



Proposed Cy-Près Scheme Relating to the Mearns Massie Endowment Fund

SECTION 9 (1) of the Charitable Trusts Act 1993 permits the application of property cy-près where the spirit of the original trust can no longer be implemented.

By his will dated 5 December 1935, William Mearns Massie ('the testator') of Dulwich Hill, bequeathed the residue of his estate to 'pay the net income thereof to the Trustees of the Presbyterian Church of Australia in the State of New South Wales in trust to apply such income in the purchase of food and clothing for the orphans in the Burnside Orphans Home (or such of them as the Governing body of the said home shall from time to time nominate) and for no other purpose..'

As at 17 May 2012, the value of the Mearns Massie Endowment Fund ('the Fund') was \$14,273.55. The NSW Trustee and Guardian ('the trustee') applied for a cy-près scheme under section 12 of the Charitable Trusts Act 1993 in respect of the Fund to permit the Funds to be transferred to the Uniting Church in Australia Property Trust (NSW) and the income used for the purchase of food and clothing for the children residing in the Burnside Homes.

As there was a charitable trust evidenced by the relief of orphans housed in Burnside Orphan Homes, and as it appeared that the original trust purposes had ceased to be suitable and effective because there are no longer any orphanages (or, it appears, any need for orphanages) in New South Wales, a cy-près scheme was ordered by the Attorney General, which took effect in June 2013.

The NSWTAG notified the Attorney General in 2014 that an additional sum of \$30,000 had been located by it, which belonged to the Mearns Massie Trust Fund. The scheme approved in respect of the sum of \$14,273.55 does not apply to this additional sum. It is therefore necessary that a further scheme be ordered to cover the additional sum.

The Solicitor General, as delegate of the Attorney General in Charitable Trusts Act 1993 matters, has determined that this is an appropriate matter in which the Attorney General should by order establish a scheme under section 12 of the Charitable Trusts Act 1993 and has accepted a recommendation that a scheme be established in relation

to the additional sum of \$30,000 in the same terms as the original sum. This scheme permits the Uniting Church in Australia Property Trust (NSW) (ARBN 134 487 095) to be appointed trustee in place of the current trustee, and that permits the application of the income of the Fund to be applied cy-près for the purchase of food and clothing for the children residing in the residential care homes operated by UnitingCare Burnside.

Take note that within one month after the publication of this notice any person may make representations or suggestions to the Attorney General in respect of the proposed scheme. Representations should be made to the Director, Justice Legal, NSW Department of Attorney General and Justice, GPO Box 6, Sydney NSW 2001.

Declaration of Significantly Contaminated Land Declaration Number 20131105; Area Number 3328

THE Environment Protection Authority (EPA) declares the following land to be significantly contaminated land under the Contaminated Land Management Act 1997 ("the Act"):

1. Land to which this declaration applies ("the site")

This declaration applies to 368 Rocky Point Road, Sans Souci (described as Lot X in DP 162302), in the local government area of Rockdale City Council. A map of the site is available for inspection at the offices of the Environment Protection Authority, 59 Goulburn Street, Sydney NSW.

2. Nature of contamination affecting the site:

The EPA has found that the site is contaminated with the following substances ("the contaminants"):

- Total Petroleum Hydrocarbons (TPH);
- Naphthalene; and
- Benzene, Toluene, Ethyl benzene and Xylenes (BTEX).

In particular the EPA has found:

- Elevated concentrations of TPH, BTEX and naphthalene compounds in groundwater on-site.
- Impacted groundwater has previously seeped into the basement car park of the adjacent residential property and may do so again if the current remedial works cease to be effective.

3. Nature of harm that the contaminant has caused:

The EPA has considered the matters in section 12 of the Act and for the following reasons has determined that the land is contaminated and that the contamination is significant enough to warrant regulation under the Act:

 Groundwater at the site is contaminated with concentrations of petroleum hydrocarbons exceeding the relevant human health guidelines. Contaminated groundwater is migrating from the site and therefore has the potential to seep into underground structures such as car park basements down gradient of the site.

4. Further action under the Act

The making of this declaration does not prevent the carrying out of voluntary management of the site and any person may submit a voluntary management proposal for the site to the EPA.

5. Submissions invited

The public may make written submissions to the EPA on:

- Whether the EPA should issue a management order in relation to the site; or
- Any other matter concerning the site.

FLUORIDATION OF PUBLIC WATER SUPPLIES ACT 1957

Direction to Add Fluorine to a Public Water Supply (Upper Lachlan Shire Council – Gunning/Dalton)

I, Dr Mary Foley, Secretary of the NSW Ministry of Health, with the advice of the Fluoridation of Public Water Supplies Advisory Committee and pursuant to section 6A of the Fluoridation of Public Water Supplies Act 1957, do hereby direct Upper Lachlan Shire Council, a water supply authority, to add fluorine to the water supply under its management and control to those areas of the Upper Lachlan local government area supplied by the proposed Gunning water treatment plant (in this direction referred to as the "Gunning/Dalton water supply").

This direction is subject to the following terms and conditions:

- Upper Lachlan Shire Council may only add fluorine to the Gunning/Dalton water supply in accordance with any provisions, directions or approvals made under the Fluoridation of Public Water Supplies Act 1957, the Code of Practice for the Fluoridation of Public Water Supplies made under that Act as amended from time to time, and the Fluoridation of Public Water Supplies Regulation 2012 or any subsequent Regulation made in its place
- 2. Upper Lachlan Shire Council shall maintain the content of fluorine in the Gunning/Dalton water supply at a target concentration level of 1.0 mg/L (ppm) with an overall accuracy of +/- 5% and within an operating range of not more than 1.5 mg/L and not less than 0.9 mg/L and generally in accordance with the relevant provisions of the Code of Practice for the Fluoridation of Public Water Supplies.
- 3. Upper Lachlan Shire Council is prohibited from adding to the Gunning/Dalton water supply fluorine in a form other than sodium silicofluoride or sodium fluoride.
- 4. Upper Lachlan Shire Council shall have commenced the upward adjustment of fluorine in the Gunning/Dalton water supply by no later than 30 June 2015, unless otherwise approved by the Chief Health Officer or that officer's approved representative.

1. Background

In 2008, the Independent Pricing and Regulatory Tribunal (IPART) was engaged to review the fees for major hazard facilities (MHFs) and recommend an equitable fee schedule sufficient to cover WorkCover NSW's reasonable costs of administering chapter 6B of the *Occupational Health and Safety Regulation 2001* (OHS Regulation). IPART recommended a fixed annual fee to cover all non-registration based costs and variable fees to cover all registration-based costs.

IPART's final report *Review of WorkCover's proposed fee schedule for regulating major hazard facilities*¹ (IPART Report) was released on 25 May 2009. The NSW Government accepted all recommendations in the report, including that WorkCover should publish annual measures of the MHF team's performance (recommendation 9), which forms the basis for this report.

Extract from IPART report – 1.3 List of recommendations (p4)

- 9 WorkCover should publish annual measures of the MHF unit's performance including:
 - statement of income and expenditure
 - outcome measures for each of the major drivers in the costing analysis used in this review to determine recommended fee levels (including number of MHFs, number of staff, revenue from base and variable fees, and labour activity analysis for those fees)
 - statistics of written objections (if any) by MHF companies to costs charged by WorkCover, or to time taken to complete work, and indications of how objections were handled.

In January 2012, the *Work Health and Safety Regulation 2011* (WHS Regulation) commenced, repealing the OHS Regulation. Chapter 9 of the WHS Regulation relates to the regulation of major hazard facilities.



4. Costing analysis

Base fees

The maximum base annual fee IPART recommended WorkCover charge to each facility for 2011/2012 was \$40,800 per facility². However, the actual amount charged was \$34,250 per facility. The reduction in the base annual fee charged to MHFs was due to two main factors:

- The actual number of provisionally registered MHFs/determined MHFs was higher than the number IPART used in the IPART report to calculate maximum fees, therefore reducing the amount charged per facility.
- The actual cost of WorkCover administering chapter 6B of the OHS Regulation (chapter 9 of the WHS Regulation as of 1 January 2012) was materially lower than IPART estimated. This was due to MHF team staffing levels being at a lower level than IPART had projected.

Variable fees

Variable fees were charged from February 2012 upon the commencement of licensing activities (formerly registration activities under occupational health and safety legislation). The rate per hour to be charged for the licensing activities recommended by IPART is \$102. The amount charged per quarter reflects the hours spent on licensing activities. See appendix A for definitions of variable fee activities.

5. Labour activity analysis

Table 5 provides a comparison of the actual labour activity hours recorded by MHF team members against the hours projected in the IPART report for 2011/12. Labour activity categories are as provided in the IPART report³ and definitions are provided in appendix A.

The main difference in MHF team actual hours and projections provided in the IPART report for assessment of provisional emergency plans, provisional security plans, safety report plans, emergency plans, security plans, and safety reports (including safety management system (SMS)) is due to changes in the MHF regulation timeline. On 26 November 2009, in response to industry concerns, WorkCover approved the extension of the due dates for submission of provisional registration and registration documents for MHFs that were provisionally registered in April 2009. Extended dates of submission were as follows:

The extensions aimed to:

- Allow staff assigned to WorkCover's MHF team from NSW Police and Fire & Rescue NSW to be appropriately involved in the provision of guidance to operators and assessment of submissions related to emergency and security arrangements. Due to delays in finalising secondment arrangements, this would not have been possible with the original deadlines.
- Allow the security plan to be based on the hazard and risk studies used to develop the safety report, rather than having it developed in isolation, and to allow development in tandem with the emergency plan, resulting in better plans and more efficient use of operators' resources.
- Help address the concerns of some stakeholders about the delay in providing guidance material and allow operators sufficient time to complete their submissions to an acceptable standard, following provision of clear and practical guidance material.
- Allow operators to obtain more assistance from WorkCover in the preparation of the above-listed submissions, leading to an acceptable standard and fewer requirements for amendments.
- Allow MHF operators sufficient time to produce quality safety reports, by maintaining the 18 month period between submission of the safety report plan and the safety report.

The projections provided in the IPART report for these activities in 2011/12 do not take into account the changes to the MHF regulation timeline and therefore are not accurate.

To promote consistency within the MHF team in tracking time against labour activities, specific definitions were developed (see appendix A).

MHF operators were due to submit safety report plans by 31 August 2010. All safety report plan assessments and written feedback provided to the operators were completed in the 2010/2011 financial year. The hours spent on safety report plan assessment in the 2011/2012 financial year reflects the time spent verifying milestones which were set following a review of the safety report plan.

MHF operators submitted provisional emergency arrangements by 31 December 2009. Reviews of two-thirds of provisional emergency arrangement submissions were completed during 2010/2011. The remaining submissions were reviewed in 2011/2012.

The IPART report projected 80 hours⁴ per provisional emergency arrangements assessment. However, the actual time taken was approximately 15 hours per review. This was due to a greater focus being placed on development of emergency plans compliant with MHF legislation, including providing feedback to MHF operators following review of emergency plans prepared under clause 174ZC of the OHS Regulation in the previous financial year.

MHF operators were due to submit provisional security arrangements by 31 March 2010. A review of over half of the provisional security arrangement submissions was completed during 2010/2011. The remaining reviews were completed in 2011/2012.

The IPART report projected 80 hours⁵ per assessment of provisional security arrangements, however the actual time taken was approximately 10 hours per review. This was due to a greater focus being placed on the development of security plans, including site visits to MHFs to provide feedback to MHF operators on provisional security arrangement submissions and comprehensive reports detailing areas for improvement, to assist with development of security plans in the previous financial year.

Applications to register were due by 28 February 2012 from 38 MHF operators. One MHF operator was due to submit their application to register by 1 July 2012, however this application was received on 28 June 2012. These applications included a safety report (including SMS), emergency plan and a security plan. The transitional arrangements of the WHS Regulation, which commenced in January 2012, provided that these submissions were considered to be applications for an MHF licence and the safety report was considered to be a safety case under the new regulation.

From the time of the submission until the end of the 2011/2012 financial year, the MHF team completed 23 per cent of the serious deficiency checks of the safety cases and provided written responses to the operators. The aim of the serious deficiency check was to ensure that all components of the safety case were provided before commencing a detailed assessment of the safety case. The IPART report projected 634 hours per safety case assessment. By the end of the financial year, it was not possible to determine the total hours per assessment as no detailed assessment on the safety case had occurred.

The introduction of the WHS Regulation had a significant impact on the assessment of the MHF licence applications. The WHS Regulation requires WorkCover to either make a licensing decision or request further information within six months of the receipt of the application (or additional information), otherwise the application is considered to be refused⁷. Therefore, this required that the 38 operators whose submissions were due on 28 February 2012 were to be given a response by 28 August 2012 as to the outcome of their application or to request further information. As previously stated, no detailed assessments of the safety case were completed by the end of the financial year and all responses were requests for further information to meet the requirements of the regulation.

Post-registration (or post-licence) oversight will commence following the licensing of MHFs, hence nil labour activity hours were recorded by the MHF team.

The labour activity notification included evaluation of new notifications submitted by MHFs, non-MHFs and proposed facilities. Nine notifications were received during 2011/2012. Notifications included changes of operator, increases or decreases of schedule 8 materials and/or schedule 15 chemicals and new facilities. The IPART report projected 21 hours per notification review⁸. The time spent on reviewing each notification, however, differed depending on the type of notification. On average, it took the MHF team seven hours per notification review.

Other activities undertaken by the MHF team which had a significant advice and support component included:

- provision of information through the MHF consultative committee meetings
- reminders to MHF operators of their responsibilities eg due date and requirements for MHF licence application submissions
- provision of general MHF information to operators of MHFs and other facilities, MHF consultative committee and internal WorkCover staff eg MHF team newsletter, information on work health and safety legislation, assisting other WorkCover teams' improvement programs involving MHFs
- responses to MHF queries from regulators in other jurisdictions eg fee queries
- internal presentation on MHFs to industry reference groups
- attendance at industry and community meetings eg Botany Industrial Park community consultative committee
- reviewing and providing comment on the model work health and safety legislation
- providing technical assistance to incident investigations
- providing comments related to development proposals for MHFs.

The actual time allocated to guidance material development is greater than that projected in the IPART report. This is due to the significant amount of time required by the MHF team to assist in drafting MHF guidance material in line with other jurisdictions to support the WHS Regulation, which commenced in January 2012, and updating the guidance material once the work health and safety legislation came into effect.

The time recorded against research and development is approximately 15 per cent of that projected in the IPART report. This may be explained by the need to prioritise work towards completing individual site assessments during the period of initial site safety report submissions. The time recorded against technical skills development is less than that projected. This may be due to the assessment of the MHF licence application submissions. Some of the earlier time spent assessing the safety cases was recorded against technical skill development.

The time recorded against non-chargeable work is greater than that projected by the IPART report. This is largely due to a significant amount of time being spent by MHF team members providing input into drafting legislation and related nationally harmonised policies, procedures and transitional arrangements, and attending meetings and workshops for MHF regulators. Once the work health and safety legislation came into effect, a large amount of time was spent providing advice to facilities on the new legislation and updating and creating policies, procedures and guidance materials in accordance with the new legislation. Other indicative activities in this category include:

- development of internal assessment and acceptance criteria for the review of safety reports/safety cases, emergency plans and security plans
- development and publication of a registration form
- updating the notification form in line with the WHS Regulation
- reviewing national guidance material
- executive submissions on MHF related matters
- requests for legal advice
- recruitment activities for the MHF team and seconded interagency staff
- office relocation
- administrative requirements eg budgeting, reporting and planning activities.

The MHF team also carried the MHF verification program in 2011/2012. This major project involved site visits to all MHFs in NSW and focused on the handling of chemicals under chapter 6 and chapter 6A of the OHS Regulation.

When comparing MHF team actual total hours to the projections provided in the IPART report, the difference can be explained by the staffing levels. At the start of the financial year, the MHF team had 8.7 FTE staff, which increased to 9.7 FTE by the end of the year. In the IPART report, the projected labour activity hours are calculated based on 15 FTE9. The difference in FTE provides an explanation as to why the total actual time for 2011/2012 is approximately 65 per cent of that projected in the IPART report.

Statistics of written objections (if any) to costs charged or to time taken to 6. complete work and indications of how objections were handled

Written objections received in 2011/2012 include:

- objections to costs charged by WorkCover:
- objections to time taken to complete work: nil.

The two objections to costs charged by WorkCover were received in relation to the base fee charged in 2011/2012. Both objections were responded to with both companies being advised that base fees are chargeable to all facilities that were provisionally registered MHFs during the financial year for which fees are charged.

Appendix A: Base and variable fee activities

1. Base fee activities

Base fees are charged annually to provisionally registered or registered MHFs and cover all non-registration based costs. The annual base fee is only charged to MHFs, however the base fee activities relate to any facility registered in the MHF database ie who submitted a MHF notification form, regardless of their status.

Base fee activities are the non-registration activities accounted for in the base fee charged annually (based on the IPART report)¹⁰.

There are two groupings of base fee activities – general and facility-related. The following are definitions of the activities.

Variable fee activities 2.

Clause 175P of the OHS Regulation required operators of MHFs in NSW to submit the following documents to WorkCover during the registration stage:

- Application for registration
- Security plan
- Emergency plan
- Safety report (including SMS information).

These documents are now required under clause 560 of the WHS Regulation in order to apply for a MHF licence.

The IPART report lists assessment of these registration documents as activities for which costs are to be recovered by the variable fee.

Extract from IPART report, page 39:

The following costs are to be recovered by the recommended variable fee:

- Fit and proper person assessment.
- Emergency plan assessment.
- Security plan assessment.
- Safety management system assessment.
- Safety report assessment⁶⁴

MHFs operators are charged variable fees quarterly. The amount will be calculated based on the time spent on licence activities for their facility. Table 3 includes definitions of the activities.
