ACTS OF PARLIAMENT ASSENTED TO
Legislative Assembly Office, Sydney 24 May 2021

It is hereby notified, for general information, that Her Excellency the Governor, has, in the name and on behalf of Her Majesty, this day assented to the under mentioned Acts passed by the Legislative Assembly and Legislative Council of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, viz.:

Act No. 10 — An Act to amend the Real Property Act 1900 in relation to certificates of title and electronic conveyancing; and for related purposes. **[Real Property Amendment (Certificates of Title) Bill]**

Act No. 11 — An Act to amend the Local Government Act 1993 to give effect to certain recommendations made by the Independent Pricing and Regulatory Tribunal and make other amendments concerning the local government rating system; to make further provision about local government elections and certain terms of office and about council area amalgamations; to provide for superannuation contributions for councillors; and for related purposes. **[Local Government Amendment Bill]**

Act No. 12 — An Act to amend the Payroll Tax Act 2007 to exempt employers from liability to pay payroll tax on wages that are the subject of Jobs Plus agreements, and to extend an exemption in relation to the Aged Care Workforce Retention Grant Opportunity program of the Commonwealth. **[Payroll Tax Amendment (Jobs Plus) Bill]**
