It is hereby notified, for general information, that Her Excellency the Governor, has, in the name and on behalf of His Majesty, this day assented to the under mentioned Acts passed by the Legislative Assembly and Legislative Council of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, viz.:

Act No. 61 — An Act to amend the *Local Court Act 2007* to abolish the office of Magistrate and establish the office of Judge of the Local Court; to make related and consequential amendments to certain legislation; to make amendments to certain legislation consequent on the *Bail and Other Legislation Amendment (Domestic Violence) Act 2024*; and for related purposes. **[Local Court and Bail Legislation Amendment Bill]**

Act No. 68 — An Act to amend the *Children (Education and Care Services National Law Application) Act 2010* to modify the application of the *Education and Care Services National Law* as it applies in New South Wales to improve the quality of care provided to children in this State in the early childhood education and care sector; to make consequential amendments to the *Children (Education and Care Services) Supplementary Provisions Act 2011*; and for related purposes. **[Children (Education and Care Services National Law Application) Amendment Bill]**

IT is hereby notified, for general information, that Her Excellency the Governor has, in the name and on behalf of His Majesty, this day assented to the undermentioned Acts passed by the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, viz.:

Act No. 62, 2025 – An Act to amend various Acts relating to courts, crimes and other Communities and Justice portfolio matters. **[Justice Legislation Amendment (Miscellaneous) Bill (No 2) 2025]**

Act No. 63, 2025– An Act to amend the Crimes Act 1900 and the Summary Offences Act 1988 regarding offences committed in relation to war memorials. **[Crimes Legislation Amendment (War Memorial Offences) Bill 2025]**

Act No. 64, 2025 – An Act to provide for a Victims of Crime Commissioner; to make consequential amendments to the Victims Rights and Support Act 2013; and for related purposes. **[Victims Rights and Victims of Crime Commissioner Bill 2025]**

MURDER

ONE MILLION DOLLAR (\$1,000,000) REWARD

On 29 July 2003, the body of Theresa Beatrice Binge, aged 43 years, was found in New South Wales, approximately 12 kilometres south of Goondiwindi on the Boomi Road. Theresa was last seen on 18 July 2003 at O'Shea's Royal Hotel in Goondiwindi, Queensland.

Notice is hereby given that a reward of up to one million dollars (\$1,000,000) will be paid by the Government of New South Wales for information leading to the arrest and conviction of the person or persons responsible for murder of Theresa Binge.

The allocation of this reward will be at the sole discretion of the Commissioner of Police.

The urgent assistance and co-operation of the public is especially sought in the matter. Any information, which will be treated as confidential, may be given at any time of the day or night at any Police Station or by telephone -

Criminal Assets Recovery Act 1990 (section 21C)

ASSETS FORFEITURE NOTICE

In accordance with section 21C of the *Criminal Assets Recovery Act 1990 (the Act)*, the New South Wales Crime Commission (**the Commission**) hereby issues a notice of intention to forfeit (**assets forfeiture notice**) the following property,

Cash in the amount of \$92,580 in Australian currency (**the property**) and any interest accrued thereon, found and subsequently seized by New South Wales Police Force (**NSWPF**) officers on 23 March 2023 following a search of 248 Hinxman Road, Castlereagh, NSW 2749 (**the premises**),

to the Crown.

This assets forfeiture notice is issued on the following grounds:

1. The property is held by the NSWPF pursuant to the *Law Enforcement (Powers and Responsibilities) Act 2002* (NSW) after it was seized on 23 March 2023 during a search of the premises. On that day, the occupant of the premises was charged with certain offences pursuant to section 25(1) of the *Drug Misuse and Trafficking Act 1985* (NSW).
2. The Commission is reasonably satisfied the property is an interest in property:
 - a. of a person suspected of engaging in serious crime related activity; and/or
 - b. suspected of being serious crime derived property because of serious crime related activity; and/or
 - c. suspected of being an available interest relating to serious crime use property;

within the meaning of the Act.

Pursuant to section 21A of the Act, a dispute claim in relation to this assets forfeiture notice may be made by **7 January 2026** and pursuant to section 21G of the Act, **MUST**:

1. be made **in writing to the Commission** by post to 453-463 Kent Street, Sydney, NSW or by e-mail to confiscations@crimecommission.nsw.gov.au; and
2. include the following information:
 - (a) the name, date of birth and address of the person making the claim (**the claimant**),
 - (b) the basis of the claim, including the following and evidence, if any, supporting the following –
 - (i) a description of the claimant's interest in the property,
 - (ii) how the interest in the property was acquired,
 - (iii) why the interest in the property is not illegally acquired property,
 - (c) a statutory declaration supporting the information in the claim.

Unless a dispute claim is made to the Commission, this assets forfeiture notice takes effect immediately after **7 January 2026**.
