#### **Public Health Act 2010**

#### **Order under Section 11**

### Power to close public premises on public health grounds

- I, Dr Kerry Chant, Chief Health Officer, and delegate of the Secretary of the Ministry of Health, consider that access to Jasmins1 Lebanese Restaurant Liverpool, at 375 Macquarie St Liverpool 2170 (the Premises), being premises on which the public, or sections of the public, are required, permitted or accustomed to congregate should be restricted or prohibited in order to protect public health as:
  - 1) COVID-19 is a potentially fatal and highly contagious condition;
  - NSW has put in place a number of restrictions and requirements to respond to the COVID-19 pandemic in order to protect the public and minimise the risk of spread of COVID-19 in the community;
  - 3) The Premises has not been complying with public health restrictions and requirements that apply to the Premises;
  - 4) The risk to the public's health arising from this lack of compliance is sufficient to warrant the closure of the premises in order to protect public health.

In such circumstances, I direct that:

1. The Premises are to be closed to the public until such time as this order is revoked.

#### Notes:

- 1) If the above premises are not under the control of a Minister, any person who
  - (a) controls, or is involved in the control of, the premises, and
  - (b) has notice of the direction,

must take such reasonably practicable action as is necessary to comply with the direction.

- **2)** A person who is subject to a direction under section 11 and who has notice of the direction and who fails to comply with the direction is guilty of an offence and is liable to imprisonment for 6 months and/or 100 penalty unit fine plus a further 50 penalty units each day the offence continues.
- **3)** This order will be published in the Gazette as soon as practicable after it is made. However, a failure to do so does not invalidate the order.
