specific musculoskeletal injuries.

*The Act* means the Workers Compensation Act 1987.

*WorkCover* means the WorkCover Authority of New South Wales.

*WorkCover approved Remedial Massage Therapist* means a Remedial Massage Therapist who has, either before or after the commencement of this Order, by a date notified by WorkCover, who has, either before or after the commencement of this Order, by a date notified by WorkCover, been approved by WorkCover to provide Remedial Massage Therapy services and, at the time the service is provided, has a current, active WorkCover approval number.

**4. Application of Order**

This Order applies to treatment provided on or after 1 January 2013, whether it relates to an injury received before, on or after that date.

**5. Maximum fees for remedial massage therapy**

- (1) The maximum fee amount for which an employer is liable under the Act for treatment of an injured worker by a Remedial Massage Therapist, being treatment of a type specified in Column 1 of Schedule A to this Order, is the corresponding amount specified in Column 2 of that Schedule.
- (2) No fees are payable for remedial massage therapy provided by a person who is not a WorkCover approved Remedial Massage Therapist.

**6. Goods and Services Tax (GST)**

Remedial massage therapy services are subject to GST.

**Part 1 Preliminary**

**1. Name of Order**

This Order is the Workplace Injury Management and Workers Compensation (Injury Management Consultants Fees) Order 2013.

**2. Commencement**

This Order commences on 1 January 2013.

**3. Definitions**

In this Order:

*GST* means the goods and services tax payable under the GST Law; and

*GST Law* has the same meaning as in the A New Tax System (Goods and Services Tax) Act 1999 (Cth).

*Late attendance* means that the worker or interpreter arrives unreasonably late, to the degree that a full examination is prevented from being conducted in the time allocated.

*Injury Management Consultant* is a Medical Practitioner approved by the WorkCover Authority under section 45A of the Act to perform the functions as outlined in the WorkCover Guidelines on Injury Management Consultants (2012).

*Medical Practitioner* means a person registered under the Health Practitioner Regulation National Law (NSW) No. 86a in the medical profession, who is approved by the WorkCover Authority of New South Wales as an Injury Management Consultant under section 45A of the Act.

*The Act* means the Workplace Injury Management and Workers Compensation Act 1998.

**4. Application of Order**

This Order applies to all Injury Management Consultant services provided on or after the commencement date of this Order, whether it relates to an injury received before, on, or after that date.

**Part 2 Fees for Injury Management Consultants**

**5. Maximum Fees for Injury Management Consultants**

- a) For the purposes of section 339 of the Act, the maximum hourly fee for the provision of services by an Injury Management Consultant in connection with a claim for compensation or work injury damages is as set out in Schedule 1; and
- b) An Injury Management Consultant may not charge for more than 3 hours of work in the absence of express written agreement in advance from the relevant insurer or the Workers Compensation Commission.
- c) An Injury Management Consultant may charge a cancellation fee specified in item IIN106 where a worker provides 2 working days notice of cancellation.
- d) An Injury Management Consultant may charge a cancellation fee specified in item IIN107 where a worker provides less than 2 working days notice of cancellation, fails to attend their scheduled appointment, or the worker (or interpreter) attends unreasonably late preventing a full examination being conducted.
- e) An Injury Management Consultant's report is to be provided to the referrer within 10 working days of the examination, or in the case where no examination has been conducted, within 10 working days of the request having been received, or within a different timeframe if agreed between the parties. Payment for reports will not be made in advance of receipt of the report.
- f) The incorrect use of payment classification codes can result in penalties, including the medical provider being asked to repay monies to WorkCover that the provider has incorrectly received.

**6. Goods and Services Tax**

- (1) An amount fixed by this Order is exclusive of GST. An amount fixed by this Order may be increased by the amount of any GST payable in respect of the service to which the cost relates, and the cost so increased is taken to be the amount fixed by this Order. This clause does not permit an Injury Management Consultant to charge or recover more than the amount of GST payable in respect of the service to which the cost relates.

**Workplace Injury Management and Workers Compensation  
(Medical Examinations and Reports) Order 2013**

**Part 1 Preliminary**

**1. Name of Order**

This Order is the Workplace Injury Management and Workers Compensation (Medical Examinations and Reports) Order 2013.

**2. Commencement**

This Order commences on 1 January 2013.

**3. Definitions**

In this Order:

*The Act* means the Workplace Injury Management and Workers Compensation Act 1998;

*Approved Medical Specialist* means an Approved Medical Specialist appointed by the President of the Workers Compensation Commission conducting an examination as part of dispute resolution proceedings at the Workers Compensation Commission. Schedules 3 and 4 of this Order apply.

*File Review* means a review of the file when the practitioner is able to provide a report on the basis of a file review alone.

*GST* means the goods and services tax payable under the GST Law;

*GST Law* has the same meaning as in the A New Tax System (Goods and Services Tax) Act 1999 (Cth);

*Guidelines* mean the WorkCover Guidelines on Independent Medical Examinations and Reports current at the time;

*Late attendance* means that the worker or interpreter arrives unreasonably late, to the degree that a full examination is prevented from being conducted in the time allocated.

*Medical Examination Report* means an examination and report completed by an Independent Medical Examiner or a treating Medical Practitioner where additional information is required by either party to a current or potential dispute. For example, when there is lack of agreement regarding liability, causation, capacity for work or treatment between key parties and the Medical Practitioner is requested to provide their opinion, This does not include reports on the routine management of the worker's injury. Fees for this type of communication are included in the relevant treatment fees Order.

Medical Examination Reports may be requested to assist decision making on any part of the claim when the management reports available do not adequately address the issue. Schedules 1 and 2 of this Order apply.

Medical Examination Reports are categorised as follows:

- a. Standard Reports are reports relating solely to a single event or injury in relation to –
    - causation; or
    - capacity for work; or
    - treatment; or
    - simple permanent impairment assessment of one body system.
  - b. Moderately Complex Reports are
    - reports relating to issues involving a combination of two of the following:
      - o causation
      - o capacity for work
      - o treatment
      - o simple permanent impairment assessment of one body system
- or
- reports of simple permanent impairment assessment of two body systems or more than one injury to a single body system.

- c. Complex Reports are –
- reports relating to issues involving a combination of 3 or more of the following:
    - o causation
    - o capacity for work
    - o treatment
    - o permanent impairment assessment of one body system
  - or
  - a complex method of permanent impairment assessment on a single body system or multiple injuries involving more than one body system.

Payment for reports will not be made in advance of receipt of the report.

**Medical Practitioner** means a person registered under the Health Practitioner Regulation National Law (NSW) No. 86a in the medical profession.

**Senior Approved Medical Specialist** means a Senior Approved Medical Specialist appointed by the President of the Workers Compensation Commission under section 320 (2A) of the Act. Schedule 5 of this Order applies.

#### 4. Application of Order

This Order applies to an examination or report provided on or after the commencement date of this Order, whether it relates to an injury received before, on or after that date.

### Part 2 Fees for medical assessments

#### 5. Maximum fees for medical assessments

For the purposes of section 339 of the Act, the maximum fees for the provision of services by health service providers in connection with a claim for compensation or work injury damages is as follows:

- a. the rate of fees for a medical examination by General Practitioners as set out in Schedule 1,
- b. the rate of fees for a medical examination by Medical Specialists as set out in Schedule 2,
- c. the rate of fees for a medical examination carried out by an Approved Medical Specialist (AMS) on referral by the Workers Compensation Commission as set out in Schedule 3,
- d. the rate of fees for a medical examination carried out by an Approved Medical Specialist on an appeal panel as set out in Schedule 4.
- e. the incorrect use of medical assessments fees items can result in penalties, including the medical provider being asked to repay monies to WorkCover that the provider has incorrectly received.

#### 6. Goods and Services Tax

- (1) An amount fixed by this Order is exclusive of GST. An amount fixed by this Order may be increased by the amount of any GST payable in respect of the service to which the cost relates, and the cost so increased is taken to be the amount fixed by this Order. This clause does not permit a Medical Practitioner to charge or recover more than the amount of GST payable in respect of the service to which the cost relates.

#### 7. Payments under Schedules 1 & 2

- (1) The party requesting a report as listed in these Schedules is to either:
  - a. agree the category of report being requested with the doctor in advance and confirm the request in writing indicating that payment will be made within 10 days of receipt of a properly completed report and invoice; or
  - b. pay in accordance with a contractual arrangement between the medical practice and the referring body on receipt of a properly completed tax invoice.

The contractual arrangement cannot agree to a fee above the maximum fee prescribed in this Order.

Schedules 1 and 2 apply to reports obtained for the purpose of proving or disproving an entitlement, or the extent of an entitlement to workers compensation or work injury damages. Schedules 1 and 2 do not apply to medical or related treatment reports. Fees for those reports (which usually contain questions to assist the insurer determine prognosis for recovery and timeframes for return to work) are fixed under section 61 of the Workers Compensation Act 1987.

- (2) Fees fixed in these Schedules are recoverable only where the conditions for payment as set out in Part 3 of Schedule 6 of the Workers Compensation Regulation 2010 have been complied with.

Part 3 item 4 (which applies to a treating Medical Practitioner report) provides:

“If a claim or dispute is resolved whether before or after proceedings commenced:

Claimant

- a. nil fee payable, unless paragraph (b) applies, or
- b. fee allowed in accordance with any applicable fee Order where:
  - (i) request for report made to insurer; and

- (ii) either:
- insurer does not provide report within 14 days, or
  - report supplied by insurer does not address the report requirements of the claimant, and
- (iii) report is served on insurer.

Insurer:

- a. fee allowed in accordance with any applicable fee Order.

Part 3 item 6 (which applies to clinical notes and records), provides conditions for payment in similar terms as above for item 4, but the period of time for an insurer to provide clinical records is fixed at 7 days. In accordance with section 339 of the Workplace Injury Management and Workers Compensation Act 1998, a Medical Practitioner is not entitled to be paid or recover any fee for providing a service that exceeds the fee fixed under this Order.

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**Explanatory Note**

Treatment by a Medical Practitioner is one of the categories of medical or related treatment covered under the Workers Compensation Act 1987. This Order sets the maximum fees for which an employer is liable under the Act for treatment by a Medical Practitioner of an injured worker's work-related injury.

The effect of the Order is to prevent a Medical Practitioner from recovering from the injured worker or employer any extra charge for treatments covered by the Order.

In accordance with the Workers Compensation Legislation Amendment Act 2012, mental health treatment items AA905 and AA910 (as per the AMA List of Medical Services and Fees) require prior insurer approval. (Note: this prior approval requirement does not apply to workers exempt from the 2012 reforms: police officers, paramedics, fire fighters, volunteer bush fire fighters, emergency services volunteers, workers who make claims under the Dust Diseases Act 1942 or the Coal Insurance Act 2001).

The Order does not apply to services provided by a Specialist Surgeon.

The Order adopts the List of Medical Services and Fees published by the Australian Medical Association (AMA), except where specified in this Order. To bill an AMA item, a Medical Practitioner must be confident they have fulfilled the service requirements as specified in the item descriptor. Where a comprehensive item is used, separate items cannot be claimed for any of the individual items included in the comprehensive service.

The incorrect use of any item referred to in this Order can result in penalties, including the medical provider being asked to repay monies to WorkCover that the provider has incorrectly received.

**Workers Compensation (Medical Practitioner Fees) Order 2013**

**1. Name of Order**

This Order is the Workers Compensation (Medical Practitioner Fees) Order 2013

**2. Commencement**

This Order commences on 1 January 2013.

**3. Definitions**

In this Order:

**AMA List** means the document entitled List of Medical Services and Fees published by the Australian Medical Association and dated 1 November 2012.

**Assistant at Operation** means a Medical Practitioner, but only where an assistant's fee is allowed for in the Commonwealth Medical Benefits Schedule, or where indicated in the WorkCover Order or approved in advance by the insurer. An assistant fee may only be applicable for surgical procedures EA010 to MY115.

In accordance with NSW health policy (File No. C17061, Doc No.: PD2005\_018), assistant fees cannot be charged for WorkCover cases performed in a public hospital when the assistant is a Registrar. If the Registrar is on rotation to an approved private hospital, the relevant assistant fee may be charged. Payment of these fees is to be directed into a hospital or departmental trust fund account and the invoice should include details of this account. Workcover reserves the right to conduct an audit of assistant fee payments to ensure their proper distribution into the named trust fund.

**Certificate of Capacity** has the same meaning as in the Act.

**GST** means the goods and services tax payable under the GST Law.

**GST Law** has the same meaning as in the A New Tax System (Goods and Services Tax) Act 1999 (Cth).

**Medical Practitioner** means a person registered under the Health Practitioner Regulation National Law (NSW) No. 86a in the medical profession who is not a Specialist Surgeon.

**Out-of-hours services** only apply in an emergency where the clinic is not normally open at that time, and urgent treatment is provided. This fee is not to be utilised in the situation where a consultation is conducted within the advertised hours of a clinic.

**Specialist Surgeon** means a Medical Practitioner who holds a fellowship of the Royal Australasian College of Surgeons.

**The Act** means the Workers Compensation Act 1987.

#### 4. Application of Order

This Order applies to treatment provided on or after the commencement date of this Order, whether it relates to an injury received before, on, or after that date.

#### 5. Maximum fees for Medical Practitioners

- (1) This clause applies to medical and related treatment provided by a Medical Practitioner in respect of which a fee is specified in the AMA List, except:
  - a. Medical services identified in the AMA List by AMA numbers AC500, AC510, AC520, AC530, AC600 and AC610 (Professional Attendances by a Specialist), if these medical services are provided by a Specialist Surgeon;
  - b. Medical services identified in the AMA List by AMA Numbers EA010 to MZ705 (Surgical Operations) if these medical services are provided by a Specialist Surgeon;
  - c. Medical services identified in the AMA List by AMA Number MZ900 (Assistant Surgeon's fee);
  - d. Medical services identified in the AMA List by AMA numbers OP200, OP210 and OP220 (magnetic resonance imaging – MRI).
- (2) The maximum amount payable for magnetic resonance imaging (MRI) is:
  - \$700 for one region of the body or two contiguous regions of the body
  - \$1050 for three or more contiguous regions of the body, or two or more entirely separate regions of the body (eg. wrist and ankle).
- (3) The maximum amount payable for a Certificate of Capacity is \$22.20. This fee is payable only once per claim.
- (4) The maximum hourly rate payable to a General Practitioner is \$252.00 or \$21 per 5 minutes (plus GST). The maximum hourly rate payable to a Specialist is \$348.00 or \$29 per 5 minutes (plus GST). These rates may cover, for example, case conferences, visits to worksites and additional reports requested from treating doctors. These should be billed under the WorkCover payment classification code WCO002 and reflect the time taken (to the nearest 5 minutes) to deliver the service.

Note: No fee is payable for liaison with other health providers involved in the treatment of the injured worker (eg. specialist Medical Practitioners, allied health practitioners) unless the communication is additional to that required for the management of patients with comparable injuries/conditions that are not work related.

- (5) The maximum fee for providing copies of medical records (including Specialist's notes and reports) is \$30 (for 33 pages or less) and an additional \$1.00 per page if more than 33 pages.
- (6) Subject to subclauses (1), (2), (3), (4), (5), and clause 7 (Nil fee for certain medical services), the maximum amount for which an employer is liable under the Act for any claim for medical or related treatment to which this clause applies is the fee listed, in respect of the medical or related treatment concerned, in the AMA List.

#### 6. Specialist consultations

The initial Specialist consultation fee includes the first consultation and report to the referring General Practitioner, copied to the insurer.

The report will contain:

- a. The patient's diagnosis and present condition;
- b. The patient's capacity for work or for suitable employment;
- c. The need for treatment or additional rehabilitation; and
- d. Collateral conditions that are likely to impact on the management of the worker's condition (in accordance with privacy considerations).

In accordance with the Act, consultations with specialist medical practitioners beyond the initial consultation for the injury require prior approval by the insurer.

Additional reports requested that do not relate to the routine management of a worker's injury and are not required as part of a dispute or potential dispute should be billed under WCO002 at a rate of \$348.00/hour or \$29 per 5 minutes (plus GST) for Specialists. The hourly rate is to be pro-rated into 5 minute blocks to reflect the time taken to prepare the report. These reports may contain questions to assist the insurer determine prognosis for recovery and timeframes for return to work. If the report is requested as part of a current or potential dispute (for example, when there is lack of agreement regarding liability, causation, capacity for work or treatment between key parties and the treating medical practitioner is requested to provide their opinion), the Workplace Injury Management and Workers Compensation (Medical Examination and Reports) Order 2013 applies.

Payment will not be made in advance of receipt of any report.

#### 7. Nil fee for certain medical services

The AMA List includes items that are not relevant to medical services provided to injured workers. As such, the fee set for the following items is nil:

- a. General Practitioner – Urgent attendances after hours items (Medical services identified in the AMA List by AMA number AA007)

- b. All time based General Practitioner fees items (Medical services identified in the AMA List by AMA numbers AA190 – AA320)
- c. Enhanced primary care items (Medical services identified in the AMA List by AMA numbers AA501 – AA850)
- d. All shared health summary items (Medical services identified in the AMA List by AMA numbers AA340 – AA343)
- e. Telehealth items (Medical services identified in the AMA List by AMA numbers AA170 – AA210 and AP050 – AP105).

Note: Whilst telephone consultations with injured workers do not attract a fee, video consultations are permissible when approved in advance by the insurer. Insurers will consider if the video consultation is reasonably necessary, appropriate and likely to be effective when making a decision whether to approve these services. Video consultation treatment services are to be paid in accordance with the consultation items in this Order.

No fee is payable for cancellation or non-attendance by a worker for treatment services with a Medical Practitioner.

#### **8. Goods and Services Tax**

- (1) An amount fixed by this Order is exclusive of GST. An amount fixed by this Order may be increased by the amount of any GST payable in respect of the service to which the cost relates, and the cost so increased is taken to be the amount fixed by this Order. This clause does not permit a Medical Practitioner to charge or recover more than the amount of GST payable in respect of the service to which the cost relates.

**WORKERS COMPENSATION (ORTHOPAEDIC SURGEON FEES) ORDER 2013**

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**Explanatory Note**

Treatment by a medical practitioner who is an orthopaedic surgeon is a medical or related treatment covered under the Workers Compensation Act 1987. This Order sets the maximum fees for which an employer is liable under the Act for treatment by an orthopaedic surgeon of an injured worker's work-related injury.

The effect of the Order is to prevent an orthopaedic surgeon from recovering from the injured worker or employer any extra charge for treatments covered by the Order.

The Order adopts the items listed as Orthopaedic Procedures in the List of Medical Services and Fees published by the Australian Medical Association (AMA).

To bill an AMA item number a surgeon must be confident they have fulfilled the service requirements as specified in the item descriptor. Where a comprehensive item number is used, separate items should not be claimed for any of the individual items included in the comprehensive service.

Where only one service is rendered, only one item should be billed. Where more than one service is rendered on one occasion of service, the appropriate item for each discrete service may be billed, provided that each item fully meets the item descriptor. Where an operation comprises a combination of procedures which are commonly performed together and for which there is an AMA item that specifically describes the combination of procedures then only that item should be billed. The invoice should cover the total episode of treatment.

All surgical invoices must be accompanied by a detailed operation report clearly outlining the mechanism of injury, intra-operative findings and the procedures performed.

The incorrect use of AMA items can result in penalties, including the medical provider being asked to repay monies to WorkCover that the provider has incorrectly received.

**Workers Compensation (Orthopaedic Surgeon Fees) Order 2013**

**1. Name of Order**

This Order is the Workers Compensation (Orthopaedic Surgeon Fees) Order 2013.

**2. Commencement**

This Order commences on 1 January 2013.

**3. Definitions**

In this Order (including Schedule A):

**Aftercare visits** has the same meaning as in the AMA List and is covered by the surgical procedure fee during the first six weeks following the date of surgery or until wound healing has occurred. However, unrelated visits or incidental reasons for visits that are not regarded as routine aftercare should be explained with accounts rendered. The consulting surgeon will issue a "certificate" detailing the worker's capacity for work and anticipated after-care on discharge from hospital or after the first post injury consultation.

**Assistant at operation** means a medical practitioner, but only where an assistant's fee is allowed for in the Commonwealth Medicare Benefits Schedule, or where indicated in the WorkCover schedule or approved in advance by the insurer. An assistant fee may only be applicable for surgical procedures EA010 to MY115.

In accordance with NSW health policy (File No. C17061, Doc No.: PD2005\_018), assistant fees cannot be charged for WorkCover cases performed in a public hospital when the assistant is a registrar. If the registrar is on rotation to an approved private hospital training rotation, the relevant assistant fee may be charged. Payment of these fees is to be directed into a hospital or departmental trust fund account and the invoice should include details of this account. Workcover reserves the right to conduct an audit of assistant fee payments to ensure their proper distribution into the named trust fund.

**AMA list** means the document entitled List of Medical Services and Fees published by the Australian Medical Association and dated 1 November 2012.

**Extended initial consultation** means a consultation involving significant multiple trauma or complex "red flag" spinal conditions (systemic pathology, carcinoma, infection, fracture or nerve impingement) involving a lengthy consultation and extensive physical examination.

*GST* means the goods and services tax payable under the GST Law; and

*GST Law* has the same meaning as in the A New Tax System (Goods and Services Tax) Act 1999 of the Commonwealth.

*Initial consultation and report* covers the first consultation and the report to the referring General Practitioner and insurer.

The report will contain:

- the patient's diagnosis and present condition;
- the patient's capacity for work or for suitable employment;
- the need for treatment or additional rehabilitation; and
- collateral conditions that are likely to impact on the management of the worker's condition (in accordance with privacy considerations).

Receipt of this information and "certificates" post treatment will provide sufficient information for insurers, employers and workplace rehabilitation providers to develop management plans.

*Instrument fee* covers procedures where the surgeon supplies all the equipment or a substantial number of specialised instruments in exceptional circumstances and must be justified. This fee does not apply for all operations or if only incidental instruments (non critical) are supplied by the surgeon. Routine items such as loupes are not included.

*Medical Practitioner* means a person registered under the Health Practitioner Regulation National Law (NSW) No. 86a in the medical profession.

*Multiple operations or injuries* refers to situations that require two or more operations or for the treatment of two or more injuries carried out at the same time. The fee for the main procedure or injury is to be paid in full as per Schedule A and 75% of the charge specified in Schedule A for each additional item number or injury is payable, unless specifically listed in the Schedule as a multiple procedure item.

*Opinion on file request* includes retrieval of a file from whatever source, reading time, and reporting where a request for such an opinion has been made in writing to the orthopaedic surgeon and in accordance with privacy principles. Fees for this service will not be pre-paid in whole or part.

*Orthopaedic procedures* are those listed in the AMA list but do not include the cost of bandages, dressings, plaster of Paris bandages, splints, metallic fixation agents, and prosthetic implants which may be charged in addition to the fee set out in the Schedule A, if purchased by the surgeon. The fee for orthopaedic procedures includes aftercare visits.

*Orthopaedic Surgeon* means a Medical Practitioner who is currently a Fellow of the Australian Orthopaedic Association or who is recognised by Medicare Australia as a specialist in orthopaedic surgery. It includes an orthopaedic surgeon who is a staff member at a public hospital providing services at the hospital.

*Out of hours consultations* means call-outs to a public or private hospital or a private home for urgent cases before 8.00am or after 6:00pm. This fee is not to be utilised where a consultation is conducted for non-urgent cases outside of these hours.

*Revision surgery* refers to a procedure carried out to correct earlier surgery. Only where the revision surgery is performed by a surgeon other than the original surgeon, shall it attract a fee of 50% of the amount for the principal procedure in the initial surgery, in addition to the fee payable for the new procedure, except where the new procedure is specified as a revision procedure in the AMA list.

*Subsequent consultation* is a consultation not included in the normal aftercare that applies following surgery. The cost of the latter is included in the fee for the orthopaedic procedure.

*The Act* means the Workers Compensation Act 1987.

#### 4. Application of Order

This Order applies to treatment provided on or after the commencement date of this Order, whether it relates to an injury received before, on or after that date.

#### 5. Maximum fees for treatment by orthopaedic surgeon

- (1) The maximum fee amount for which an employer is liable under the Act for treatment of an injured worker by an Orthopaedic Surgeon, being treatment of a type specified in Column 1 of Schedule A to this Order, is the corresponding amount specified in Column 3 of that Schedule.
- (2) A fee charged by an Orthopaedic Surgeon for a patient's treatment (including the management of fractures and other conditions) will be in addition to the fee in Schedule A for the original examination and report.

#### 6. Billing items for hand surgery (Schedule B)

Schedule B provides mandatory guidelines for billing items used in hand and wrist surgery only.

Table 1 details items that are not applicable to hand surgery procedures.

Table 2 details items with restricted application for hand surgery and where clinical justification is required that they are reasonably necessary given the circumstances of the case.

#### 7. Billing items for shoulder and elbow surgery (Schedule C)

Schedule C provides mandatory guidelines that must be followed for billing items used in shoulder and elbow surgery only.

Any item number where the term “flag” is used in the Clinical Indication column highlights a potential exception that will require further justification. Should a surgeon seek an exception to the guidelines, the surgeon must provide a written explanation to support the request. Further expert medical opinion may be sought by WorkCover to assist with approving surgery requests or invoices.

## 8. GST

An amount fixed by this Order is exclusive of GST. An amount fixed by this Order may be increased by the amount of any GST payable in respect of the service to which the cost relates, and the cost so increased is taken to be the amount fixed by this Order. This clause does not permit a Medical Practitioner to charge or recover more than the amount of GST payable in respect of the service to which the cost relates.

## Additional assistance:

1. Where questions arise in individual clinical situations supply of additional information will be considered to assist in determinations.
2. In an open fracture wound that requires debridement, a 50% loading for open fracture fixation can be applied. Debridement item 30023/EA075 is not to be used when applying this loading
3. After hours loading for cases only applies when a surgeon is called back to perform a procedure(s) in isolation rather than for cases scheduled after 6.00 pm on a weekday or a routine weekend operating list.

## Requirements for claims for payment

All claims for payment will need to be accompanied by the following

1. Detailed operation record including a description of the initial injury, structures that were repaired including the anatomic location and technique of repair.
2. Usage of any of the restricted item numbers (Table 2) should be accompanied by clinical justification in order to process the claim.
3. For any proposed surgery – a list of proposed applicable item numbers will need to be provided prior to approval being given.
4. WorkCover reserves the right to insist on independent clinical assessment prior to the payment of invoices and approvals for surgical procedures.

**WORKERS COMPENSATION (SURGEON FEES) ORDER 2013**

under the

Workers Compensation Act 1987

I, Julie Newman, Chief Executive Officer of the WorkCover Authority of New South Wales, make the following Order pursuant to section 61 (2) of the Workers Compensation Act 1987.

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**Explanatory Note**

Treatment by a medical practitioner who is a surgeon is a medical or related treatment covered under the Workers Compensation Act 1987. This Order sets the maximum fees for which an employer is liable under the Act for treatment by a surgeon of an injured worker's work-related injury.

(Note: Treatment by an orthopaedic surgeon is covered by the Workers Compensation (Orthopaedic Surgeon Fees) Order 2013. However, maximum fees under this Order may apply to procedures carried out by an orthopaedic surgeon which are covered by the Workers Compensation (Orthopaedic Surgeon Fees) Order 2013).

The effect of the Order is to prevent a surgeon from recovering from the injured worker or employer any extra charge for treatments covered by the Order.

The Order adopts the items listed as Surgical Procedures in the List of Medical Services and Fees published by the Australian Medical Association (AMA).

To bill an AMA item number a surgeon must be confident they have fulfilled the service requirements as specified in the item descriptor. Where a comprehensive item number is used, separate items should not be claimed for any of the individual items included in the comprehensive service.

Where only one service is rendered, only one item should be billed. Where more than one service is rendered on one occasion of service, the appropriate item for each discrete service may be billed, provided that each item fully meets the item descriptor. Where an operation comprises a combination of procedures, which are commonly performed together, and for which there is an AMA item that specifically describes the combination of procedures, then only that item should be billed. The invoice should cover the total episode of treatment.

All surgical invoices must be accompanied by a detailed operation report clearly outlining the mechanism of injury, intra-operative findings and the procedures performed.

The incorrect use of AMA items can result in penalties, including the medical provider being asked to repay monies to WorkCover that the provider has incorrectly received.

**Workers Compensation (Surgeon Fees) Order 2013****1. Name of Order**

This Order is the Workers Compensation (Surgeon Fees) Order 2013.

**2. Commencement**

This Order commences on 1 January 2013.

**3. Definitions**

In this Order (including Schedules A, B and C):

**Aftercare visits** has the same meaning as in the AMA List and is covered by the surgical procedure fee during the first six weeks following the date of surgery or until wound healing has occurred. However unrelated visits or incidental reasons for visits that are not regarded as routine aftercare should be explained with accounts rendered. The consulting surgeon will issue a "certificate" detailing the worker's capacity for work and anticipated aftercare, on discharge from hospital or after the first post injury consultation.

**Assistant at operation** means a medical practitioner but only where an assistant's fee is allowed for in the Commonwealth Medicare Benefits Schedule, or where indicated in the WorkCover schedule or approved in advance by the insurer.

In accordance with NSW health policy (File No. C17061, Doc No.: PD2005\_018), assistant fees cannot be charged for WorkCover cases performed in a public hospital when the assistant is a registrar. If the registrar is on rotation to an approved private hospital training rotation, the relevant assistant fee may be charged. Payment of these fees is to be directed into a hospital or departmental trust fund account and the invoice should include details of this account. Workcover reserves the right to conduct an audit of assistant fee payments to ensure their proper distribution into the named trust fund.

**AMA list** means the document entitled List of Medical Services and Fees published by the Australian Medical Association and dated 1 November 2012.

**Extended initial consultation** means a consultation involving significant multiple trauma or complex “red flag” spinal conditions (systemic pathology, carcinoma, infection, fracture or nerve impingement) involving a lengthy consultation and extensive physical examination.

**GST** means the goods and services tax payable under the GST Law; and

**GST Law** has the same meaning as in the A New Tax System (Goods and Services Tax) Act 1999 of the Commonwealth.

**Initial consultation and report** covers the first consultation and the report to the referring General Practitioner and insurer.

The report will contain:

- the patient’s diagnosis and present condition;
- the patient’s capacity for work or for suitable employment;
- the need for treatment or additional rehabilitation; and
- collateral conditions that are likely to impact on the management of the worker’s condition (in accordance with privacy considerations).

Receipt of this information and “certificates” post treatment will provide sufficient information for insurers, employers and workplace rehabilitation providers to develop management plans.

**Instrument fee** covers procedures where the surgeon supplies all the equipment or a substantial number of specialised instruments in exceptional circumstances and must be justified. This fee does not apply for all operations or if only incidental instruments (non critical) are supplied by the surgeon. Routine items such as loupes are not included.

**Medical Practitioner** means a person registered under the Health Practitioner Regulation National Law (NSW) No. 86a in the medical profession.

**Multiple operations or injuries** refers to situations that require two or more operations or for the treatment of two or more injuries carried out at the same time. The fee for the main procedure or injury is to be paid in full as per Schedule A and 75% of the charge specified in Schedule A for each additional item number or injury is payable, unless specifically listed in the Schedule as a multiple procedure item.

**Opinion on file request** includes retrieval of a file from whatever source, reading time, and reporting where a request for such an opinion has been made in writing to the surgeon and in accordance with privacy principles. Fees for this service will not be pre-paid in whole or part.

**Out of hours consultations** means call-outs to a public or private hospital or a private home for urgent cases before 8.00am or after 6:00pm. This fee is not to be utilised where a consultation is conducted for non-urgent cases outside of these hours.

**Revision surgery** refers to a procedure carried out to correct earlier surgery. Only where the revision surgery is performed by a surgeon other than the original surgeon, shall it attract a fee of 50% of the amount for the principal procedure in the initial surgery, in addition to the fee payable for the new procedure, except where the new procedure is specified as a revision procedure in the AMA list.

**Surgical procedures** are those listed in the AMA list but do not include the cost of bandages, dressings, plaster of Paris bandages, splints, metallic fixation agents, and prosthetic implants which may be charged in addition to the fee set out in the Schedule A, if purchased by the surgeon. The fee for surgical procedures includes aftercare visits.

**Subsequent consultation** is a consultation not included in the normal aftercare that applies following surgery. The cost of the latter is included in the fee for the surgical procedure.

**Surgeon** means a medical practitioner who is currently a Fellow of the Royal Australasian College of Surgeons. It includes a surgeon who is a staff member at a public hospital providing services at the hospital and a surgeon who is recognised by Medicare Australia as a Specialist Surgeon.

**The Act** means the Workers Compensation Act 1987.

#### 4. Application of Order

This Order applies to treatment provided on or after the commencement date of this Order, whether it relates to an injury received before, on or after that date.

#### 5. Maximum fees for treatment by surgeon

- (1) The maximum fee amount for which an employer is liable under the Act for treatment of an injured worker by a surgeon, being treatment of a type specified in Column 1 of Schedule A to this Order, is the corresponding amount specified in Column 3 of that Schedule.
- (2) A fee charged by a Surgeon for a patient’s treatment (including the management of fractures and other conditions) will be in addition to the fee in Schedule A for the original examination and report.

#### 6. Billing items for hand surgery (Schedule B)

Schedule B provides mandatory guidelines that must be followed for billing items used in hand and wrist surgery only.

Table 1 details items that are not applicable to hand surgery procedures.

Table 2 details items with restricted application for hand surgery and where clinical justification is required that they are reasonably necessary given the circumstances of the case.

### 7. Billing items for shoulder and elbow surgery (Schedule C)

Schedule C provides mandatory guidelines that must be followed for billing items used in shoulder and elbow surgery only.

Any item number where the term “flag” is used in the “Clinical Indication” column highlights a potential exception that will require further justification. Should a surgeon seek an exception to the mandatory guidelines the surgeon must provide a written explanation to support the request. Further expert medical opinion may be sought by WorkCover to assist with approving surgery requests or invoices.

### 8. GST

An amount fixed by this Order is exclusive of GST. An amount fixed by this Order may be increased by the amount of any GST payable in respect of the service to which the cost relates, and the cost so increased is taken to be the amount fixed by this Order. This clause does not permit a Medical Practitioner to charge or recover more than the amount of GST payable in respect of the service to which the cost relates.

## Additional assistance:

1. Where questions arise in individual clinical situations supply of additional information will be considered to assist in determinations.
2. In an open fracture wound that requires debridement, a 50% loading for open fracture fixation can be applied. Debridement item 30023/EA075 is not to be used when applying this loading
3. After hours loading for cases only applies when a surgeon is called back to perform a procedure(s) in isolation rather than for cases scheduled after 6.00 pm on a weekday or a routine weekend operating list.

## Requirements for claims for payment

All claims for payment will need to be accompanied by the following

1. Detailed operation record including a description of the initial injury, structures that were repaired including the anatomic location and technique of repair.
2. Usage of any of the restricted item numbers (Table 2) should be accompanied by clinical justification in order to process the claim.
3. For any proposed surgery – a list of proposed applicable item numbers will need to be provided prior to approval being given.
4. WorkCover reserves the right to insist on independent clinical assessment prior to the payment of invoices and approvals for surgical procedures.
