NATIONAL PARKS AND WILDLIFE ACT 1974

Goodooga Tin Camp & Cemeteries Aboriginal Place

Pursuant to section 84 of the *National Parks and Wildlife Act 1974*, I, the Minister for Environment and Heritage, being of the opinion that the place known as Goodooga Tin Camp & Cemeteries is, and was, of special significance to Aboriginal culture, declare the lands described in schedule "A" as an Aboriginal Place.

The values for which the Goodooga Tin Camp & Cemeteries Aboriginal Place has been assessed as being significant to Aboriginal culture include, but are not limited to, the tin hut architecture and the continuity of the cultural practice illustrated by people still living in and making tin huts at the Goodooga Tin Camp. The tin architecture in Goodooga Tin Camp is well documented and is of historic and cultural significance to Aboriginal people.

Three Goodooga Aboriginal cemeteries, dating from the mid 1930's, are recognised by the local community as special places that contain ancestors and family members of the Goodooga community, and display use of glass bottles to outline the graves, a feature which is distinctive to the area. Some graves have gidgee or iron posts and rail or wire reflecting the skills Aboriginal people had in fencing. Many graves have items belonging to the person placed on the grave or on the posts reflecting the traditional practice of burying personal items with the deceased.



All works and activities (including but not limited to subdivision, strata subdivision and development) which are proposed in accordance with:

- a) A valid development consent in force at the date of gazettal for listing the Corrimal Coke Works Site on the State Heritage Register under the Heritage Act 1977 (NSW), or
- b) The draft Planning Proposal for 27 Railway Street, Corrimal endorsed by Wollongong City Council on 1 November 2021, as finalised by the Minister for Planning and gazetted as an amendment to the Wollongong LEP 2009.

- c) Draft (DCP) Chapter D19: Former Corrimal Coke Works Site, as adopted by Wollongong City Council.
- d) Corrimal Coke Works Post-Gateway Master Plan Report (DCO, June 2021).
- e) Corrimal Coke Works Landscape Master Plan Report (Clouston Associates, 17 June 2021).

3. Heritage Interpretation

Interpretation works in accordance with the Conservation Management Strategy (Urbis, June 2021) and Heritage Interpretation Strategy (Urbis, February 2022).

4. Demolition

Demolition of all elements as identified in Figure 25 Demolition Plan within the Heritage Interpretation Strategy (Urbis, February 2022), on condition that all proposed further investigation, interpretation, salvage and reinstatement works are subsequently and progressively carried out as per this Strategy.

5. Former Powerhouse Building

- a) Use of the building as permitted under the draft Planning Proposal and / or Wollongong LEP 2009.
- b) Repair and / or replacement of existing fabric with materials that generally match the existing fabric.
- c) Internal fit-out works.
- d) Installation of building services as required for compliance with the Building Code of Australia and any other required standards.

6. Minor work, temporary works, and maintenance

- a) Essential repair or replacement of all deteriorated significant heritage fabric.
 Materials used for repair and replacement of significant fabric should closely match the existing fabric.
- b) Erection of temporary hoardings (for periods of up to 18 months) and scaffolding associated with maintenance or conservation of significant heritage fabric where no physical impact to heritage fabric occurs because of the hoardings.
- c) Removal, replacement and / or installation of non-illuminated external signs and decorations, such as flags, rigging, banners, merchandising and associated decorations where the size, scale and impact of the new item does not obscure or dominate identified significant views and where the new item is not fixed directly to significant heritage fabric.
- d) Installation of essential safety services including security cameras (minimising the number of fixings to external original heritage fabric where possible) and internal fire sprinklers if there is no material impact to significant heritage fabric, fixture, or form.
- e) Installation of temporary and reversible structures for the operation of special events and activities lasting less than three (3) months' duration. Structures are preferably to be weighted down and not fixed into significant heritage fabric.

7. Change of use or permissible new uses for some buildings

- a) Change of use or the addition of permissible new uses to any non-significant buildings.
- b) Change of use or the addition of permissible new uses to any significant heritage buildings, excluding physical new works. New uses must have no material impact on significant heritage fabric, fixtures or form.
- c) Implementation of all land uses and development permissible with consent under Wollongong LEP 2009.

Site-Specific Exemptions

1. Voluntary Conservation Agreement (VCA) works

Any works and activities undertaken in the Voluntary Conservation Area in accordance with the following:

- (a) The Plumwood Mountain Voluntary Conservation Agreement made under the *NSW National Parks & Wildlife Act 1974* and dated 2002.
- (b) Plan of Management for Lands Subject to Variation of Voluntary Conservation Agreement between The Minister for the Environment of the State of NSW South Wales and Valerie Plumwood for "Plumwood Mountain" dated 2002.

2. Aboriginal cultural heritage activities

Cultural activities and practices undertaken by Aboriginal people with the prior agreement of the Plumwood Committee Inc., and the sharing of these practices with others including but not limited to traditional land management, cultural burns, gathering, ceremony, camping and observation studies for flora and fauna.

3. Road maintenance

Any works and activities associated with the maintenance and repair of the private driveway lying within the State Heritage Register curtilage.

4. Low-impact recreation facilities

Works and activities supporting the existing use of Plumwood as a site of environmental education and creativity for example, but not limited to, the replacement of low impact pit toilet and privacy screen/walls, under the condition that:

(a) Works and activities must not result in any physical or visual impacts to any structures, buildings, or cultural features identified to be of State significance within the Plumwood State Heritage Register listing.

5. Tree management

The felling of dead or dying trees that pose potential fall risk to structures, access or the safety of caretakers and visitors.

6. Weather event damage to structures

The replacement of existing non-significant structures where extreme weather events such as bushfires has caused considerable damage or destruction.

7. Low-impact caretaker facilities

- (a) Works and activities to the caretakers' hut (a non-significant structure) that are considered by the Plumwood Committee Inc. to be essential requirements for the needs of the caretakers who reside there.
- (b) Works and activities include, but are not limited to, minor extensions to the existing hut, external and internal changes, and must be in accordance with any local development requirements.
- (c) Works and activities must not result in any physical or visual impacts to any structures, buildings, or cultural features identified to be of State significance within the Plumwood State Heritage Register listing.

2. Works in accordance with Voluntary Conservation Agreement VCA 0439:

Any works undertaken in the Conservation Area in accordance with Voluntary Conservation Agreement VCA 0439 and its annexures (including the Archaeological & Management Solutions P/L (AHMS) 2010 Little Bay Ochre & Geological Conservation Site Conservation Management Plan, by AHMS), made under the *National Parks and Wildlife Act 1974* and dated 7 June 2016.

3. Works in adjacent buffer zone:

Any works in the buffer zone to construct low impact public facilities, including paths, handrails, walkways and interpretive works, provided those works follow the requirements of the Voluntary Conservation Agreement VCA 0439.

4. Routine maintenance works in adjacent buffer zone:

Any routine grounds maintenance works within the buffer zone.

5. Cultural activities by the La Perouse Local Aboriginal Land Council:

Any cultural activities by the La Perouse Local Aboriginal Land Council involving access to and collection of ochre from the site.

6. Low-impact recreation facility related works:

Low-impact recreation facilities such as playgrounds and/or playing courts that are predominantly at grade.

Under Section 25 of the Heritage Act, 1977, North Sydney Council, do by this notice:

- Make an Interim Heritage Order to cover the item of the environmental heritage specified or described in Schedule 'A'; and
- II. Declare that the Interim Heritage Order shall apply to the curtilage or site of such item, being the land described in Schedule 'B'

This Interim Heritage Order will lapse six months from the date that it is made unless the local council has passed a resolution before that date either:
