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NATIONAL PARKS AND WILDLIFE ACT 1974

The Island (Poonyea) Aboriginal Reserve Aboriginal Place

Pursuant to s.84 of the *National Parks and Wildlife Act 1974*, I, the Minister for Environment and Heritage, being of the opinion that the place known as The Island (Poonyea) Aboriginal Reserve is, and was, of special significance to Aboriginal culture, declare the lands described in schedule "A" as an Aboriginal Place.


The values for which The Island (Poonyea) Aboriginal Reserve Aboriginal Place has been assessed as being significant to Aboriginal culture include, but are not limited to, its significance to the Traditional Owners and to their connected families and communities as the location of an Aboriginal Reserve, as the resting place of their ancestors, as an early example of Aboriginal enterprise and post invasion self-sufficiency and for its association with maintaining cultural connections, contemporary values and oral histories.

NATIONAL PARKS AND WILDLIFE ACT 1974

North Hill, Armidale Aboriginal Place

Pursuant to s.84 of the *National Parks and Wildlife Act 1974*, I, the Minister administering this Act, being of the opinion that the place known as North Hill, Armidale is, and was, of special significance to Aboriginal culture, declare the lands described in schedule "A" as an Aboriginal Place.

The values for which the North Hill Aboriginal Place has been assessed as being significant to Aboriginal culture include, but are not limited to, significance as an Aboriginal living place, with a long history as a traditional campsite continuing in its location, in the post-contact period up until the 1950s.

It is important as one of three traditional signal hill sites around Armidale used for communication between the Anaiwan clans. North Hill was an important meeting place, evidenced by the many song lines that extend to and from the place.

North Hill, as part of the broader Armidale region was known as a ceremonial location for Dunghatti people and was one of the sites used by Gumbaynggirr elder from Oban known as King Bobby.

The elevated location of the Lookout area with high visibility of the surrounding landscape, the natural spring providing fresh water and the former swamps of the Dumaresq Creeklands, as an abundant food source, all contribute to the special significance of the North Hill as a living place.

Further archaeological assessment has potential to reveal information on the Aboriginal occupation of North Hill and contribute to an understanding of the patterns of Aboriginal occupation of the New England Tablelands, in traditional and later phases.




