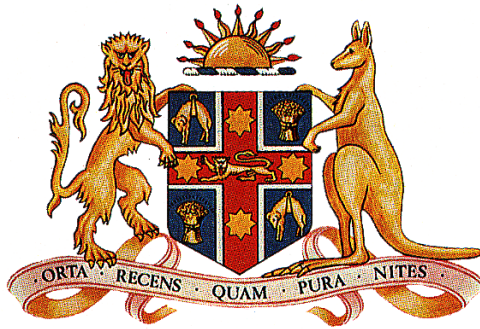

- Mining - Exploration

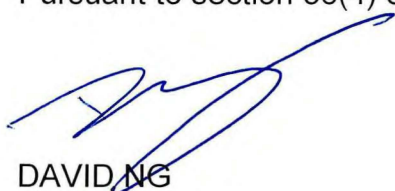

I, DAVID NG, Chief Pharmacist, a duly appointed delegate of the Minister for Health, issue this order pursuant to section 36(4) of the *Medicines, Poisons and Therapeutic Goods Act 2026* (NSW) (Act) for the purposes of section 36(1) and section 36(2) of the Act.

Pursuant to section 36(4) of the Act, this order is subject to conditions.

Order to allow installation and supply of regulated goods by automatic machine

1. Exemption

This order exempts pharmacists in a pharmacy as a class of persons from the operation of section 36(1) and section 36(2) of the Act prohibiting a person from installing an automatic machine in a pharmacy, and from supplying dispensed regulated goods to a specific patient by an automatic machine.

This order exempts BD Medication Management Solutions from the operation of section 36(1)(a) of the Act prohibiting a person from installing an automatic machine.

2. Conditions

- a. The automatic machine is a BD Rowa™ Outdoor Pickup automatic machine.
- b. Regulated goods supplied by the automatic machine must be lawfully prescribed by an authorised practitioner, dispensed and labelled for a specific patient.
- c. Schedule 8 medicines must not be supplied by the automatic machine.
- d. Schedule 3 medicines must not be supplied by the automatic machine unless lawfully prescribed by an authorised practitioner, dispensed and labelled for the specific patient.
- e. Regulated goods must not be stored in the automatic machine outside any recommended storage temperature range listed in the product information.
- f. Goods subject to the Australian Register of Therapeutic Goods registration conditions must not be supplied in a manner that will result in contravention of those requirements.

- g. Security of the automatic machine must be robust such that only the pharmacist and the patient or agent can access the regulated goods via a secure pharmacist-issued code.
- h. The Pharmacy Council of NSW must be advised prior to installation of an automatic machine within a pharmacy.
- i. All functional activities must be logged and auditable.

3. Validity

This Approval commences on the day it is signed and dated and remains in force until 31/07/2028 or on a date it is cancelled.

4. Publication

This exemption is to be published in the NSW Government Gazette and the NSW Health website.

Order to allow installation and supply of regulated goods by automatic machine

1. Exemption

This order exempts pharmacists in a pharmacy as a class of persons from the operation of section 36(1) and section 36(2) of the Act prohibiting a person from installing an automatic machine in a pharmacy, and from supplying regulated goods by automatic machine.

This order exempts Med-ID Pty Ltd from the operation of section 36(1)(a) of the Act prohibiting a person from installing an automatic machine.

2. Conditions

- a. The automatic machine is the MedyBOX Automated Pharmacy Dispensing System.
- b. Scheduled medicines must not be supplied via the automatic machine.
- c. The automatic machine must limit the number of units that may be purchased to ONE ITEM per transaction.
- d. The automatic machine must only contain ONE ITEM of each unscheduled medicine that is otherwise scheduled when in greater pack size quantities.
- e. Stocking and replenishment must be supervised by the pharmacist.
- f. All products in the automatic machine must be in original packaging.
- g. Goods subject to Australian Register of Therapeutic Goods registration conditions must not be supplied in a manner that will result in contravention of those requirements.
- h. The pharmacist must have policies and procedures in place to cover staff training, operation, selection, replenishment, cleaning and incident management.
- i. The pharmacist must have policies and procedures in place to ensure the machine is monitored by pharmacy staff, including to detect any purchasing in contravention of the conditions of this order.
- j. All functional activities must be logged and auditable.

3. Validity

This order commences on the day it is signed and dated and remains in force until 20 June 2028 or on a date it is cancelled.

Order to allow installation and supply of regulated goods by automatic machine

1. Exemption

This order exempts pharmacists in a pharmacy as a class of persons from the operation of section 36(1) and section 36(2) of the Act prohibiting a person from installing an automatic machine in a pharmacy, and from supplying regulated goods by automatic machine.

This order exempts Med-ID Pty Ltd from the operation of section 36(1)(a) of the Act prohibiting a person from installing an automatic machine.

2. Conditions

- a. The automatic machine is a Pharmaself24 Automated Pharmacy Dispensing System.
- b. Schedule 8 medicines must not be supplied via the automatic machine.
- c. Schedule 4 medicines supplied via the automatic machine must have been lawfully prescribed, dispensed and labelled for a particular patient.
- d. Schedule 3 medicines must not be supplied via the automatic machine.
- e. Regulated goods supplied via the automatic machine must be dispensed, clinically reviewed and assigned for a particular patient by a pharmacist.
- f. Goods subject to Australian Register of Therapeutic Goods registration conditions must not be supplied in a manner that will result in contravention of those requirements.
- g. The automatic machine must only supply regulated goods by way of controlled collection by the patient or agent, with no self-selection enabled.
- h. Security of the automatic machine must be robust such that only the pharmacist and the patient or agent can access the regulated goods via a secure pharmacist-issued code.
- i. The Pharmacy Council of NSW must be advised prior to a pharmacist installing an automatic machine in the pharmacy.
- j. All functional activities must be logged and auditable.

3. Validity

This order commences on the day it is signed and dated and remains in force until 20 June 2028 or on a date it is cancelled.

Order to allow installation and supply of regulated goods by automatic machine

1. Exemption

This order exempts pharmacists in a pharmacy as a class of persons from the operation of section 36(1) and section 36(2) of the Act prohibiting a person from installing an automatic machine in a pharmacy in NSW, and from supplying dispensed regulated goods to a specific patient by an automatic machine.

This order exempts Meditech Pharmacy Management Solutions from the operation of section 36(1)(a) of the Act prohibiting a person from installing an automatic machine.

2. Conditions

- a. The automatic machine is a Meditech MT Collect (Standalone Pickup System) automatic machine or a MediTech MT Matic (Robot-Integrated Pickup System) automatic machine.
- b. Regulated goods supplied by the automatic machine must be lawfully prescribed by an authorised practitioner, dispensed and labelled for a specific patient.
- c. Schedule 8 medicines must not be supplied by the automatic machine.
- d. Schedule 3 medicines must not be supplied by the automatic machine unless lawfully prescribed by an authorised practitioner, dispensed and labelled for the specific patient.
- e. Regulated goods must not be stored in the automatic machine outside any recommended storage temperature range listed in the product information.
- f. Goods subject to the Australian Register of Therapeutic Goods registration conditions must not be supplied in a manner that will result in contravention of those requirements.

- g. Security of the automatic machine must be robust such that only the pharmacist and the patient or agent can access the regulated goods via a secure pharmacist-issued code.
- h. The Pharmacy Council of NSW must be advised prior to installation of an automatic machine within a pharmacy.
- i. All functional activities must be logged and auditable.
- j. The automatic machine must only be filled or restocked by way of an access panel that is internal to the pharmacy.

3. Validity

This Approval commences on the day it is signed and dated and remains in force until 31/07/2028 or on a date it is cancelled.

This exemption is to be published in the NSW Government Gazette.
