Energy Supply Emergency Order 2022

under the

Energy and Utilities Administration Act 1987

I, the Premier, make the following Order under the *Energy and Utilities Administration Act 1987*, section 24.

Explanatory note

The object of this Order is to declare an energy supply emergency in relation to the supply of gas to the part of the State comprising the local government areas of—

- (a) Bathurst Regional, and
- (b) City of Lithgow, and
- (c) Oberon.

This Order is made under the *Energy and Utilities Administration Act 1987*, section 24.

Energy Supply Emergency Order 2022

Energy and Utilities Administration Act 1987

1 Name of Order

This Order is the *Energy Supply Emergency Order 2022*.

2 Commencement

This Order commences on the day on which it is made by the Premier.

3 Definitions

In this Order—

affected area means the part of the State comprising the local government areas of—

- (a) Bathurst Regional, and
- (b) City of Lithgow, and
- (c) Oberon.

the Act means the *Energy and Utilities Administration Act 1987*.

Note. The Act and the *Interpretation Act 1987* contain definitions and other provisions that affect the interpretation and application of this Order.

4 Grounds for declaration—the Act, s 24(1)(a) and (b)

The Premier is satisfied that the supply of gas to the affected area—

- (a) is disrupted to a significant degree, or
- (b) is at risk of disruption to a significant degree.

5 Declaration of energy supply emergency—the Act, s 24(1)(a) and (b)

For the purposes of the Act, section 24(1)(a) and (b), an energy supply emergency is declared in relation to the supply of gas to the affected area.

6 Duration of order

This order continues in force for 42 days from the day on which it commences, unless sooner revoked.
