The object of this Order is to amend the *Public Health (COVID-19 Self-Isolation) Order (No 2) 2022* to reduce the period during which certain household contacts of a person diagnosed with COVID-19 are exempt from the requirement to self-isolate.

#### 1 Name of Order

This Order is the Public Health (COVID-19 Self-Isolation) Order (No 2) Amendment (No 1) Order 2022.

#### 2 Commencement

This Order commences at the beginning of 12 July 2022.
