ABORIGINAL LAND RIGHTS ACT 1983**NOTICE**

I, the Honourable David Harris MP, Minister for Aboriginal Affairs and Treaty, following approval by the New South Wales Aboriginal Land Council (NSWALC), do, by this notice pursuant to section 231(2) of the Aboriginal Land Rights Act 1983 (the Act), extend the appointment of Mr Richard Callaghan as Administrator to the Biraban Local Aboriginal Land Council (Biraban LALC), for a period of three calendar months, effective from 27 November 2025. During the period of his appointment, the Administrator will have all the functions of Biraban LALC, the Board of the Biraban LALC, and the members of the Biraban LALC exercised by resolution of the members of the Biraban LALC, and subject to section 230 of the Act, and any other duties as specified by the agreed terms of appointment. The Administrator's remuneration and expenses are not to exceed \$41,440 excluding GST per month, without the prior approval of NSWALC. The Administrator's remuneration may include fees payable for the services of other personnel within the Administrator's firm who provide services as agents of the Administrator.

It is hereby notified, for general information, that Her Excellency the Governor, has, in the name and on behalf of His Majesty, this day assented to the under mentioned Acts passed by the Legislative Assembly and Legislative Council of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, viz.:

Act No. 76 — An Act to recognise the memorial building as the principal memorial in New South Wales to Australians who serve in wars and peacekeeping missions; to constitute The Trustees of the Anzac Memorial Building; to manage, preserve and improve the memorial building and surrounds; and for other purposes. **[Anzac Memorial Bill]**

Act No. 77 — An Act to amend the Road Transport Act 2013 to regulate operators of micromobility vehicle sharing services; to make other amendments to support the use of micromobility vehicles; to amend the Passenger Transport Act 1990 and the Passenger Transport Act 2014 in relation to smartcards, including the forfeiture of funds on dormant smartcards; and for related purposes. **[Road Transport and Other Legislation Amendment (Micromobility Vehicles and Smartcards) Bill]**

Act No. 78 — An Act to amend the Industrial Relations Act 1996 to provide for the de-amalgamation of a particular employee organisation; and for other purposes. **[Industrial Relations Amendment (De-amalgamation) Bill]**

ABORIGINAL LAND RIGHTS ACT 1983

NOTICE

I, the Honourable David Harris MP, Minister for Aboriginal Affairs and Treaty, following approval by the New South Wales Aboriginal Land Council (NSWALC), do, by this notice pursuant to section 222(1) of the Aboriginal Land Rights Act 1983 (the Act), appoint Mr Wesley Fernando as Administrator to the Birrigan Gargle Local Aboriginal Land Council (Birrigan Gargle LALC), for a period of six calendar months. During the period of his appointment, the Administrator will have all the functions of Birrigan Gargle LALC, the Board of the Birrigan Gargle LALC, and the members of the Birrigan Gargle LALC exercised by resolution of the members of the Birrigan Gargle as specified by the agreed terms of appointment. The Administrator's remuneration and expenses are not to exceed \$12,600 excluding GST per month, without the prior approval of NSWALC. The Administrator's remuneration may include fees payable for the services of other personnel within the Administrator's firm who provide services as agents of the Administrator.
