



EDUCATION ACT 1990

Fees for overseas students or classes of overseas students

Pursuant to Section 31A (1) and (2) of the *Education Act 1990*, I, Murat Dizdar, Secretary of the NSW Department of Education, hereby order that overseas students, including classes of overseas students are subject to the payment of fees prior to initial or continuing enrolment in government schools each year. Fixed fees for 2024 are detailed below.

Some classes of overseas students are exempt from payment of fees, and some individual overseas students are able to seek an exemption from payment of the fees.

ORDER

Restoration of Drug Authority

In accordance with the provisions of clause 175(1) of the *Poisons and Therapeutic Goods Regulation 2008*, the Order that took effect on and from 10 February 2020, served on **Ms Jessica Jendruch (PHA0002093967)** of Matraville NSW 2036, prohibiting her as a pharmacist from supplying or having possession of, or manufacturing any preparation, admixture or extract of a drug of addiction as authorised by clauses 101(1) and 102 of the Regulation, shall cease to operate on and from 19 July 2023.
