ANGLICAN CHURCH OF AUSTRALIA TRUST PROPERTY ACT 1917 - Notice under section 42 of the Anglican Church of Australia Trust Property Act 1917

SUBORDINATE LEGISLATION ACT 1989

Proposed Children and Young Persons (Care and Protection) Regulation 2022

Notice is given in accordance with section 5 of the *Subordinate Legislation Act 1989* of the intention to make the proposed Children and Young Persons (Care and Protection) Regulation 2022 (the proposed Regulation).

The proposed Regulation will remake, with some amendments, the Children and Young Persons (Care and Protection) Regulation 2012, which is due for repeal on 1 September 2022.

The proposed Regulation aims to give full and proper effect to the *Children and Young Persons (Care and Protection) Act 1998* and help secure the policy objectives of the Act by providing the necessary legislative support and administrative detail as required or permitted to be prescribed by regulation under the Act.
